Moved by Inda seconded by Besser that the minutes of the previous meetings be approved, as published in the official paper, carried.

The Supervisor called for proposals for the construction of sewers in the Pine Hill sewer district No. 4.

Two proposals were submitted as follows.

Proposal No 1. By Emil Cerrullo and Eugene Januale for \$39000.00

Proposal No 2. By Louis De Pasquale excluding Genesee St. For \$25,677.00 complete job for \$45,250.00 bid bond enclosed.

Moved by Inda seconded by Besser that the contract for constructing sewers in Pine Hill sewer district No 4 be awarded to Emil Cerrullo and Eugene Januale for the sum of \$39000.00 they being the lowest bidders, and that the Supervisor and Clerk be authorized to enter into an agreement in behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga with the said Emil Cerrullo and Eugene Januale, carried

Whereas, written petitions dated the 14th day of June, 1919, and April 27th, 1921, duly executed and acknowledged in accordance with the provisions of the Town Law, have been presented to this Board, praying that this Board shall construct, or cause to be constructed, sidewalks in accordance with the specifications heretofore adopted by this Board and grades to be established by the Town Engineer, on the northerly and southerly sides of Doat Street, for its entire length, commencing at Waverly Street and ending at Alexander Street, on the northerly side of Walden Avenue, from John Street to Wanda Street, and on the easterly and westerly sides of Cushing Avenue, for its entire length, at an estimated cost of six thousand (\$6,000.00) dollars, and that the cost thereof shall be assessed against and collected from the owners of the respective parcels of land in front of which said sidewalks shall be laid, now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that said petitions be received and placed on file, and be it further resolved that this board meet at the Town Hall, in the Town of Cheektowaga, at the junction of Broadway, Union Road and Ellicott Roads, on the 26th day of July, 1921, at 7:00 o'clock in the afternoon, daylight saving time for the purpose of considering the said petitions and hearing all persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same: and be it further

Resolved, that the Clerk of this Board be, and he is hereby directed to give due notice of the time and place of said meeting in the manner prescribed by Statute, adopted this 11th day of July, 1921,

Moved by Inda seconded by Seege that the following resolution be adopted.

Whereas, a written petition, duly executed and acknowledged by a majority of the owners of the real property hereinafter described, bearing date the 31st day of May, 1921, requested that Lamp District Number Three of the Town of Cheektowaga be enlarged and extended and that the hereinafter described real property be included therein, has been duly presented to this Board: and

Whereas, this Board feels that public interest will be served by the enlargement of said Lamp District in the manner requested, now, therefore, be it

Resolved that the said petition be received and placed on file and that Lamp District Number Three be enlarged by the addition thereto and inclusion therein of the following described property, to-wit: -

All that tract or parcel of land, situate in the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, and State of New York, more particularly bounded and described as follows:

Being situate in farm lots sixteen (16) and eleven (11) in Township eleven (11) and Range seven (7) of the Holland Land Company's survey and commencing at a point in the northerly right of way line of the New York Central Railroad Company's main line at the point where the westerly line of premises now, or formerly, owned by Martin F. Malin meets the same, running thence northerly along said westerly line of said Malin lands to the northerly boundary line of said Malin lands to the center line of Union Road at a point about eight hundred ninety-two and thirty-two one hundredths (892.32) feet northerly from the point of intersection between said center line of Union Road and the northerly right of way line of the New York Central Railroad Company's main line: thence continuing easterly in a straight line at right angles with the center line of Union Road, to the easterly line of lands now or formerly owned by Edward P. Schlenker: the said easterly line of said Schlenker lands being also the westerly boundary line of lands now or formerly owned by William J. Connors and lands owned by Edward S. Smith; running thence southerly along said easterly line of said Schlenker lands to the northerly right of way line of the New York Central Railroad Company: thence westerly along said northerly right of way line of said railroad company to the point or place of beginning, and be it further

Moved by Inda seconded by Seege that the communication of John Eckhart representing John G. Sattler in the matter of the Town accepting the following streets, Clover Place, Evergreen Place, Ariole Place, Woodbine Place, Meadow Place, Kokomo Place, in the Town of Cheektowaga, be laid on the table and that the proposed deed and abstract be referred to the Town Attorney, and that this Board meet at the junction of Union Road and Buffalo & Depew Railway at 7:00 o'clock P.M. Daylight Saving Time, on the 19th day of July 1921 for the investigation of same, carried

Moved by Inda seconded by Durringer that the Supervisor and Clerk be authorized to enter into an agreement with Depew & Lancaster Light Power and Conduit Company, to install eight lamps upon the Harlem Avenue Viaduct under its proposed agreement heretofore made to this Board: the expense to be distributed as follows. Two of said lamps to be paid by lamp district number one two by lamp district number three and four by the Village of Sloan, carried

Moved by Besser seconded by Seege that the claim of Mrs. Joseph Foster for rental of furniture for election booth for the years 1903 & 1917 be rejected as to the years 1903 to 1925 inclusive, and allowed for years 1916 & 1917 at \$8.00 per year aggregating the sum of \$16.00, carried

