RESOLVED

First: That it shall be and is hereby declared to be the duty of every owner and occupant of any premises fronting on any public street or ground to keep the sidewalk in front of the same in good order and repair and if said owner or occupant shall allow any accumulation or refuse to remain thereon he shall be liable to a penalty of not to exceed (\$10.00).

Second: That it shall be the duty of every owner and occupant of any premises fronting on any public street or alley to remove before 9 o'clock in the morning all snow and ice which may have fallen upon the sidewalk in front of said premises.

Third: That in case of neglect or refusal on the part of said owner or occupant to comply with the provisions of the foregoing sections he shall pay a fine of not less than (\$10.00) it shall be the duty of the superintendent of highways to see that the provisions of the foregoing sections are enforced and in all cases of their violation it shall be the duty of the superintendent of highways to employ men to clean said sidewalks at a price not to exceed 17½ cents per hour. Said superintendent shall keep an account of all such work and on or before the 1st day of April of each year shall report to the Town Board and the Board of Highway Commissioners of the said Town all parcels of Land in front of which such work shall have been performed the owner or Occupant of which shall not have

heretofore paid to the superintendent of highways the amount of expenses in front of the said premises and the Town Board and Board of Highway commissioners shall there upon order assessments upon said lands for the several sums so reported.

Special meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga held at the regular meeting place there were present Wildy, Schiesel, Fossett, Brennen, Durringer and Monin. Absent – Forster

Meeting was called in concerning the Bridge matter on the Pine Hill Road and the following resolution was adopted.

Moved by Mr. Fossett Seconded by Mr. Brennan that the following preamble and resolution be adopted

Whereas the present Bridge spanning Scajaquada Creek in Pine Hill Road in the Town of Cheektowaga has been declared inadequate and unfit for travel by the County Superintendent of Highways in a Communication addressed to the Supervisor of the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga dated the 21st day of February 1910 and

Whereas the said County Superintendent of Highways has prepared and delivered to the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga two sets of plans and specifications for the construction of a new bridge crossing said Creek in said highway and

Whereas it is the sense of this Board that Public Interest demands the construction of a new Bridge in said Highway crossing said creek in accordance with one or the other of the aforesaid sets of plans and specifications now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that a new bridge be constructed in said Pine Hill Road to span said Scajaquada Creek in place of the present Bridge in accordance with such one of the aforesaid sets of plans and specifications as the residents of the Town of Cheektowaga qualified to vote thereon shall determine at a special Town meeting to be called for that purpose and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby directed to advertise in due form of law in The Enterprise of Lancaster New York the Depew Herald and Buffalo Courier for separate bids as follows.

First: For the construction of a Concrete bridge across Scajaquada Creek in Pine Hill Road according to the plans and specifications therefore prepared by County Superintendent of Highways and on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Second: For the construction of a steel girder bridge across said creek in said Highway according to the plans and specifications therefore prepared by County Superintendent of Highways and on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Third: For the construction of all mason work for a steel girder bridge across Scajaquada Creek in Pine Hill Road under the aforesaid plans and specifications. Adopted

Adjourned meeting of the Town Board and the Board of Town Superintendents held at the House of Michael Bittermans Tuesday March 22nd 1910 there was present Wildy, Schiesel, Fossett, Forster, Brennen, Durringer and Monin.

Meeting was called for the purpose of considering all Bids heretofore presented to this Board regarding the Bridge spanning Scajaquada Creek on Pine Hill Road and the following preamble and resolution was offered by Mr. Fossett and Seconded by Mr. Brennen and was duly adopted.

Whereas it appears to this Board from the bids submitted in response to the call for bids for a proposed new Bridge over Scajaquada Creek in Pine Hill Road in the Town of Cheektowaga that a reinforced concrete Arch Bridge can be constructed over said Creek more economically and more advantageously than any other kind of a Bridge and

Whereas it further appears that owing to the lack of detailed specifications there was some confusion uncertainty in the minds of some of the bidders to the exact proposition upon which bids were invited and

Whereas it is the sense of this Board that the Interests of the Town of Cheektowaga will be promoted by the rejection of all bids submitted on the 19th day of March 1910 and re-advertisement for new bids upon detailed specifications and a new plan showing a concrete Arch Bridge with a clear width of roadway of Thirty feet and provision for a sidewalk five feet in width on each side of said bridge. Now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that all bids heretofore received for the construction of a proposed bridge across Scajaquada Creek in Pine Hill Road in the Town of Cheektowaga or for the construction of any portion thereof be and the same are hereby rejected and be it further

RESOLVED, that the clerk be and he is hereby directed to prepare and publish a notice in due form of Law inviting bids for the construction of a reinforced concrete Arch Bridge across said Scajaquada Creek in Pine Hill Road in the Town of Cheektowaga in accordance with a new plan and detailed specifications and prepared by the County Superintendent of Highways of the County of Erie. And be it further

RESOLVED, that said Clerk in and by the said notice invite bids under the aforesaid specifications to be prepared by the County Superintendent of Highways and a plan or plans submitted by the bidder and approved by said county superintendent of highways and be it further

RESOLVED, that said Clerk publish said notice in The Enterprise The Depew Herald and Buffalo Courier. Adopted. Adjourned.
