

Cheektowaga, July 7, 1920

Special meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga, duly and regularly called for the purpose of considering petitions and hearing all persons interested in the matter of constructing sidewalks and sewer extension. Members present: Stiglmeier, Stumpf, Seege, Inda, Besser, and Ferry, Absent, Duringer. As no persons appeared the following resolution presented by Inda seconded by Ferry was adopted.

Resolved, that the respective owners of land abutting on both sides of Ridge Park Avenue, John Street, Woodell Avenue Alma Street and on the easterly side Cochrane Street, from Clinton Street to Griswold Street, be, and they are hereby, ordered and directed to construct, on or before the 1st day of August, 1920, a granolithic sidewalk (4) feet in width, in front of their respective premises, in accordance with the plans and specifications and the grade established therefore by the Town Engineer and in accordance with the general rules and regulations for the construction of sidewalks in the Town of Cheektowaga, heretofore adopted by this Board and on file in the office of the Town Clerk: and be it further, Resolved, that the Clerk of this Board be, and he is hereby, directed to cause due notice of the adoption of this order to be served in the manner prescribed by Statute. WHEREAS, The Town Engineer was, heretofore, by resolution duly adopted by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga, directed to make and prepare definite plans and specifications and a careful estimate of the expense and with the assistance of the Attorney for this Board, a proposed contract for the construction of a sewer in Cushing Avenue, in the Town of Cheektowaga, to extend northerly from the present northerly terminus of the sewer in Cushing Avenue to a point (105) one hundred and five feet therefrom, together with the necessary manhole; and : Where as said definite plans and specifications, estimate and contract be and each and every one of the same is hereby approved and adopted; and be it further Resolved, That this Board invite seated proposals to be submitted to it at two o'clock in the afternoon on the 2nd day of August, 1920, at the Town Hall of the Town of Cheektowaga, located at the junction of Broadway and Union Road and Ellicott Roads, in said town, for the furnishing of the materials and the performance of the labor necessary, or proper, to construct the aforesaid sewer and connections, manhole and appurtenances, in accordance with the aforesaid plans and specifications and under said proposed contract, and that the Town Clerk be and he is hereby directed to prepare with the assistance of the Town Attorney and Town Engineer, proper notice calling for such proposals, in detail, and cause the same to be published in the Enterprise Times, that being the official paper for this Town, in its issues of July 22nd and July 29th, 1920, and in the Buffalo Evening Times, a newspaper published in the adjoining city of Buffalo, New York, in its issues of July 15th and July 22nd, 1920; and be it further.

RESOLVED, That this Board meet at the afore said time and place, for the purpose of opening and considering such proposals as shall be submitted to this board in response to such invitation, and of taking such action thereon as to this board shall seem proper. MOVED by Seege seconded by Ferry that the General Ordinances, rules, and regulations of the Town of Cheektowaga, governing sewerage system and disposal plants in said town be amended to read as follows.

Cheektowaga Sewers

General ordinance, Rules and Regulations of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York Governing Sewerage Systems and disposal Plants in said Town.

SECTION 1, The Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga shall appoint a sewer inspector for each sewer district, to hold office during the pleasure of said board, who shall under the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents, have charge of the sewerage system in said district and shall carefully inspect all connections made with or openings into any public sewer, and said inspector shall carry out all of the provisions relative to the sewerage systems of said town.

SECTION 2, Said sewer inspector shall be a resident of the sewer district of which he is inspector, Said sewer inspector shall receive for each inspection as provided herein two dollars, to be paid as herein after provided.

SECTION 3, No person, firm or corporation, shall make any connections with or opening into any public sewer unless he shall have a written permit issued by the Town Clerk and is a plumber having actively carried on his work for at least five years prior to the time of making such connection or opening and unless said person shall have filed a bond approved by said Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents in the sum of two thousand dollars, conditioned as shall be required by the said Board.

SECTION 4, Every application for permission to connect with a public sewer must be made in writing by the owner of the property to be drained or his authorized agent and by the plumber or drain layer, upon a blank provided by said board. Such application shall be made at least three days before opening the street, and shall contain such information as the said board shall require, and before any street shall be opened, the ordinances of the Town relating to the opening of streets shall be complied with.

SECTION 5, The town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents reserves the right to revoke and annul any permit to make a sewer connection at any time it shall deem it for the best interest of the town so to do.

