Moved by Mr. Brennen seconded by Mr. Schiesel that it be and it is hereby,

Resolved that no Railroad Company or Corporation Operating a Railroad any prtion of which is within the limits of the Town of Cheektowaga and no Engineer Conductor Yardmaster or other Person having in charge any Freight or Passenger Locomotive or Car to remain standing upon Street crossing within the limits of said Town for a greater period of time than five minutes and no car shall be allowed to stand upon any Street crossing unless attached to a Locomotive nor shall any Street be Occupied or obstructed by any car or Locomotive for Switching purposes for a longer period of time than five minutes at any one time nor shall any running switch be made so that a detached car shall pass over any street at grade after it is detached from the Train any Corporation or Company

which Violates any Provision of this ordinance shall forfeit a like Penalty of \$50.00 for each and every Violation and the Employee of said Corporation or Company in charge of such Locomotive or Car shall forfeit a like Penalty for each and every Violation one half of such Penalty shall when collected be paid to the Person upon whose complaint such Conviction was obtained and it is further Resolved that it shall not be lawful for any Person in the Employ of any Railroad Company Operating within the limits of said Town to cause or permit the Cylinder Cocks of the Locomotive under his control to be discharged or opened upon any Street crossing in said Town any person violating the provisions of this section and the Company owning the Locomotive the Cylinder Cocks of which shall be discharged shall each pay a Penalty of \$50.00 for each and every offense one half of which shall be paid to complainant upon conviction. Adoption.

Cheektowaga June 30th 1909

Special meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Commissioners held at the House of Joseph Forster there was present Frank Wildy Alois Schiesel Bernard Fossett Joseph Forster William Brennen John Monin absent Durringer .

Meeting was called by in the sidewalk matter in the South side of Walden Ave. and the following business was transacted

Resolution offered by Mr. Fossett and Seconded by Mr. Brennen and was duly Adopted.

Resolved that the general rules prescribing how sidewalks should be built in the Town of Cheektowaga heretofore adopted by the Town Board and Board of Highway Commissioners of said Town on the 6th day of April 1908 be and the same are hereby amended so as to read as follows

First: - All sidewalks which shall hereafter be laid in the Town of Cheektowaga shall be laid to the grade established by the Town Engineer.

Second: - All sidewalks which shall hereafter be laid in the Town of Cheektowaga shall not be less than four feet in width and shall be constructed of a hardened composition of Sand Gravel and cementor other hard material laid according to Specifications filed with the Town Clerk and approved by the Town Board and Board of Highway Commissioners and Town Engineer. --Adjourned

Resolution offered by Mr. Fossett Seconded by Mr. Brennen and was duly adopted

Resolved that the owners of the following parcels of land fronting on the south side of Walden Avenue in the Town of Cheektowaga, to-wit:-

Sub-division lots 15 and 16, in section III

“ 5, 6, 16, 26, 27, 28, in section IV

“ 26, 27, and 28, in section V of the tract known as Fifth Avenue Land Company's Tract and shown on a map page 319, and also parcel of land. 110 feet in width, between sub-division lots 23 and 24 in section IV, of said Fifth Avenue Land Company's Tract,

be and each of the respective owners thereof is hereby ordered, directed and required to construct a granolithic sidewalk four feet wide according to plans and specifications therefore parcels owned by them within ten (10) days.

And be it further

Resolved that, in the event of the failure of any of such owners to construct said sidewalk in the manner or within the time herein prescribed, the said work be done by the Town Board and Board of Highway Commissioners of the Town of Cheektowaga and the expense thereof assessed against the property benefited thereby. And be it further

Resolved that the Town Clerk be and he is hereby directed to cause notice of this order to be served in the manner prescribed by law.
