Whereas this board has let contracts for the erection of a Town House for the Town of Cheektowaga and the work of erecting the same under said contracts has already begun and it is necessary to immediately provide available funds to meet the contracted obligations of the Town of Cheektowaga and for that purpose to borrow the said funds temporarily pending the issuance and sale of bonds of said town; now, therefore be it

Resolved that the sum of \$50,000.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon be borrowed from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga pending the issuance and sale of bonds and that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the promissory note of the Town of Cheektowaga to be dated as of the

6th day of October, 1925, and to provide for the payment of the sum of \$50,000.00 to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo at its Broadway Branch Banking House in the City of Buffalo New York with interest at six (6%) per centum per annum within 90 days from the date thereof and which said note shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga, carried ayes 6 - noes - none.

Moved by Besser seconded by Mueller that the Supervisor be authorized and directed to transfer the sum of \$6000.00 Dollars from the General Fund to the Highway Fund Bridge account to pay all claims for the construction of the bridge over Slate Bottom Creek in Union Road, carried

Moved by Inda seconded by Besser that the Supervisor be authorized and directed to prepare an assessment roll for sidewalks constructed in Clinton Street and Ashman Tract for the year 1925, carried

Moved by Inda seconded by Mueller that the Supervisor be directed to investigate the Street Lighting at Broadway & Ludwig Avenue and report to this Board at the next regular meeting, carried.

Whereas this Board did heretofore pursuant to the authority duly given by the duly qualified electors of the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the sum of \$27,500.00 to pay the cost of acquiring a town house site and for that purpose did duly execute issue and deliver a promissory note of the Town of Cheektowaga dated the 13th day of July 1925 payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo within 90 days from the date thereof: and

Whereas said note became due and payable on the 13th day of October 1925 and it is necessary to renew the same pending the issuance and sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, now, therefore be it

Resolved that the sum of \$27,500.00 be Borrowed from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo for a term of 90 days from the 13th day of October 1925 for the aforesaid purpose, and be it further

Resolved that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized to execute issue and deliver the promissory note of the Town of Cheektowaga to be dated as of the 13th day of October 1925 providing for the payment of the sum of \$27,500.00 together with the interest thereon at the rate of six (6%) per centum per annum to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo at its Broadway Branch Banking House in the City of Buffalo New York within 90 days from the date of said note which said note shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga, carried, ayes 7 - noes - none
