**Cheektowaga Oct 8th 1912**

Special meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga held at the house of Michael Bitterman there was present Wildy Schiesel Fossett Brennan Durringer Monin absent Forster

Resolution offered by Mr. Fossett seconded by Mr. Schiesel that the following grant of the Crosstown Street Railroad Company be adopted.

Whereas the Crosstown Street Railroad Company of Buffalo a street surface Railroad corporation herein after referred to as "Railway Company) was heretofore and on or about the 24th day of March 1898 granted the right privilege and authority to construct, maintain and operate an electric railroad or extension or branches thereof upon the surface of through and along Walden Avenue in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, from the then present terminus of the line of railway company at the easterly city line of the City of Buffalo so as to connect with the tracks of railway company in Walden Avenue easterly to the Pine Ridge Road, in said Town of Cheektowaga together with the right privilege and authority of maintaining, operating and constructing such switches sidings turn-outs turn-tables and suitable stands and such electric poles and wires as might be necessary for the convenient working of said railroad; and

Whereas in and by such consent it was provided among other things that the tracks of railway company were to be laid on the south side of said highway; and

Whereas, railway company has been urgently requested by various residents and citizens of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York to change the location of its tracks in said highway to a location near the center of said highway and has been further been requested by various residents of said town to install and operate upon its so-called Sycamore Street line the modern and improved type of street car commonly known as the "Near-Side" Cars: and

Whereas, said railway company desires to change the location of its tracks and to be granted the right privilege and authority to operate its railroad in certain portions of Rugby Avenue and certain portions of Walden Avenue hereinafter mor (more) particularly described; and

Whereas, said railway company has made application by petition in writing to the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York for consent to change the location of its tracks in that portion of Walden Avenue from the easterly city line of the City of Buffalo to the Pine Ridge Road from the south side to a location nearer the center thereof and for consent to construct maintain and operate a street surface railroad and necessary connection by power of electricity for public use in the conveyance of persons and property in cars for compensation in said town, upon and along the surface of the following streets, avenues and highways in said Town of Cheektowaga as follows:-

Commencing at the present easterly terminus of the present tracks of said railway company in Walden Avenue in the Town of Cheektowaga and extending easterly of Rugby Avenue and extending northerly in Rugby Avenue a distance of 160 feet.

As is more fully shown upon the map hereto attached and for consent to construct such switches, sidings turn-outs and turn-tables and suitable stands as may be necessary for the convenient working of said railway: - and

Whereas, the said Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents, before acting upon such application, gave public notice thereof and of the time and place when such application would first be considered, which notice was published daily for fourteen days in two daily newspapers published in the City of Buffalo, the city nearest the Town of Cheektowaga, there being no newspaper published in said town; and

Whereas at the time and place named in said notice the said application was duly considered and the said railway company and the persons appearing at said application; and

Whereas said Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga have determined that consent shall be given to the construction maintenance and

operation of said railroad and of such switches sidings turn-outs and turn-tables, and suitable stands as may be necessary for the convenient working of said railroad and as prayed for in said petition; now therefore

Be It Resolved that the prayer of said petition of said railway company be and the same hereby is granted and that consent be and the same hereby is given pursuant to law to the said crosstown Street Railway Company of Buffalo to change the location of its tracks from the south side of Walden Avenue in the Town of Cheektowaga to a location nearer the center thereof and that the consent of March 24, 1898 to said company be and the same hereby is amended accordingly. And

Be it Further Resolved that consent be and hereby is granted to said Crosstown Street Railway Company of Buffalo to construct maintain and operate a railroad upon the surface of, through and along the following streets Avenues roads and highways of said Town to wit: -

Commencing at the present easterly termines of the present tracks of said railway company in Walden Avenue in the Town of Cheektowaga and extending easterly therefrom in Walden Avenue to a point two hundred feet easterly of Rugby Avenue; and commencing at the intersection of the north line of Walden Avenue a distance of 160 feet.

And consent is hereby also given to said company to construct upon said streets avenues, roads and highways such switches, turn-outs, turn-tables and suitable stands as may be necessary for the convenient working of said railroad.

