Resolution offered by Fossett

Resolved that the Town Board & Board of Highway & Highway Commissioners of the Town of Cheektowaga do hereby enact the following ordinance sewer connections. No person shall connect with any public sewer in the streets or highway of the Town of Cheektowaga without first obtaining from the Town Clerk a permit to connect with the same upon filing with the Town Clerk a plan showing where such sewer connection is to be made and paying to the Town Clerk the sum of 75 cts the Town Clerk shall issue a permit for such connection. No connection shall be made under said permit except with the Inspection of some suitable persons to be appointed by the Town Board and Board of Highway Commissioners and said Inspector shall be present during the time that the said connection is being made with the sewer and shall file a written report with the Town Clerk showing when said connection was made any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall forfeit and pay a fine adn penalty of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars for each and every offense dated this 27 day of January 1908.