SECTION 6, Any permit to connect with the sewers shall be given upon the express condition that the board may at any time before the work is completed if it shall deem it for the interest of the town or sewer district so to do, revoke and annul the permit, and no person interested shall have the right to claim damages in consequence of such revocation or annulment.

SECTION 7, The drain layer or plumber authorized as provided herein, who connects any private drain with public sewer, shall be held responsible for any injury which he or his employees may cause to the sewer or to any lawful structure in the highway.

SECTION 8, No person firm or corporation who shall connect any open gutter or privy with any public sewer, or with any private drain or sewer connection with the public sewer.

SECTION 9, No rain conductor, cesspool or vault shall be connected directly or indirectly with any public sewer.

SECTION 10, No person, firm or corporation shall injure, break into or remove any portion of any manhole, flush tank or any other part of the public sewer or sewerage disposal works, or any part thereof.

SECTION 11, No person, firm or corporation shall deposit or cause to be deposited any garbage, offal, dead animal, filth or any substance having a tendency to obstruct the flow of the sewage in any manhole, lamphole, flush tank sewer opening or drain, or any substance which might injure the sewer in any way. Whatever.

SECTION 12, The trench for a private sewer shall be dug to the public sewer at an angle most favorable for the flow of the sewage. The "Y" or branch for connection shall first be forward and uncovered, the trench then dug and the sewer laid in a straight line whenever possible from the "Y" or branch to the building.

SECTION 13, The earth from the trench shall be so placed as not to obstruct.

SECTION 14, Whenever the sides of the trench will not stand vertically, sheathing and bracing shall be used to prevent unnecessary caving, when required by the inspector. All excavations shall be made in open cut, no tunneling will be allowed except under an express permission from the inspector.

SECTION 15, Reasonable and proper barriers and danger signals and safeguards must be placed and maintained on the banks of a trench to guard the public against accidents during the progress of the work and until the same shall be completed, so that the persons passing along the street or sidewalk shall not be liable to fall into any excavation made; and shall during the whole of every night that such excavation shall remain, cause the same to securely fenced and a light or lights to be placed and kept upon such fence so secured and protected, that the same shall not be extinguished.

SECTION 16, The private or house drains shall be iron pipe pipe or salt glazed, vitrified earthenware. Socket sewer pipes, of best quality, free from imperfections of any nature, and at least four inches in inside diameter from building to street curb, and from curb to main sewer connections, six inches in inside diameter. An enlarger shall be used wherever there is a change in the size of the pipe. When tile is used for the house sewer, it must not be laid within two feet of the wall of any building, but extra heavy iron pipe must be used inside of the wall and for two feet outside thereof.

SECTION 17, The pipe shall be laid on a uniform grade of not less than one eighth (1/8) inch per foot.

SECTION 18, Curved pipe shall be used for every deflection from a straight line, and no pipe shall be chipped to form a curve.

SECTION 19. The joints shall be made water tight with a proper oakum or tarred jute gasket and portland cement mortar, of a quality approved by the inspector. Mortar shall be one part cement to one part sand. No water lime or tempered up cement shall be used.

SECTION 20. The stopper of the "Y" or other branch on the sewer shall be carefully removed so as not to injure the socket or the pipe, and the removal of the stopper and the connection at the "Y" or branch done only in the presence and under the supervision of the inspector.

SECTION 21. The first length of pipe attached to the sewer shall be curved and set as shall be required. The pipe shall be laid with the hub or bell end up grade.

SECTION 22. The inside of every drain or sewer shall be left clean and smooth throughout, and true to lime grade. A scraper or wiper must be used after the cement is applied to each joint and before the next section is laid, to remove any cement that may have been forced into the pipe.

SECTION 23. Each sewer or drain shall be provided with a trap which shall be located between the house and the curb, and connected with said trap there shall be an air vent to allow gases to escape from said sewer drain.

SECTION 24. In back filling, the earth shall be carefully rammed or compacted with water, as the inspector shall require, after the filling around and over the pipe to a depth of one foot has been carefully placed and rammed, so as to keep the pipe in proper position to avoid settling.

SECTION 25. All material and workmanship used and employed shall be of the best quality and subject to the approval of the inspector, and no material shall be used on back filling done, until both material and work have been examined and approved by him.

SECTION 26. All private sewers or drains connecting with packing houses, butcher shops, large rendering establishments, hotels, restaurants, boarding houses, and laundries, shall be provided with a suitable grease trap.

