This Agreement

Made this 6th day of April 1925 by and between the City of Buffalo a municipal Corporation situate in the County of Erie and State of New York hereinafter designated the City as Party of the fist part and the Town of Cheektowaga a municipal Corporation situate in the aforesaid County and State hereinafter designated the Town as party of the second part, Witnessed:

Whereas the City is about to enter into a written contract for the purchase of certain premises in the Town of Cheektowaga to be used as a site upon which to construct and maintain a garbage disposal plant which premises are situate on the south side of William Street about 300 feet easterly of the easterly city line of said city and are commonly known as the Nehrbass site: and

Whereas the Town is agreeable to the location of a garbage disposal plant of a type to be approved as provided in paragraph 11 of this agreement on said site on certain terms and conditions which terms and conditions are of the essence of this agreement: and

Whereas the City and Town desire to definitely fix said terms and conditions in order to avoid any differences or litigation in the future

Now therefore, in consideration of the premises and the covenants herein contained it is agreed:

First That the City may purchase the premises in the Town of Cheektowaga known as the Nehrbass site situate on the south side of William Street about 300 feet east of the easterly city line of the City of Buffalo and erect thereon a plant of a type to be approved as provided in paragraph 11 of this agreement for the disposal of Garbage.

Second That said plant shall be modern sanitary and odorless

Third That the City shall convey garbage and refuse to said plant from the City of Buffalo in suitable water tight covered vehicles and will not cause any nuisance in the Town thereby.

Fourth That the City shall operate said plant in a proper careful and sanitary manner without causing a public or private nuisance.

Fifth That no one shall or may use said site nor any portion thereof for keeping swine or conducting a piggery.

Sixth That the rendering plant now upon said site shall be permanently discontinued and dismantled within six (6) months after the completion of the purchase by the City of said site and that no dead animal excepting such as may be found in ordinary garbage shall be kept or disposed of in any way upon said site from and after said date specified in this paragraph.

Seventh That the City shall accept for disposal without charge public garbage which shall have originated within any portion of the Town and shall be collected within the Town and delivered at the plant to be erected and maintained by the City hereunder.

Eight That the City shall permit the existing use of its sewers by the Town and Village of Sloan and shall also permit without charge a new connection to be made and maintained at or near the city line by the Town with the sewer in Jehle Street in the City.

Ninth That the City shall co-operate with the Town to secure the elimination of grade crossings by the Erie and Lehigh Valley Railroad Company's over William Street just east of the city line and shall co-operate with the Town in securing adequate transportation facilities in and along William Street in the City & Town.

Tenth That the City shall and does hereby release the said Town and the Village of Sloan from further payment of Sewer rental under existing contracts for the privilege of discharging the effluent from the sewer systems of said town and Village into the sewers of the City in the manner now permitted under said contracts from and after the date of the completion of the purchase by the City of said site.

Eleventh That before the permission to be granted to the City hereunder for the erection and maintenance of a disposal plant on the aforesaid site shall become operative or if any force whatever a true correct and complete set of the plans and specifications for the erection and maintenance of said plant showing in detail the method to be used in the operation of said plant duly certified by the Commissioner of Public Works shall be submitted to the Town for its examination and approval and if said plans and specifications or method shall be disapproved by said town or if said plans and specifications and method of operation shall not be submitted to said town by said City then this Agreement shall become and be null and void and not binding of the said town.

Twelfth That the Town shall do nothing to hinder the purchase of the aforesaid site nor the erection or maintenance under the conditions and restrictions herein expressed of a plant thereon of the type herein specified, to-wit a modern sanitary odorless plant by legal proceedings or otherwise.

And shall the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga be authorized and directed, for the purpose of making the aforesaid moneys available for the use in the purchase of said site and the erection of the proposed improvements thereon, to borrow the said sum of \$200,000.00 or so much thereof as said board shall determine to be necessary, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, by the issuance, sale and delivery of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga to be issued upon its faith and credit, to be dated as of the first day July 1925, to be numbered consecutively from one (1) to the highest number issued, which said bonds shall be of such denomination, or denominations as the said Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga shall determine, and shall bear interest from their date, payable semiannually, on each 1st day of January and July, at such lawful rate, not exceeding six (6%) per centum, per annum, as the successful bidder therefor shall specify in his bid, and which said bonds shall be payable at the Liberty Bank of Buffalo in the City of Buffalo, New York, or at such other place as shall be mutually agreed upon between the said board and the purchaser of said bonds, and which said bonds shall mature in the sequence in which they shall be numbered, so that one-seventeenth of the aggregate par value of said bonds shall become due and payable on the 1st day of July 1928, and a like proportion on each 1st day of July, thereafter, up to and including the 1st day of July, 1944.

And shall a sum sufficient to pay the interest and principal of said bonds, as the same shall become due and payable be levied and spread against the taxable property of the Town of Cheektowaga, each year, and be it further

Resolved, that the Town Clerk give due notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting by posting notice thereof and by publishing notice thereof in the Enterprise and Lancaster

Times, the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga and in the Buffalo Evening Times, the two newspapers published in the County of Erie having the largest circulation in the Town of Cheektowaga, and be it further

Resolved, that the Clerk be authorized and directed to procure the necessary ballots and other supplies for the purpose of conducting said special town meeting.

Standard Time 11 o'clock A.M. Daylight Saving Time until the setting of the Sun which occurred at 7:55 o'clock P.M. Standard Time or 8:55 P.M. Daylight Saving Time.

The meeting was presided over by George Mueller, Peter J. Inda, Henry Besser and Jerome F. Rozan, Justices of the Peace of the Town of Cheektowaga, Alois Schiesel, Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga was present and acted as Clerk of the meeting. Peter J. Inda, one of the Justices of the Peace of the Town of Cheektowaga was by the vote of the other Justices chosen as Chairman of the officers of said meeting, carried

The Town Clerk first read the notice of the meeting and his certificate of posting thereof and exhibited the proofs of Publication thereof in the Enterprise & Lancaster Times and Buffalo Evening Times and the statement and certificate of the Town officers of the Town of Cheektowaga after which Peter J. Inda one of the Justices of the Peace and Chairman of the meeting in the presence and hearing of the other Justices and of all electors present proclaimed the polls were open to receive ballots, the voting then proceeded.
