Meeting of Walden Fire District Number 2 held at the Fire Hall February 14th, 1913 meeting was called to order by the Town Clerk at 7:30 and upon motion of Mr. Fossett and seconded by Mr. Rosehardt, Mr. Edward Ernst was appointed Chairman of the meeting.

The chairman appointed Mr. Jacob Rosehardt secretary of the meeting the chairman appointed Mr. Charles Martin Poll Clerk and Mr. Woodruff inspector of election.

Nominations for commissioners in order Mr. John Rosehardt nominated Mr. Charles Wolfarth. Mr. Fossett nominated Mr. William Graph, Mr. Geroge Gillig nominated Mr. Joseph S. Lippert, Mr. Ernst Wieberg was nominated for Treasurer Chaiman. Cheektowaga March 20th, 1913

Special meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents held at the Town Clerk's office there was present Wildy, Schiesel, Fossett, Brennan, Durringer, Monin absent Forster.

Resolution offered by Fossett seconded by Brennan was duly adopted.

Whereas owing to the fact that the construction of the sewerage and disposal system in and for sewer district number (3) of the Town of Cheektowaga is still unfinished and the fact that it will be

impossible to ascertain the exact cost of the same until after the entire completion thereof because of the work being done under the unit system, and

Whereas as a consequence the assessment to pay the cost of such construction has not as yet been levied or collected and

Whereas interest in the sum of twenty- three hundred (\$2,300.00) dollars on bonds in the aggregate sum of (\$69,000.00) heretofore issued by the Town of Cheektowaga to pay the cost of the construction of said system will become due and payable on the 1st day of April 1913 and the principal of bonds numbers 1,2 and 61 of said issue aggregating twenty (?) hundred (\$2,300.00) dollars will likewise fall due on April 1st, 1913 and

Whereas this board will be unable by the exercise of due diligence, to raise the necessary moneys to pay said interest and principal by the issuance and sale of a certificate of indebtedness or of bonds now therefore be it

RESOLVED that this board raise the sum of forty- six (?) (\$4,600.00) dollars temporarily by the issuance of a promissory note of the Town of Cheektowaga dated as of the 31st day of March 1913 to bear interest at the rate of not to exceed six (6%) per centum per annum and to mature three (3) months from and after the date thereof for the purpose of paying the said interest on the sewer bonds heretofore issued by this town in the aggregate sum of sixty- nine thousand (\$69,000.00) dollars from the 1st day of August 1912 to the first day of April 1913 and for the purpose of paying the principle sum of bonds numbered 1-2 and 61 of said issue aggregating the sum of twenty- three hundred (\$2,300.00) dollars principle and be it further

RESOLVED that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they are hereby respectively authorized and directed to sign and countersign the said note for and in behalf of the said Town of Cheektowaga. And be it further

RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate the said note and to pay the proceeds to the persons or corporation entitled thereto in payment of the said interest and principle of said bonds. Adopted
