Moved by Mr. Brennen seconded by Mr. Fossett that the Supervisor be authorized to appropriate the sum not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to build a suitable election booth in election district No. 1. Carried.

Moved by Brennen seconded by Schiesel that the following ordinances be adopted:

RESOLVED that the Town Board and Board of Town Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga Erie County New York adopt and cause to be enforced the following general ordinances in relation to steam railroad crossings over highways in the Town of Cheektowaga:-

Section (1) No. Steam Railroad Company or corporation operating a steam railroad any portion of which is within the limits of the Town of Cheektowaga and no engineer conductor yard master division Superintendent or other person having in charge any engine motor locomotive car or other vehicle owned or operated by such railroad company or corporation, shall allow such engine, motor, locomotive, car or other vehicle to remain standing upon any public street, avenue, alley, place or ground within the limits of said Town for a greater period time than five minutes and no car shall be allowed to stand upon any highway crossing for any length of time whatsoever, unless attached to a Locomotive nor shall any public highway be occupied or obstructed by any car or cars locomotive or locomotives for switching purposes for a longer period of time than five minutes at any one time nor shall any running switch be made so that a detached car shall pass over any public highway at grade after it shall have been detached from a train of locomotive.

Any company, corporation or person violating any provision of this section shall be jointly and severally liable to pay a penalty of not to exceed (\$50.00) or to imprisonment for a term of not to exceed 60 days or to both such penalty and imprisonment for each and every violation thereof.

One half of any penalty imposed under this section shall, when collected, be paid to the person upon whose complaint the conviction shall have been obtained.

Section (2) no steam railroad company or corporation operating a railroad, any portion of which is within the limits of the Town of Cheektowaga nor any person in the employ of any such railroad company or corporation shall cause or permit the cylinder cocks of a locomotive to be opened or discharged upon any highway in the Town of Cheektowaga.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this section and the company or corporation owning the locomotive, the cylinder cocks of which shall be so opened or discharged, shall be jointly and severally liable to pay a penalty of not to exceed (\$50.00) or to imprisonment for a term not to exceed 60 days or to both such penalty and imprisonment for each and every violation thereof.

One half of any penalties imposed under this section shall, when collected be paid to the person upon whose complaint the conviction shall have been obtained and be it further

RESOLVED that the ordinances in regulation of the crossing of highways by steam railroads adopted by this board on or about the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 1909, be and the same are hereby repealed. Adopted.

Notice of the completion of the plan for the proposed sewer district number three in the Town of Cheektowaga and of public hearing thereon.

Notice is hereby given that the Town Engineer has completed and filed with the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga a map or plan showing how certain hereinafter described lands in the Town of Cheektowaga which it is proposed to establish and designate as sewer district number three of said town can be sewerred and drained to the best advantage and showing also the termini courses and profiles of each proposed sewer district and which said lands so proposed to be included in said proposed sewer district are bounded and described as follows to wit: -

All that tract of or parcel of land situate in the Town of Cheektowaga County of Erie an dState of New York commencing at the north easterly corner of the village of sloan being at the point of intersection between the center line of Broadway an dthe center line of Harlem Avenue running thence easterly along the center line of Broadway to the center line of Ludwig Avenue thence southerly along the center line ofLudwig Avenue to the center line of William Street thence westerly along the center line of William Street to the westerly line of the lands of Niagara Lockport and Ontario Power Company; thence southerly along the westerly line of said power company lands to the southerly boundary line of the Town of Cheektowaga at the center of Cayuga Creek thence westerly along gthe center line of said Cayuga Creek to the center line of Clinton Street thence westerly along the center line of Clinton street to the easterly boundary line of the City of Buffalo thence northerly along said easterly line of the City of Buffalo to the center line of Willaim Street to the center line of Harlem Avenue to the point of begininning excepting however from the lands above described so much thereof as are now included in the Cochrance Street Sewer District so called.

Notice is likewise hereby given that the said Town Board of said town will meet at the regular meeting place of said Board on Broadway near Union Road in said Town on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of September 1911 at four o'clock in the afternoon at which time and place the said board will consider the said proposed plan and will hear the allegations of all persons who may be interested therein.

#### **Cheektowaga September 25<sup>th</sup>, 1911**

Moved by Mr. Fossett seconded by Schiesel that the matter of the adoption of the general plans for a sewerage system in what is proposed to be sewer district number three of the the Town of Cheektowaga be held for further consideration until the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October 1911. Carried.

Moved by Brennen seconded by Fossett that the sewer proposition be held over to the next regular meeting and that the clerk of this board shall notify the Village Board of Sloan to be present at the next regular meeting to be held at the regular meeting place <onday October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1911. Carried.

Moved by Durringer seconded by Brennen that the following preamble and resolution be adopted.

Whereas it appears from the petition presented to this Board by taxpayers of Lamp District number one of the Town of Cheektowaga that the majority of resident taxpayers of said district desire that is be lighted by a combination of magnetite arc and tungsten lamps, now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Supervisor be authorized to enter into a contract in a form to be approved by the Town Attorney with the Lancaster Light Power Conduit Company of Lancaster N.Y. to furnish install and maintain a system of Electric lighting in Lamp District number one of the Town of Cheektowaga consisting of magnetic arc lights and tungsten lights for a term to end January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1915.