It Is Hereby Further Resolved, that the foregoing consent is given upon the following express conditions to wit; that the provisions of Article 4 of the Railroad Law pertinent thereto shall be complied with: and

And that the said railway company shall maintain to tracks in good condition and pave with brick the space between its tracks in Walden Avenue and keep said brick pavement in good condition and shall maintain the space between all of its tracks, turn-outs switches etc... in Walden Avenue and in Rugby Avenue in a save and passable condition so that the same shall not obstruct the free and safe travel by the public in along or across said Walden or Rugby Avenue and be it further

Resolved that before this franchise of consent shall become operative the said railway company shall file with the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga its acceptance thereof in writing and its agreement to conform to and abide by all of the conditions and covenants therein contained. And, that, unless such acceptance and agreement shall be filed, as aforesaid on or before the 18th day of October 1912 then the said franchise or consent shall immediately cease and become void.

Whereas under the agreement dated the 25th day of September 1907 between the Town of Cheektowaga and the City of Buffalo for sewer connections at Clinton Street and the City Line of Buffalo there became due and owing on the first day of October 1912 to the City of Buffalo for rental from the said first day of Buffalo for rental from the said first day of October 1912 - to the first day of October 1913 the sum of \$ 122.00 and

Whereas under the agreement dated the aforesaid day of September 1907 between the Town of Cheektowaga and the City of Buffalo for sewer connections at Walden Avenue and the City line of Buffalo there became due and owing to the City of Buffalo on the first day of October 1912 for rental from the first day of October 1912 to the first day of October 1913 the sum \$ 450.00 now, therefore be it

Resolved that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the City of Buffalo the aforesaid rental to - wit the sum of \$572.00 and be it further

Resolved that the said Supervisor be and he levy or cause to be spread and levied (\$122.00) of said moneys so paid upon the taxable property in the Cochrane Street Sewer District so - called to reimburse the Town of Cheektowaga for the moneys so expended and to spread and levy or cause to be spread and levied (\$450.00) of said moneys so paid upon the Taxable property in Walden Avenue Sewer District, so-called to reimburse the Town of Cheektowaga for the moneys so expended upon behalf of the said sewers districts."

Resolution offered by Mr. Fossett and seconded by Mr. Monin was duly adopted

Whereas, by an order of the Supreme Court of the State of New York made at a special Term thereof held at the City and County Hall in the City of Buffalo New York on the 24 day of June, 1912, it was determined and apportioned that the Town of Cheektowaga pay one-half of the expense of constructing a new highway bridge over Cayuga Creek in Clinton Street, between the Towns of Cheektowaga and West Seneca to - wit the sum of (\$10,921.00) and directing that the said Towns each appropriate the said sum and that the same be made immediately aware able for the purpose of building said bridge, and

Whereas owing to the shortening of the span of said bridge the cost thereof has been reduced so that the share of the Town of Cheektowaga will be approximately \$9400.00 and

Whereas it is necessary for the Town of Cheektowaga to borrow the sum of \$9000.00 to provide the necessary moneys to pay the share of said town in cost of such construction, now therefore, be it

Resolved that the said sum of \$9400.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon be and the same is hereby appropriated for the aforesaid purpose, and be it further,

Resolved that Three (3) bonds, dated as of the 15th day of October 1912 each of the denomination of \$8000.00 be issued upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga under the seal of said town and the hands of its Supervisor and Town Clerk and offered for sale and sold by the Supervisor in due form of law for the purpose of immediately providing the aforesaid moneys and be it further.

Resolved that said bonds shall be an interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, and that one of said bonds and occurred interest shall become due and payable on the 1st day of October, 1913, the second and accrued interest on the 1st day of 1st day of October 1915. Adopted

Whereas, the Town Engineer has certified to this board that it will be necessary to use some kind of water-proofing in the construction of the concrete work of the settling tank of the disposal plant to be constructed in connection with the sewerage system in Sewer District number Three of the Town of Cheektowaga, and

Whereas said Engineer has estimated that said Water - proofing will cost approximately (\$2.00) per cubic yard of concrete work. Now therefore be it

Resolved that the use of said waterproofing in said concrete work be and the same is hereby authorized and directed and be it further

Resolved, that the Town Engineer be and he is hereby directed (directed) to make the necessary tests to determine the most suitable material to be used for this purpose and to prepare plans and specifications for its use. And be it further

Resolved that the said engineer and the Clerk of this Board be and they are hereby ordered to direct Hydro Construction Company to use and employ the water - proofing Material which shall be designated by said town engineer under the aforesaid plans and specifications in the construction of said settling tank at a cost which shall not exceed (\$2.00) per cubic yard, for concrete work. Adopted

