Whereas, a contract has heretofore been entered into for the improvement of Pine Ridge Road, from Walden Avenue to Genesee Street and of Doat Street from the easterly City line of Buffalo to Pine Ridge as County Aid Town Highways for the sum of \$45,300.00 of which the share of the Town of Cheektowaga is fifty (50%) per centum or the sum of \$22,650.00, and

Whereas a contract has been likewise let for the improvement of New Kensington Avenue from the easterly City line of Buffalo to the Town of Amherst as a County Aid Town Highway and the share of the cost of said Improvement to be paid by the Town of Cheektowaga amounts to \$17,800.00 being (50%) per centum of the cost of said Improvement within the Town of Cheektowaga making the aggregate amount to be raised and deposited with the County Treasurer of the County of Erie to cover the share of the Town of Cheektowaga in the aforesaid improvements before the work can proceed, the sum of \$40,450.00, now therefore be it.

Resolved that the said sum of \$40,450.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon be appropriated by the Town of Cheektowaga to pay its share of the cost of the aforesaid Improvements and that the said sum and such interest as shall accrue Thereon be levied and collected from the taxable property of the Town of Cheektowaga in ten (10) equal or nearly annual installments of which shall be raised in the year 1924, and be it further.

Resolved that pending the levy and collection of said sum by taxes Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga shall be issued for the aggregate sum of (\$40,450.00) to be dated as of the first day of July 1923 of such denomination or denominations as the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents shall determine one tenth (1-10th) of the principle of which said bonds shall mature annually from the first day of July 1924 to and including the first day of July 1923 and which said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding six (6%) per centum per annum, payable annually or semi-annually as the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of said Board shall determine, and be it further

Resolved that such sum shall be annually raised by taxes levied upon and collected from the taxable property of the said town as it shall be necessary to pay the principal and interest of said bonds as the same shall become due and payable and be it further

Resolved that pending the sale and delivery of said bonds the Town of Cheektowaga borrow temporarily the sum of \$40,450.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, N.Y. by the issuance and delivery to said bank of a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga dated as of the first day of June 1923 payable with Interest at the rate of six (6%) per centum per annum to the order of said Liberty Bank of Buffalo N.Y. at its Broadway Branch Banking House in the City of Buffalo N.Y. on or before the 6th day of September 1923 which said certificate of Indebtedness shall be signed by the Supervisor and countersigned by the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga who are hereby respectively authorized and directed to execute sign and countersign the same for and on behalf of said town and under its corporate seal and to deliver the same to said bank for the aforesaid purpose, carried ayes 7 noes none