Moved by Besser seconded by Seege that the request of the Delmonto Paving Company be granted and the Clerk be directed to notify the Western New York Water Company to install water meter on such hydrants as the Delmonto Paving Company shall designate, to measure a supply of water for a public use for construction of sidewalks in and along Shanley Street, Willowlawn Parkway, Meadowbrook Parkway and Pleasant Parkway, the cost of which water shall be

deducted by the Town of Cheektowaga from the contract price to be paid to Delmonto Paving Company for the construction of said sidewalks, carried

Moved by Seege seconded by Besser that petition of Herman Lessig for refund of sewer rental in Walden Avenue district be laid on table for investigation, carried

Moved by Seege seconded by Besser that James Burke be appointed sidewalk inspector on sidewalks now being constructed in Clinton Gardens at a salary of \$5.00 a day for each day that the contractor works, the work of said inspector shall be subject to the approval of the Supervisor who may discontinue his employment whenever in his judgment public interest may require it, carried

Moved by Inda seconded by Besser that the Supervisor's quarterly report be received and filed, carried

Moved by Besser seconded by Inda that John R. Queen be appointed special constable for his park only, at Harlem Avenue and Cayuga Road to hold office at the pleasure of this Board, carried

Moved by Inda seconded by Seege that the following resolution be adopted:

Resolved that the provisions of section 26 of the Transportation Corporations Law, being Chapter 219 of the Laws of 1909, as amended by Chapter 307 of the Laws of 1919, shall apply to and become operative in the Town of Cheektowaga, and be it further

Resolved that no bus line, stage route, motor vehicle line, or route, nor any vehicle in connection therewith, nor any vehicle carrying passengers at a rate of fare of fifteen cents, or less, for each passenger, within the limits of the Town of Cheektowaga, or in competition with another carrier, which is required by law to obtain the consent of the local authorities of said town to operate over the streets thereof, shall be operated wholly, or partly, upon or along, any street, or highway, in the Town of Cheektowaga, nor receive a certificate of public convenience and necessity, until the owner, or owners, thereof shall have procured after public notice of hearing, the consent of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga in the same manner and subject to the same terms and conditions as is provided in section 26 of the Transportation Corporations Law for procuring the consent of the local authorities of a city, and be it further

Resolved that any person, or corporation, violating any of the provisions of this order and resolution shall pay a penalty in the sum of not less than twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, nor more than two hundred (\$200.00) dollars for each and every violation thereof, adopted this 11th day of July 1921

Resolved, that the Clerk of this Board be and he is hereby directed to cause due notice of the adoption of this order to be served in the manner prescribed by Statute, adopted this 26th day of July, 1921.

Moved by Inda seconded by Besser that the following resolution be adopted.

Whereas this Board has heretofore duly determined to construct sidewalks in and along certain public streets, or highways, of the Town of Cheektowaga, and has duly entered into a written contract on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga for the construction of said improvement, and

Whereas work under said contract is now being done and the Town of Cheektowaga is indebted therefor under said contract in the sum of eighty-five hundred (\$8500.00) dollars, and

Whereas there are on hand no available funds with which to pay and satisfy said indebtedness and it is necessary to borrow said sum and such interest as shall accrue thereon, temporarily, upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga, pending the sale of bonds and the levy and collection of the cost of said improvement, and.

Whereas this board will be unable, in the exercise of due diligence to obtain said moneys by the sale of bonds in time to meet its obligations under said contract, now, therefore, be it

Resolved that the sum of eight-five hundred (\$8500.00) dollars and such interest as shall accrue thereon, upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, and to sign, execute and deliver the promissory note of the Town of Cheektowaga, countersigned by the Town Clerk under the seal of the Town of Cheektowaga, which clerk is likewise authorized and directed to countersign the same and fix such seal thereto, dated as of the 8th day of August, 1921, and payable to the order of said Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch, in the City of Buffalo, New York, ninety (90) days after the date of six (6%) per centum per annum.

Whereas, all of the funds raised by tax during the last tax levy in the Town of Cheektowaga for the maintenance of town highways have been expended for the purpose for which they were raised, and it is necessary to raise the additional sum of six thousand (\$6000.00) dollars to carry on such work as will be necessary to maintain said highways in a safe and passable condition for the balance of the present year until the next tax levy, now, therefore, be it.