Resolved that the said headwall be constructed: and be it further

Resolved that the town engineer and the clerk of this Board be and they are hereby ordered to direct Hydro Construction Company to construct said headwall in accordance with the aforesaid plans and specifications under its unit price for reinforced concrete construction specified in its contract with the Town of Cheektowaga. Adopted

Whereas it is the sense of this board that the interests of the traveling public generally will be promoted by a change in the location of the approaches to the viaduct to be erected over the Terminal Railway of Buffalo for the accommodation of highway traffic of the Union Road and French Road in the Town of Cheektowaga from the location, as ordered in the determination and order of the Public's Service Commission in and for the Second district of New York dated the 16th day of November 1909, to a location as shown upon a map marked exhibit "A" , prepared at the request of this board by F.E. Paradis, District Engineer of the Terminal Railway of Buffalo and submitted to this Board this day. Now therefore be it

Resolved that the location of said approaches both on the northerly and southerly sides of said Terminal Railway of Buffalo as shown upon the aforesaid map be and the same is hereby approved and be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor be and he is hereby directed to join in an application to the Public Service Commission in and for the Second District of New York for an order amending the aforesaid order of said Public Service Commission, heretofore made on the 16th day of November 1909 modifying a determination of the Board of Railroad Commissioners dated April 30th 1907 in relation to the construction of said Viaduct or bridge to carry the Union and French Roads over said Railway

In the matter of the Application of the Terminal Railway of Buffalo for a modification of the determination of the Board of the Railroad Commissioners dated April 30th 1907 as to the railway of said companys crossing highways in the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County; - "which said petition shall request in substance that the aforesaid order of the said Public Service Commissioner in relation to said viaduct at Union and French Roads, be amended to read as follows: -

That the Union and French Road highway grade crossings of the Terminal Railway of Buffalo, in the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, shall be closed and discontinued and that new pieces of highway and an overhead bridge crossing of said Railway (to take the place of these two existing grade crossing) shall be constructed the said overhead bridge crossing to be located as shown upon the map annexed to the amended petition of said the Terminal Railway of Buffalo filed with this Commission on the 1st day of October, 1909, at a distance of practically 640 feet south - west from the point of intersection of the center line of said Union Road and French Road and at right angles to the center line of said The Terminal Railway of Buffalo the said new highway to be opened North - west of the said The Terminal Railway of Buffalo connecting the said French Road and Union Road to be parallel with said center line of The Terminal Railway of Buffalo and 631.2 feet therefrom said new highway to be joined to the new highway crossing the railroad at right angles and to the present French Road and Union Road highways with curves having a radius of 200 feet, The new highway to be opened south east of said The Terminal Railway of Buffalo Connecting the new highway crossing The Terminal Railway of Buffalo at right angles with Union Road to start at a point 599.4 feet south-east of said center line of said Railway and curve in a southerly direction on a curve having a radius of 200 feet and joining the present highwaylands of Union Road; the new highway to be opened south-east of said The Terminal Railway of Buffalo connecting the new highway crossing said Railway at right angles with French Road, to start at a point 599.4 feet south east of said center line of said Railway and curve in a northerly direction on a curve from a radius of 200 feet and central angle of 75° 0'; thence following a straight line in a northerly direction to French the said connection with French Road to be made with a curve having a radius of 200 feet the width of said new highway to be 66 feet, a good earth Railroad paved with crushed stone 6 inches thick to a width of not less than 16 feet with proper drainage ditches to be constructed by said The Terminal Railway of Buffalo, except and otherwise herein directed as to the approached the existing highways between the several points of junction with the new highway to be closed and discontinued when the highways including the bridge and approaches shall have been fully constructed and opened for public use; that said overhead bridge shall be of steel of a width of thirty feet for roadway and have a five fee side walk on brackets and be of the length of approximately seven hundred and sixty five feet; that the floor of said overhead bridge shall be of the best quality of paing brick that the Approaches to said overhead bridge shall be on a grade net greater than four per cent and shall be of width of 35 feet including roadway and side walk that said approaches shall be macadamized a width of eighteen feet with a sidewalk; constructed of Macadam topped with screenings of a width of five feet and shall be guarded by a strong and substantial railing on both sides of a material and dimensions to be approved in connection with the detailed plans for said bridge: that said overhead bridge shall be of sufficient strength to carry street surface railroad car weighing fifty tons loaded; Be it further

Resolved that the Town Attorney be and he is hereby directed to assist in the preparation of said petition and to appear before the Public Service Commission and urge it to adopt an order changing the location of the proposed approaches to said Viaduct as herein before recited
