Resolved that this board borrow upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga the sum of \$7,500.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon from The Bank of Lancaster of Lancaster New York upon the promissory note of said town to be issued upon it's faith and credit and be dated as of the 8th day of July 1924 and to be payable with interest at the rate of six (6%) per centum per annum within ninety (90) days after it's date to the order of said bank at it's banking house in the Village of Lancaster New York. And be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue and deliver said note to said bank in payment of the note of the Town of Cheektowaga dated the 9th day of April 1924 for the sum of \$7,500.00 Dollars: And be it further