SECTION 27. All fixtures, except water closets connecting with private drains or sewers, leading into the public sewers, shall be provided with suitable traps and strong metallic strainers, to prevent the introduction of improper substances in to the sewers.

SECTION 28. Nothing except ordinary house sewage shall be connected with the private drains or sewers, except as herein otherwise provided.

SECTION 29. Not more than one building shall be connected with a private drain or sewer, except under special written permission to be obtained from the Town Board.

SECTION 30. "Y" or other branches where built must be used for making connections. A special permit must be obtained from the board for connecting in any other manner, such connection to be made only in the presence and under the constant supervision of the inspector, and to the satisfaction of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga.

SECTION 31. No liability shall be attached to the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga for the incorrect location of any "Y" or other branch.

SECTION 32. No private drain or sewer shall be larger than six inches in diameter unless by special permit from the Board.

SECTION 33. The inspector shall inspect all sewer connections and external house drains within twenty-four hours after a written or personal notification to the said inspector from the drain layer, or otherwise it may considered passed upon and may be covered, provided the drain layer shall file with the board a written statement that the inspection was not made within the above mentioned time, and said drain layer shall have all sewer connections and external house drains ready for inspection at the time specified in said notification, and of said connections and drains are not ready for inspection at said time shall pay said inspection for the time necessarily spent in traveling from his home to the places of inspection at the rate of compensation, as heretofore fixed.

SECTION 34. Any plans or specifications that may now or hereafter be adopted by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga shall be considered a part of these rules and regulations.

SECTION 35. Any person firm or corporation violating any of the foregoing sections shall forfeit and pay to the Town of Cheektowaga a penalty of fifty (\$50.00) dollars for each offense, and the violation by a plumber or drain layer of any of the foregoing sections shall be sufficient cause for the revocation of his authority to make connections with said public sewer, and it is hereby ordained that a violation of any of the foregoing sections shall constitute disorderly conduct, and the person violating any of these sections shall be a disorderly person.

SECTION 36. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga to issue permits under the foregoing rules and regulations and shall receive a fee of twenty-five cents for each and every permit, to be paid by the applicant. Upon issuing such permit the Clerk shall immediately in writing, notify the inspector of the fact of such issue. The location of the "Y" shall be furnished with each permit. Each applicant for a permit shall likewise pay to said Town Clerk, prior to or at the time of the delivery of said permit the

additional sum of two dollars for the fee of the inspector for making the inspection of the work to be done under said permit, which said latter fee shall be paid over by said Town Clerk to said inspector on demand.

SECTION 37. Every owner or occupant of any lot or premises who shall receive a permit under the foregoing rules and regulations shall construct any private drain or sewer, connecting with the public sewer in front of his or her premises or lot, and shall fail to refill, relay or replace the street and sidewalk dug, taken up or disturbed by him or her or his or her employees in as good condition as the same was before the work of building said private drain or sewer was commenced shall forfeit and pay to the Town of Cheektowaga a penalty of fifty (\$50.00) dollars and the Town Superintendent of Highways may cause said street or sidewalk to be refilled, re-laid, rebuilt or repaired and shall report the expense thereof to the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents and the same shall be assessed upon the lot and premises in front of which such work shall be done.

SECTION 38. All the foregoing ordinances, rules and regulations shall be published in the official paper of said Town of Cheektowaga, as required by law, and shall take effect on the 15th day of October, 1920.

And

WHEREAS the said contractor has actually entered upon the execution of said work and is now so engaged, and it is necessary that the sum of twenty-nine thousand seven hundred (\$29700.00) dollars be made immediately available to pay the cost of said improvement and

WHEREAS the Town of Cheektowaga has no funds with which to pay the same and it is necessary to borrow the said sum, temporarily, for the aforesaid purpose pending the levy and collection of the share of the Town of Cheektowaga thereof, and the reimbursement of the town by the County of Erie, now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the said sum of twenty-nine thousand seven hundred (\$29700.00) dollars and such interest as shall accrue thereon upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga from Liberty Bank of Buffalo by the issuance and delivery of a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga dated as of the 9th day of Sept. 1920, payable with interest at the rate of six (6%) per centum per annum, to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Banking House in the City of Buffalo, New York, on the 9th day of March, 1921, which said certificate of indebtedness shall be signed by the Supervisor and countersigned by the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, who are hereby, respectively authorized and directed to execute the same for and on behalf of said town and under its seal and to deliver the same to said bank for the aforesaid purpose.
