Meeting was called to order by Supervisor Stiglmeier at 8:15 P.M. for the purpose of having a hearing of residents relating to the communication from the Dept. of public works of the City of Buffalo in the matter of locating the Incineration plant in the Town of Cheektowaga. Mr. Stiglmeier read the communication from the Dept. of Public Works stating the inducement offered to the Town of Cheektowaga by the Commissioner of Public Works. The Chairman then requested all persons interested in the matter to be heard, the following persons were heard, Andrew Napieralski spoke in opposition Michael Andrzejewski and Frank Szymanski also spoke in opposition Attorney Brennan then explained about going into litigation in the matter. Whereas the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie did pursuant to Section 320-A of the highway Law heretofore designate for improvement as County Aid Town Highway No.24 a certain portion of Harlem Ave. In the Town of Cheektowaga. And:

Whereas a map of the system of highways to be thus improved was duly prepared and adopted by the County of Erie; and

Whereas plans and specifications for the improvement of said Harlem Ave. Duly prepared and adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie and proposals were duly invited and received for the improvement of said highway and a contract duly let therefore ; and

Whereas the proportions of the cost of said improvement to be paid by the County of Erie and by the Town of Cheektowaga respectively were duly determined by resolution by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie; and

Whereas the portion thereof to be paid by the Town of Cheektowaga was duly fixed and determined at the sum of \$39,850.00 now therefore be it

Resolved that all action heretofore taken by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie relating to the improvement of said Harlem Ave. be it the same is hereby ratified and confirmed. And be it further

Resolved that whereas the Town of Cheektowaga has no available funds with which to pay it's share of the cost of said improvement the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized empowered and directed to borrow for and in the name of and upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga the sum of \$39,850.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon which sum is hereby found and declared to be necessary to pay the lawful share of the Town of Cheektowaga in the cost of the aforesaid improvement. And be it further

Resolved that pending the levy and collection of said moneys by taxes levied upon and collected from the taxable property of the Town of Cheektowaga liable therefore bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga of the aggregate par value of \$39,850.00 be issued and sold upon the faith and credit of said Town of which bonds 39 shall be of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each and one shall be of the denomination of \$850.00 and which said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from 1 to 40 inclusively and shall be dated as of the 1st day of July 1924 and shall bear interest from their date at such rate payable Semi - annually on the 1st day of each January and July commencing on the 1st day of January 1925 as the successful bidder therefore shall specify in his bid not exceeding however, six (6%) per centum per annum of which bonds four (4) bonds of the aggregate par value of \$4,0000.00 in the sequence in which the said bonds shall be numbered shall become due and payable on each 1st day of July commencing on the 1st day of July 1925 until the 1st day of July 1934 at which time the balance of the principal sum remaining unpaid and accrued interest shall become due and payable. And be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to give public notice of the time and place of the sale of said bonds and to sell the same in the manner provided by statute and to petition the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie for and on behalf of this board for permission to borrow said money and to issue the aforesaid bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga for the purposes herein before recited. And be it further

Resolved that pending the issuance and sale of said bonds hereinbefore mentioned the Town of Cheektowaga borrow temporarily upon it's faith and credit the sum of \$39,850.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo so as to make the share of the Town of Cheektowaga in the cost of said improvement immediately available so that the work of said improvement may proceed without delay. And be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver for and on behalf of this Board the promising note of the Town of Cheektowaga under it's corporate seal dated as of the 15th day of May 1924 for the sum of \$39,850.00 payable to the order of Liberty Bank of Buffalo at it's Broadway Branch Office in the City of Buffalo, New York within ninety (90) days from it's date with interest at the of six (6%) per centum per annum which said note shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same and to impress thereon the corporate seal of Town of Cheektowaga. And be it further

Resolved that there shall annually be levied against and collected from the taxable property of the Town of Cheektowaga liable therefore a sum sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds as the same shall become due and payable. Carried. Ayes 7 - Noes 0.

Moved by Inda seconded by Besser that the following be adopted:

Whereas a sewer district known as Sewer Dist No.3 was heretofore duly organized erected and constituted by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga ; and

Whereas thereafter in accordance with the Statute in such case made and provided a written contract was duly entered into by the Town of Cheektowaga through it's Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents with Kimmins and Son Contractors for the construction of certain sewers in Clinton Street and other public highways in said sewer district. And;

Whereas the said Contractors did enter upon the performance of said contract; and
