Whereas the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie did pursuant to section 320-a of the Highway Law heretofore designate for improvement as County Aid Town Highways the following portions of the following named public highways of the Town of Cheektowaga, to wit: Pine Ridge Road, also known as Pine Hill Road from Walden Avenue to Genesee Street Doat Street from the easterly city line of Buffalo to Pine Ridge Road: Kensington Avenue from the easterly City line of Buffalo to the westerly town line of the Town of Amherst: - and

Whereas a map of the system of highways to be thus improved was duly prepared and adopted by the County of Erie - and.

Whereas plans and specifications of the improvements of the aforesaid were duly prepared and adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie and proposals were duly invited and received for the improvement of said highways and a contract duly let therefor: and

Whereas the proportions of the cost of said improvement to be paid by the County of Erie and by the Town of Cheektowaga respectively were duly determined by resolution by the Board of Supervisor of the County of Erie: - and

Whereas the portion to be paid by the Town of Cheektowaga was duly fixed and determined at the sum of \$40,500.00 Dollars plus the sum of \$1812.05 for extra work and materials necessarily employed and used in about the execution of said improvement: - and

Whereas the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga did duly ratify and confirm the action taken by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie in relation to the improvement of the aforesaid highways: and

Whereas the aforesaid highways have been duly approved in accordance with the aforesaid plans and specifications so prepared and adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie and by this Board: and

Whereas, thereafter on the petition of the duly qualified owners of the lands on that portion of the aforesaid Pine Ridge Road extending from Walden to Scajaquada Creek in the Town of Cheektowaga requesting that the said portion of said highway be improved for a greater width than that specified in the original plans and specifications said extra width of pavement to be laid at the expense of the owners of the premises abutting on the aforesaid of said highway the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of Town of Cheektowaga did duly adopt plans and specifications therefor and did duly enter into a contract for the improvement of said portion of said highway for the width specified in said petition - and

Whereas said portion of said highway has been duly so improved: now therefore be it

Resolved that this board adopt the following as a complete statement in detail of all expenses incurred and to be incurred in relation to the aforesaid improvements to-wit: - Proportion of cost of original contract to be paid {paid} by the Town of Cheektowaga as fixed by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie \$40,500.00 Extra work and materials under original contract to be paid by the Town of Cheektowaga as fixed by said board \$1812.05

Cost of Paving Pine Ridge Road for extra width between Walden Avenue and Scajaquada Creek \$11,100.00

Interest on temporary loans publications of notices printing bonds and legal expenses \$1499.95 total \$54,862.00 and be it further

Resolved that the foregoing statement be entered in minutes of this board and published with its precedings in the official Paper of the Town of Cheektowaga, and be it further

Resolved, that whereas the Town of Cheektowaga has no available funds with which to pay the cost of said improvements the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized name of and upon the faith and credit of said town of which said bonds one hundred shall be of the denomination of \$500.00 each and ten (10) shall be of the denomination of \$486.20 each and which said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from number one (1) to number one hundred ten (110) inclusively and shall be dated as of the first day of January 1924 and shall bear interest from their date at such rate payable semi-annually on the first day of each April and October commencing on the first day of April 1924 as the successful bidder therefor shall specify in his bid not exceeding however six (6%) per centum per annum of which said bonds eleven (11) bonds of the aggregate par value of \$54,862.00 in the sequence in which the said bonds shall be numbered shall become due and payable on each first day of April commencing on the first day of April 1924 until the full amount of principal and interest of said bonds shall have been paid, and be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to give public notice of the time and place of the sale of said bonds and to sell the same in the manner provided by statute and to petition the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie for and on behalf of this Board for permission to borrow the aforesaid money and to issue the aforesaid bonds for the purpose hereinbefore recited, and be it further

Resolved that there be annually levied and assessed against and collected from the taxable property of the Town of Cheektowaga liable therefor a sum sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds as the same became due and payable, carried ayes 7 noes none

Moved by Schiesel seconded by Mueller that the following be adopted

Whereas this Board did heretofore in accordance with the provisions of the statutes relating Thereto duly enter into a contract for the construction of sidewalks in and along the westerly side of Pine Ridge Road from the southerly line of property now owned by Anton J. Kuhn and family to the southerly line of lands owned by Theodore Baehre and along the northerly side of Herbert Avenue from Pine Ridge Road to Olcott Place and along the easterly side of Olcott Place from the northerly side of Herbert Avenue to the southerly line of Vera Avenue for its whole length in the Town of Cheektowaga, and

Whereas there is due and owing on account of said improvement \$2519.24 for work actually done and material actually supplied in and about the said improvement: - and

Whereas this Board has no available funds with which to pay the same and which claims have been duly audited and it is necessary to borrow the same and which claims have been duly audited and it is necessary to borrow the same temporarily pending the levy and collection thereof by assessment levied upon and collected from the property benefited thereby, now therefore be it

Resolved that the sum of \$2519.24 and such interest as shall accrue thereon be borrowed temporarily on the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo for the purpose of paying the cost of said improvement and that the certificate or certificates of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga for the aggregate sum of \$2519.24 Dollars dated as of the first day of November 1923 payable on demand to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo at its Broadway Branch office in the City of Buffalo New York with interest at the rate of six (6%) per centum per annum be executed and delivered to the said bank for the aforesaid purpose, and be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor and the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute one or more certificates of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga for the aggregate sum of \$2519.24 Dollars upon the faith and credit of said town dated as of the 1st day of November 1923 under the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga which the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to impress thereon and providing for the payment on demand of said certificate or certificates with interest thereon at the rate of six (6%) per centum per annum and that the Supervisor be and he is hereby directed to deliver the said certificate or certificates to said for the aforesaid purpose, carried ayes 7 noes none

Special meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents held at the regular meeting Place, Members present Stiglmeier, Schiesel, Mueller, Rozan, Inda, Besser, Kaufman.

Meeting was called to order by Supervisor Stiglmeier for the purpose of extending a note for the extra 14 feet width of pavement in Pine Ridge Road.

Moved by Mueller seconded by Rozan that the following resolution be adopted.

Whereas the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore duly execute and deliver it promissory note dated the 20th day of July 1923 for the sum of eleven thousand one hundred (\$11,000.00) Dollars payable with interest at the rate of six (6%) per centum per annum ninety (90) days after its date to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo at its Broadway Branch banking house in the City of Buffalo New York: and

Whereas the Town of Cheektowaga has actually received the proceeds of said note and the same have been duly expended to pay the cost of constructing the extra width of pavement in and along Pine Ridge Road from Walden Avenue to Scajaquada Creek Road in the Town of Cheektowaga: and

Whereas said note has become due and remains wholly unpaid and the Town of Cheektowaga has no available funds with which to pay the same and it is necessary to renew said note for a further period of ninety (90) days pending the sale of bonds, now therefore be it

Resolved that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the sum of Eleven Thousand One Hundred (\$11,100.00) Dollars and such interest as shall accrue thereon from Liberty Bank of Buffalo for the purpose of paying the note of said town dated July 20th 1923 held by said bank, and be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and upon its faith and credit the promissory note of said town for the sum of Eleven Thousand One Hundred (\$11,100.00) Dollars to be dated as of the 18th day of October 1923 payable at the Liberty Bank of Buffalo at its Broadway Branch office in the City of Buffalo, New York ninety (90) days after the date thereof with interest at six (6%) per centum per annum which said note and affix the corporate seal of said town thereto, carried, ayes 7 noes none
