Meeting was called to order by the Supervisor for the purpose of having a hearing on the complaint of Peter J. Inda, Justice of the Peace against Frank Zalemski special Constable, also taking up the matter for the purchase of the Kuhn property for a Town House site after hearing the complainant, and the defendant it was moved by Inda seconded by Mueller that Frank Zalemski be and he is hereby suspended as a special Constable for a period of 30 days from this date ayes Stiglmeier, Schiesel, Inda, Mueller, Kaufman, noes Besser & Rozan carried

Whereas the duly qualified electors of the Town of Cheektowaga at a special meeting thereof duly and regularly called and held in said town on the 12th day of June 1925 did authorize and direct the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga to purchase as a town house site the premises hereinafter described for a sum not to exceed \$27,500.00 - and

Whereas the Town of Cheektowaga has no available funds with which to pay the purchase price of the aforesaid town house site now therefore be it

Lippert as a town house site for the sum of \$27,500.00 the following described premises to-wit: that portion of the Kuhn farm situate in the Town of Cheektowaga in the County of Erie and State of New York being part of Farm Lot Number Ten (10) in the (11) Township and Seventh (7) Range of the Holland Companys Survey bounded north by Broadway West by Union Road and south by the lands of the New York Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company and consisting of about twenty-seven and six tenths (27.6) acres and be it further

Resolved that the sum of \$27,500.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon be borrowed temporarily pending the issuance and sale of bonds to pay the purchase price of said premises, and be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute issue and deliver the promissory note of the Town of Cheektowaga to be dated as of the 13th day of July 1925 providing for the payment of the sum of \$27,500.00 together with the interest thereon at the rate of six (6) per centum per annum to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo at its Broadway Branch office in the City of Buffalo New York within ninety (90) days from the date of said note which said note shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga carried, adjourned

Section 1 No person or persons shall stand, be, or remain in, or upon any of the public streets, roads, highways, sidewalk bridges or public places in the Town of Cheektowaga in such manner as to obstruct the free and uninterrupted passing and re-passing of any person or persons nor shall any person idly sit stand or lounge upon, or in any public street, road, highway, sidewalk, bridge, or Public place in the Town of Cheektowaga, or sit, lounge, stand, or be upon any stoop area way or platform except with the consent of the owner, or occupant of the premises to which said stoop, area way or platform, is attached within the limits of the Town of Cheektowaga nor shall it be lawful for any person or persons except the occupant to idly sit stand or lounge upon any stoop area way sidewalk or platform attached to or before any store dwelling house or other building after the owner or occupant of said store or building shall have closed said store or building or retired for the night in said dwelling nor shall it be lawful for any person or persons to idly sit stand or lounge at the entrance to or in any hallway passage or Vestibule or any Church hall theatre of public place, any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this section shall remove when ever requested by any officer or member of the police force of the Town of Cheektowaga and any person who shall stand or be, or remain violating any of the provisions of the section shall incur a, penalty of not more than \$25.00 for each offense carried ayes 6 noes none

Whereas Zenos H. Hill has petitioned this Board for its consent to the granting of a certificate of convenience and necessity by the Public Service Commission 2nd District of the State of New York authorizing him or his assigns to establish and operate a Bus line carrying Passengers for hire from the City of Buffalo, County of Erie, New York to the Village of North Java County of Wyoming, New York, the route of said bus line to run on and over the public Highway known as Broadway through the said Town of Cheektowaga and a public hearing having been had on said petition pursuant to a notice thereof duly published as required by law it is therefore

Resolved that the consent of {of} this board be and the same hereby is given to the granting of a certificate of convenience and necessity by the Public Service Commission of the State of New York to Zenos H. Hill or his assigns to establish and operate a bus line for the carrying of passengers for hire between the City of Buffalo, County of Erie New York and the Village of North Java Wyoming County New York, the route of said bus line to run on and over the Public Highway known as Broadway through sid {said} Town of Cheektowaga . This consent is upon the following condition

No 1 That the said Zenos H. Hill and his assigns shall comply with all the provision of the Transportation Law and the Highway Law and General Highway Traffic Law of the State of New York

No 2 That neither said Zenos H. Hill nor his assigns shall operate any bus or other vehicle by means of the trackless Trolley system so-called

No 3 That the said Zenos H. Hill and his assigns shall at all times charge reasonable rates of fare for any services rendered which shall not exceed the shedule {schedule} heretofore filed by it in the office of the Town Clerk of Cheektowaga.

No 4 That Children twelve years of age or under shall be entitled to be carried at one half the regular fare for adult passengers.

No 5 That if during the term of this permit any other public transportation system of the Town of Cheektowaga shall have in the judgment of the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga ceased to operate either temporarily or permanently said Supervisor may declare a Transportation Emergency to exit and may issue a temporary permit for a term of fifteen days to said Zenos H Hill or his assigns shall carry and discharge passengers at any point along its route through the Town of Cheektowaga at a schedule of fares which shall not exceed those hereinbefore specified, such temporary permit {permit} shall not be extended beyond such initial period of fifteen days from the date of which the same shall have been issued by such Supervisor without the formal order of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga .

No 6 That the conditions and limitations herein recited are imposed subject to their approval or modification by the Public Service Commission

No 7 That before this permission shall become operative, or of effect in any degree or manner said Zenos H. Hill shall file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga his written acceptance of the same and of the conditions upon which it is granted

No 8 That the permission hereby granted shall be subject to modification or cancellation by the further Orders of this Board or of its successors.
