Now therefore be it Resolved that the Representative of Erie County in the Senate and Assembly of the Legislature of the State of New York be and the said Representatives are hereby respectfully requested to use their best efforts to bring about the discontinuance of private control over said Highways and the abolition of Toll gates thereon and the placing of said Highways under the

Whereas under the agreement dated the 25th day of September 1907 between the Town of Cheektowaga and the City of Buffalo for sewer connections at Clinton Street and the City line of Buffalo between the sewer draining the Cochrane Street sewer District in the Town of Cheektowaga and the sewer of the City of Buffalo in said Clinton Street to become due and owing on the 1st day of October 1909 to the City of Buffalo for rental of said sewer services from the 1st day of October 1909 to the 1st of October 1910 the sum of \$92.00. and

Whereas under the agreement dated the 25th day of September 1907 between the Town of Cheektowaga and the City of Buffalo for sewer connections at Walden Ave and the City line of Buffalo between the sewer draining the Walden Avenue sewer district in the Town of Cheektowaga and the sewer of the City of Buffalo in Said Walden Avenue to become due and owing on the 1st day of October 1909 to the City of Buffalo as rental of said sewer services in said Walden Ave from the 1st day of October 1909 to the 1st day of October 1910 the sum of \$350.00 now therefore be it

Resolved that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized to pay to the City of Buffalo the sum of \$92.00 as rental for said sewer connections for said Cochrane Street sewer district and be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized to spread and levy upon the Taxable Property in said Cochran Street sewer district the sum of \$92.00 to reimburse the said Town of Cheektowaga for said moneys expended on behalf of said sewer district and be it further.

Resolved that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized to pay the City of Buffalo the sum of \$350.00 for rental of said Walden Avenue sewer District and be it further.

Resolved that the said Supervisor be and he is hereby directed and Authorized to spread and Levy upon the Taxable Property in said Walden Avenue sewer district the sum of \$350.00 to reimburse the said Town of Cheektowaga for said Moneys on the behalf of said sewer district

On motion of Mr. Fossett seconded by Mr. Monin that the following Preamble and Resolution was offered and being put to vote was carried.

Whereas the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga did establish a water supply District on the 2nd day of July 1903.

And whereas it is now desired to change the boundaries of said Water supply district and extend the same now therefore be it.

Resolved that the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga pursuant to the Statue in such cause made and provided establish a water supply District in said Town of Cheektowaga outside of a City or incorporated Village therein which water supply District shall be known and designated as Water supply District no. (2) of the Town of Cheektowaga and shall be bounded and described as follows.

Commencing at the point of Intersection of the easterly boundary line of the City of Buffalo with the center line of William Street running thence southerly along said city line to its point of intersection with the center line of Dingens Street; thence easterly along the center line of Dingens street to the point of intersection of said center line of Dingens street with the center line of Harlem Avenue thence southerly along the center line of Harlem avenue to its point of intersection with the center line of Cayuga Creek road; thence northeasterly along the center line of Cayuga Creek road to the point of intersection of said center line of Cayuga Creek road with the west line of the lands now or formerly owned by Colton Improvement Company; thence southerly along said west line of said Colton Improvement Company's tract to the point of intersection of said west line of said Colton Improvement Company's tract with the south line of Steul Land Company's tract; thence easterly along the southerly line of said Steul Land Company's tract to the easterly line thereof; thence northerly along the east line of said Steul Land Company's tract to the point of intersection with the center line of William street; thence easterly along the center line of William street to its point of intersection with the easterly bounds of Niagara, Lockport and Ontario Power Company's Lands; thence northerly along the east line of lands of said Niagara, Lockport and Ontario Power Company to the point of intersection of said east line of said Power Company lands with the southerly line of the right of way of Lehigh Valley Railroad Company; thence south westerly along the southerly line of the right of way of said Lehigh Valley Railroad Company to the west line of the Niagara Lockport, and Ontario Power Company's lands; thence northerly along the west line of said power Company's land to the point of intersection of said west line of said lands of said Niagara, Lockport and Ontario Power Company with the north line of lands of New York Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company; thence westerly along the north line of said lands of New York, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company to the center line of Harlem Avenues; thence southerly along the center line of Harlem to its point of intersection with the center line of William street thence westerly along the center line of William street to its point of intersection with the easterly city line of Buffalo at the place of beginning.

On motion of Mr. Fossett, seconded by Mr. Monin the following resolution was offered, and being put to vote was unanimously carried

:

“Resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, pursuant to the statue in such case made and provided, established a water supply district in said Town of Cheektowaga. The

same being outside of a city or incorporated village therein which water supply district shall be known and designated as "Water Supply District Number Three (3) of the Town of Cheektowaga" and shall be bounded and described as follows:-

Commencing at a point in the center line of Harlem Avenue at its point of intersection with the northerly line of lands of the New York Central and Hudson Rivers Railroad Company's; running thence easterly along the northerly line of said lands of the New York Central and Hudson River Railroad Company to a point directly north of the easterly line of Indian road; running thence southerly to said easterly line of Indian road; thence southerly along said easterly line of Indian road to the point of intersection of said easterly line of Indian road with the southerly boundary line of the right of way of the main line of Lehigh Valley Railroad Company, thence southwesterly along the southerly boundary line of the said right of way of said Lehigh Valley Railroad Company to the westerly line of the right of way of the power transmission line of Niagara Lockport and Ontario Power Company thence northerly along the westerly line of said power company's lands to the northerly line of the lands of New York, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company; thence south westerly along the northerly line of said lands of said New York, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company to the center line of Harlem avenue; thence northerly along the center line of the Harlem avenue to the point of beginning.
