Whereas Buffalo Cemetery Association is seeking through Senate bill No 122 Introductory No 121 entitled and act to legalize ratify and confirm the acts of the Buffalo Cemetery Association and its Trustees and to legalize and extend its corporate rights and existence, to extend the area of its Cemetery lands and its powers and privileges in the Town of Cheektowaga in defiance of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie and of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga: and

Whereas said bill is vicious and if enacted into law will be detrimental to the public interest against sound public policy and a most flagrant violation of the principle of home rule, now therefore, be it

Resolved that the Legislature be urged to defeat said bill and that the Governor (Governor) of the State of New York be urged to Veto it if it shall be passed by the Legislature and be it further

Resolved that a certified copy of the resolution be sent to the Governor of the State of New York and to each of the Representatives from the County of Erie in the State Assembly, carried

Whereas said grade crossings have long been a menace to public safety and a great handicap to the development of said Town of Cheektowaga and Lancaster and have retarded their normal growth and the speedy elimination of said crossings at grade will substantially promote the interests of said towns and their Inhabitants particularly the interest of {of} the Town of Lancaster and its people who pass over these highly dangerous crossings traveling to an [and] from the City of Buffalo, and

Whereas the Town of Cheektowaga feels that the elimination of these grade crossings is of such great relative importance to the Town of Lancaster that said last mentioned town shall share equally with said Town of Cheektowaga in paying such portion if any of the cost of said improvement as shall be apportioned to and ordered paid by the Town of Cheektowaga and in paying any consequential damages that may be awarded as the result of said improvement: and

Whereas said Town of Cheektowaga unwilling to petition the Public Services Commission for an order eliminating said crossings at grade until the Town of Lancaster shall have executed and delivered an agreement to share equally with the Town of Cheektowaga in the cost of said improvement and in any damages that may be awarded as the result of said improvement and in any damages that may be awarded as the result of said improvement to any person or Corporation injuriously affected thereby: now, therefor, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants herein set forth the above named parties have and do hereby mutually agree as follows:

First The Town of Cheektowaga shall join with the County of Erie through its Board of Supervisors and with the Town of Lancaster in a petition to the Public Service Commission in and for the State of New York asking for an order separating the grade of Broadway from the grades of The Delaware Lackawanna and Western Railroad The New York and Lackawanna and Western Railway Erie Railroad The Lehigh Valley Railroad and the Lehigh Valley Railway and abolishing the present grade crossing by said railroads over said Williamsville Road and diverting the course of said Williamsville or Cayuga Street into Broadway substantially as shown on a map prepared by George C. Diehl County Superintendent of Highways of the County of Erie in accordance with such other plan as shall be finally adopted

Second The Town of Cheektowaga and the Town of Lancaster shall share equally in paying such portion if any of the cost of said improvement and any consequential damages resulting there-from as shall be apportioned to said town or either of them by the Public Service Commission or other competent tribunal or Commission it being intended hereby that the Town of Cheektowaga and the Town of Lancaster shall bear an equal portion of the cost of said improvement if any part of said cost shall be apportioned to the said towns or either of them and each of said towns shall likewise pay one-

half of any direct or consequential damages growing out of said improvements that may be awarded against said towns or against either of them.
