

**Cheektowaga July 6<sup>th</sup> 1908**

Regular Town Board meeting of the Town of Cheektowaga held at the house of Joseph Bromnik Present wildy Schiesel Fossett Forster Brennen Durringer Monin

Reading of the minutes were approved as read.

Resolution offered by Mr. Fossett

Whereas William Street in the Town of Cheektowaga between the City Line of the City of Buffalo and the centre of Harlem Ave is the boundary line of the village of Sloan and under the Provisions of the village Law the said village of Sloan is bound to maintain one half of said Roadway and

Whereas it has been agreed between the village of Sloan and the Town of Cheektowaga that the division maintenance of said roadway should be the part thereof between the City Line and the driveway from William Street to the Property of the Buffalo Fertilizer Company should be maintained entirely by the village of Sloan and the portion of said Highway between the driveway is the property of the Buffalo Fertilizer Company and the centre of Harlem Ave should be maintained entirely by the Town of Cheektowaga and that the ditch or drain upon the monthly side of said William Street between Harlem Ave and the City Line should be cared for by the village of Sloan and the ditch or drain on the south side of the roadway between Harlem Ave and the City line should be cared for entirely by the Town of Cheektowaga. Now therefore be it

Resolved that the Highway Commissioner of the Town of Cheektowaga pursuant to said agreement be and he is hereby directed to maintain said roadway in William Street between the driveway from William Street to the property of the Buffalo Fertilizer Company and center of Harlem Ave entirely at the expense of the Town of Cheektowaga and to care for the ditch or drain on the south side of the roadway in William Street between the City line of of the City of Buffalo and the center line of Harlem Ave entirely at the expense of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Moved by Fossett seed by Monin that the Resolution be adopted, -Carried

Resolution offered by Fossett

Resolved that the Town of Cheektowaga be and the same is hereby divided into four Election Districts to be bounded as follows.

DISTRICT no (1)

Commencing at the intersection of the East line of the Town of Cheektowaga with the south line of the right of way of the New York Central & Hudson River Railroad Company running thence southerly along the east line of said Town to the south line of said Town thence westerly along the South line of said Town to the Town line between the Towns of Cheektowaga & West Seneca thence northerly along said Town line to the Cayuga Creek thence westerly along Cayuga Creek to a point where said Creek would be Intersected bny the centre line of Ludwig Ave extended southerly in a direct line thence northerly along the centre line of Ludwig Ave as extended and Ludwig Ave as now laid out to the southerly line of the right of way of the Delaware Lackawanna & Western Railroad thence westerly along the southerly line of the right of way of the Delaware Lackawanna & Western Railroad Co. to the centre line of Harlem Ave thence northerly along the center line of Harlem Ave to a Point one Thousand feet (1000) north of Walden Ave thence easterly parallel north and 1000 feet northerly of Walden Ave and of the South line of the New York Central Railroad Companys right of way to the center of Williamsville Road thence southerly along the center of Williamsville Road to the southerly of the right of way of the New York Central Railroad thence easterly along the southerly line of the right of way of the New York Central Railroad thence easterly along the southerly line of the right of way of the New York Central Railroad to the east line of the Town of Cheektowaga the place of beginning

DISTRICT no. (2)

Commencing at the Intersection of the north line if the Town of Cheektowaga with the center line of Harlem Ave thence easterly along the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the east line of the Town of Cheektowaga thence southerly along the east line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the southerly line of the right of way of the New York Central Hudson River Railroad Company thence Westerly along the southerly line of the New York Central right of way to the center of Williamsville Road thence northerly along the center of Williamsville Road to a point 1000 feet northerly from the south line of the right of way of the New York Central Railroad thence westerly parallel with the south line of said right of way of New York Central Railroad Company and the center of Walden Ave after the same is intersected by the south line of the right of way of the New York Central Railroad Company to the Center of Harlem Ave thence northerly along the center of Harlem Ave to the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the place of beginning

DISTRICT no. (3)

Commencing at the south-west corner of the Town of Cheektowaga running thence easterly along the southerly line of the Town of Cheektowaga to a point where Cayuga Creek is Intersected by the center line of Ludwig Ave extended southerly in a direct line thence northerly the center of Ludwig Ave

extended in a direct line southerly and along the center of Ludwig Ave to the south line of the right of way of the Delaware Lackawanna & Western Railroad Company to the center of Harlem Ave to the center of Broadway thence westerly along the center of Broadway to the westerly line of the Town of Cheektowaga thence southerly along the west line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the south line of the Town of Cheektowaga at the place of beginning

DISTRICT no. (4)

Commencing at the Intersection of the west line of the Town of Cheektowaga with the center of Broadway thence easterly along the center of Broadway to the center of Harlem Ave thence northerly along the center of Harlem Ave to the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga thence westerly along the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the west line of the Town of Cheektowaga thence southerly along the west line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the center of Broadway at the place of beginning

Special meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga held at the House of Arthur G Durringer Present Wildy Schiesel Fossett Brennen Durringer Monin absent Forster Supervisor Wildy called the meeting for the purpose of Appointing another Attorney for the Town of Cheektowaga

Reading of the minutes was dispensed and following business was transacted By a Petition handed in to the Town Board signed by residents living on Bowery St Cheektowaga to change the name of Bowery St to another name it was moved by Brennen seconded by Fossett that it be called Euclid Ave hereafter carried.

Moved by Monin seconded by Fossett that Helen St in the Town of Cheektowaga be accepted carried.

Moved by Brennen seconded by Monin that the Town Clerk be authorized to have peddlers License printed in Book form and have the Town Clerk and Justices of the Peace to Issue them and allow 25 cts Fees for Issuing same and report to the Town Clerk every month of License Issued carried. (Peddlers License \$5.00per year)

Moved by Brennen seconded by Fossett that the Town Clerk also be authorized to have application and permit Blanks printed for the purpose of carrying Firearms in the Town of Cheektowaga and have the Town Clerk and Justice of the Peace to Issue them upon Application presented to them and signed by some good Reputable Citizen amount for permit \$1.00 for issuing same 25cts carried.

Moved by Brennen seconded by Fossett that all constables and Justice of the Peace to have a statement attached to their Bills when presented to the Board for auditing Starting up tp date made out carried.

Moved by Brennen seconded by Monin that the Supervisor appoint a Committee of three to wait upon Mr. Meadows in regards to the Garbage question carried. Committee appointed to act are Bernard Fossett William Brennen John Monin