Resolved that the following proposition be submitted for determination to the duly qualified electors of the Town of Cheektowaga, at a special town meeting, to be called and held on the 29th day of August, 1921, at the Town Hall at the Junction of Broadway, Union and Ellicott Roads, in said town, between the hours of eight o'clock, Standard Time, or nine o'clock Daylight Saving Time, and sundown to-wit: -

Shall the sum of six thousand (\$600.00) dollars and such interest as shall accrue thereon, in addition to all other moneys heretofore appropriated be appropriated and raised by taxes levied upon and collected from the taxable property liable for highway taxes of the Town of Cheektowaga, for the maintenance of the public highways of said town for the year 1921, and shall the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of said town be authorized and directed to borrow said sum and such interest as shall accrue thereon upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga, pending the levy and collection of said sum by taxation, and be it further

Resolved that the Town Clerk give due notice of the time, and place, and purpose of said meeting by posting as required by Statute and by publication in the Enterprise Time and Buffalo Courier, and that he provide the necessary ballots and other supplies for said meeting,

Joint meeting of the Town Boards of the Town of Cheektowaga, Town of Lancaster and the Town of Alden, held in the Town of Alden this record being taken {sic} from a publication in the Enterprise Times dated June 16, 1921,

Members present: Lancaster, Supervisor John L. Staeber, Town Clerk, Guy E. Bradley, Sup't of Highways, Fred Duttweiler, Justices, Gottschalk George Bethka and Walters, Depew Mayor Alex Utecht, Sup't J.P. Sherrard, Cheektowaga, Supervisor, John Stiglmeier, P.J. Inda, J.W. Ferry, Henry Besser, Arthur Durringer, William Brennan Jr. Attorney, Alden T.B. Yager, ER Pantler, C.H. Pratt, F.J. Yound, Gilbert Ayers, George Dahn, F.L. Bannett.

Mr. Pratt called the meeting to order and Supervisor John L. Staeber was chosen chairman.

The chair presented tentative plans prepared at the expense of the Town of Cheektowaga, one plan for an overhead S shaped crossing, and the second plan for a subway.

The sense of the meeting was that a subway to proceed would be to petition the State Commission of Highways to grant its consent to the institution and maintenance of a proceeding before the public service Commission for the elimination of these crossings and for the determination of the manner in which the separation of the grades shall be accomplished.

Mr. Bresnan further suggested that the respective Boards of the Towns of Lancaster and Alden adopt this petition. He advised that the Town of Cheektowaga would adopt similarly, the same petition and would unite with the Town of Alden and Lancaster in presenting this petition to the Public Service Commission.

The Town Boards of the three townships in question will no doubt take this action at their regular Board meetings.

This Joint meeting of the Town of Lancaster, Cheektowaga and Alden was the next important step towards the abolition of that menace to lives of all who must cross the tracks on Broadway. It looks as though the dream of the past fifty years is about to be realized. The gentlemen who succeed in bringing this grade crossing elimination to a reality will leave an invaluable heritage to succeeding generations as long as the world shall endure.

Special meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, called for the purpose of considering Pine Hill sewer and Union Road Cemetery matter.

Members present: Stiglmeier, Durringer, Inda, Besser, Seege, Ferry

Moved by Besser seconded by Ferry that in the absence of the Town Clerk, P.J. Inda act as Clerk pro-tem, carried

Moved by Besser seconded by Ferry that the following resolution be adopted:

Whereas, the Saints Peter & Paul Greek Russian Orthodox Society of Buffalo, New York has attempted to devote the lands situate in the vicinity of the Junction of Union Road and Buffalo & Lancaster Boulevard, in the Town of Cheektowaga, to Cemetery uses for the Burial of human remains: and

Whereas, the said lands are unsuited as a burial place for the dead and are in too close proximity to human habitations and the burial of human remains in said lands would constitute a grave menace to the health and comfort of the public, now therefore be it

Resolved, that the said proposed cemetery be, and the same hereby, declared to be a public nuisance. And be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to institute and prosecute in the name of and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, appropriate legal action to prevent the use of said lands for cemetery purposes.

Adopted this 27th day of August, 1921 Ayes 6, Noes 0.

Moved by Ferry, seconded by Inda that the Supervisor be directed to obtain the necessary easements for the construction of the Pine Hill sewer system No. 4, carried.

Moved by Ferry, seconded by Besser that the following resolution be adopted.

Whereas, a sewer district known as Sewer District Number 4 was heretofore duly organized, erected and constituted by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of Town of Cheektowaga, and

Whereas, thereafter, a written contract was duly entered into by the Town of Cheektowaga by its Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents under date of the 15th day of July, 1921, with Emil Cerrullo and Eugene Jamiale, for the construction of certain sewers, manhole, etc. In said sewer district No 4 for the sum of Thirty-nine thousand (\$39000.00) dollars and:

Whereas, the said contractors did enter upon the performance of said contract and are now engaged in the execution thereof; and

Whereas, the Town of Cheektowaga is now indebted to said contractors in the sum of eighteen thousand (\$18000.00) dollars for work actually done and material furnished by said contractors in and about the construction of said sewerage system in said Sewer District Number 4, and

Whereas, the Town of Cheektowaga has no funds with which to pay said indebtedness: and

Whereas, it is impracticable in the exercise of due diligence, to raise said money by the sale of bonds or a certificate of indebtedness, and it is necessary to borrow the said sum, temporarily [temporarily], upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga on the promissory note of said town, pending the sale of bonds, now, herefore, be it.
