Whereas under the agreement dated the 25th day of September 1907 between the Town of Cheektowaga and the City of Buffalo for Sewer connections at Walden Avenue and the city line of Buffalo between the sewer draining the Walden Ave sewer district and the sewer of the city of Buffalo in said Walden Avenue there became due and payable on the 1st day of October 1910 to the city of Buffalo as rental for said sewer services in said Walden Avenue from the 1st day of October 1910 to the 1st day of October 1911 the sum of four hundred dollars \$400.00. Now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the city of Buffalo the sum of four hundred dollars \$400.00 for the rental for said sewer connection for said Walden Ave sewer district from the 1st day of October 1910 to the 1st day of October 1911 and be it further

RESOLVED that the said Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to cause to be spread and levied upon the taxable property in said Walden Ave sewer district the sum of Four Hundred dollars (\$400.00) to reimburse the said Town of Cheektowaga for said moneys so expended on behalf of said Sewer district Adopted

Whereas under the agreement dated the 25th day of September 1907 between the Town of Cheektowaga and the city of Buffalo for the sewer connection at Clinton Street and the city line of Buffalo between the sewer draining the Cochrane Street sewer district and the sewer of the city of Buffalo in said Clinton Street there became due and payable on the 1st day of October 1910 to the city of Buffalo as rental for said sewer services in

said Clinton Street from the 1st day of October 1910 to the 1st day of October 1911 the sum of One hundred two dollars (\$102.00) now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the city of Buffalo the sum of one hundred two dollars (\$102.00) in payment of said rental for said sewer connection for said Cochrane Street Sewer District from the 1st day of October 1910 to the 1st day of October 1911 and be it further

RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed and cause to be spread and levied upon the taxable property in said Cochrane Street sewer district the sum of one hundred two dollars (\$102.00) to reimburse the said Town of Cheektowaga for the said moneys so expended on behalf of said sewer district. Adopted

Whereas a petition in writing was heretofore presented to this board praying for the establishment of a Lamp District and

Whereas upon the presentation of said petition a resolution was duly adopted referring the said petition to the board of assessors of the Town of Cheektowaga for the purpose of having the said board of assessors examine said petition and as certain and report to this board whether or not the said petition contained the names of the majority of the resident owners of taxable real property within the proposed Lamp District described in said petition as shown in by the last completed assessment roll of the Town of Cheektowaga:

Whereas the said Board of Assessors have duly made their report in writing to this board that the said petition does in fact contain the names of majority of the resident

owners of taxable real property within the proposed Lamp District described in said petition as shown by the last completed assessment roll of the Town of Cheektowaga now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided create and establish the following described property into a Lamp District none of said described territory being within a city or incorporated village and the same is hereby created and established into a Lamp District and is hereby designated as Lamp District number one of the Town of Cheektowaga and shall be bounded and described as follows

Commencing at a point in the center line of Harlem Ave at its point of Intersection with the northerly line of the lands of the New York Central and Hudson River Railroad Company running thence easterly along the northerly line of the New York Central and Hudson River Rail road companies main line to the westerly line of the village of Depew

Running thence southerly along said westerly line of the village of Depew to the point of intersection of said westerly line of the village of Depew with the southerly boundary line of the right of way of the mainline of Lehigh Valley Railroad Co. thence south westerly along the southerly boundary line of the right of way of said Lehigh Valley railroad company to the westerly line of the right of way of the power transmission line of Niagara Lockport and Ontario Power Company thence northerly along the westerly line of said Power Company's lands to the northerly line of the lands of New York Lackawanna and western railroad company thence along the northerly line of said lands of said New York Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company to the center line of

Harlem Ave thence northerly along the center line of Harlem Ave to the point of beginning. Adopted Adjourned.

Special meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga held at Michael Bittermans present Wildy, Schiesel, Fossett, Durringer, Brennan and Monin.

The following resolutions presented by Mr. Durringer Seconded by Mr. Monin having been put to a vote were duly adopted:

RESOLVED that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to raise and have levied upon the taxable property of water

supply district number one of the Town of Cheektowaga as constituted defined and outlined by the certificate of the Town Board of said Town filed on the 2nd day of July 1903 the sum seven hundred and fifteen dollars (\$715.00) for rental of hydrants and for a supply of Water therefore furnished by Western New York Water Co. from the 1st day of January 1911 to the 1st day of January 1912.

RESOLVED that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to raise and have levied upon the taxable property of water supply district number two of the Town of Cheektowaga as constituted defined and outlined by the certificate of the Town Board of said Town filed on the 30th day of October 1909 the sum of thirteen hundred and twenty dollars (\$1320.00) for rental of hydrants and for a supply of water therefore furnished by western New York Water Company from the 6th day of December 1910 to the 6th day of December 1911.

RESOLVED that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to raise and have levied upon the taxable property of water supply district number three of the Town of Cheektowaga as constituted defined and outlined by the certificate of the Town Board of said town filed on the 3rd day of September 1909 the sum of nine hundred and ninety dollars (\$990.00) for rental of hydrants and for a supply of water therefore furnished by the western New York Water Company from the 1st day of December 1910 to the 1st day of December 1911.

Whereas it has come to the ears of this board that International Company claims to have some right, franchise or privilege to lay its tracks in and occupy that portion of Bennett Road extending easterly from the point of Intersection between the north easterly line of Bellevue Avenue and the southeasterly line of Bennett Road and easterly of the portion of said Bennett Road already occupied by the tracks of said international railway company and

Whereas it is the contention of this Board that the occupation of the portion of Bennett Road now occupies by said International railway company is unlawful and without the valid consent of the local officers of the Town of Cheektowaga and

Whereas there is not upon the records of the Town of Cheektowaga or elsewhere any valid grant of authority or franchise to said International Railway Company nor to any of its predecessors to occupy any portion of Bennett Road easterly of the point already occupied by the tracks of said International Railway Company and

Whereas it is the sense of this Board that no such right or Franchise or privilege was ever granted or intended to be granted by the local officers of the Town of Cheektowaga to said International Railway Company or to any of its predecessors now therefore be it

RESOLVED that any and all franchise grants or privileges of every name and nature if any has heretofore been given or granted unto any street surface or other railroad company or corporation to use or occupy any portion of Bennett Road in the Town of Cheektowaga east of the point of intersection between the northeasterly line of Bellevue

Avenue and the southeasterly line of Bennett Road be and any and all such franchises grants and privileges are hereby declared to be and the same are hereby withdrawn annulled forfeited. Adopted

Whereas the International Railway Company has heretofore made application in writing for leave Railway Company has heretofore made application in writing for leave to construct maintain and operate a double track street surface railroad to be operated by the overhead Electric Trolley system in and along the Bennett Road from its Intersection with Bellevue Avenue so called easterly to a point two hundred and twenty five feet easterly of the east line of the Indian Road so called now therefore be it

RESOLVED that this board before acting upon such application give public notice thereof and of the time and place when such application will first be considered which notice shall be published daily pursuant to law for at least fourteen days in two daily newspapers published in the city of Buffalo that being the city nearest said town to wit
