Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga, duly and regularly called and held at the Town Hall, in said town, at 3 o'clock p.m., on the 14th day of January 1926. Present - John C. Stiglmeier, Supervisor Alois Schiesel, Town Clerk, Peter J. Inda, Benjamin N. Milne and Jacob R. Pawlak Justice of the Peace. Absent - Henry Besser, Justice of the Peace John P. Kaufman, Town Superintendent of Highways.

A majority of the board and a quorum for the transaction of business were present.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor John C. Stiglmeier who presided at said meeting.

The chairman stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of receiving and considering offers for the bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga advertised to be sold at this time and place.

The Clerk then read the notice of sale of bonds, as follows:

Soft Drink Ordinance

Take notice of the adoption of this ordinance for the sale of Beverages in the Town of Cheektowaga.

Whereas, the public peace, morals, health and safety, require the regulation of the sales of non-intoxicating beverages in the Town of Cheektowaga, Now, therefore be it

Resolved, that the following ordinances relating thereto adopted, promulgated and enforced and that the same be known as Ordinances Regulating the Sale of Non-Intoxicating Liquors and Beverages in the Town of Cheektowaga

Section 1 **Definitions** Town Board, as used hereinafter means the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga. A refreshment business for the purpose of this ordinance, is defined as a business conducted, or proposed to be conducted for the sale or offering for sale, at retail for consumption on the premises sold, either as a separate business or in connection with any other business of any malt, or vinous beverage, cider or any soft drink (excepting tea, coffee, milk, chocolate or cocoa) any carbonated beverage or any other beverage or liquor produced by the process by which beer, ale, porter or wine is produced none of said beverages or drink containing a greater portion of alcohol than is permitted by law. The words 'person' and 'applicants' as used in this ordinance shall include an individual, society, club, firm partnership, corporation or association of persons, the singular number shall include the plural number and the masculine shall include the female gender.

Section 2. **License.** No person shall establish, maintain or conduct a refreshment business, as herein defined, without first having procured from the Town Board a license for that purpose. Every person, before establishing, maintaining, or conducting, any refreshment business, as herein defined shall, before being so licensed, pay to the Supervisor the sum of \$5.00 for each year or fraction thereof for any period of less than a year, for each stand, place room, or enclosure or for each suite of rooms or enclosures, which are in direct connection with, or are contiguous to each other. Rooms places or enclosures not contiguous or directly connected with one another shall be deemed separate place of business and shall require a separate license. The Sale or offering for sale on special occasions of any beverage or soft drink mentioned in "Section 1" of this ordinance shall be deemed a refreshment business, for which, a permit must be procured from the Town Board, which permit shall be signed by the Supervisor upon the payment of a fee of \$3.00 for each such special occasion and the production of evidence that such permit may be granted without detriment to the public peace, morals, health or safety. All licenses provided for in this ordinance shall be invalid, unless signed by the Supervisor and shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year.

Section 3. **Application for Licenses.** Any person desiring to establish maintain or conduct a refreshment business as herein defined, shall make application to the Town Board, in writing for a license, upon blanks prepared and furnished by the Supervisor and shall file such application with the Supervisor. Each such application shall contain the name and residence of each applicant if any individual, firm, or partnership, or the names of at least three of the principal officers and their residences, if the applicant be a society, club corporation or association of persons. Such application shall further state the following:

- (a) The length of time such applicant or applicants, if an individual, firm or partnership or the officers thereof if the applicant be a society, club, corporation or association of persons, has, or have resided in the Town of Cheektowaga, his or their place or places, of previous employment; whether married or single, whether he or any of them has been convicted of a crime, or of the violation of an ordinance of the Town of Cheektowaga, and, if so of what offense, when and in what court.
- (b) The premises where such refreshment business is to be conducted or maintained, giving street and numbers, or other definite location.
- (c) Whether such business is to be carried on in connection with any other kind of business, and if so, what other business.
- (d) Whether the applicant has, either alone or with someone else previously engaged as owner or employee, in conducting a saloon, cafe, club or other business of similar nature where intoxicating liquors were sold; and if so when where and for how long.
- (e) The name of the owner of the premises in which such refreshment business is to be located together with his residence address.
- (f) The floor on which such refreshment business is to be located and whether any partition, or obstruction, separates or divides, the rooms therein or in any way prevents a clear view thereof from the street, if such rooms front or abut on a street, otherwise from the entrance thereto.
- (g) Such other information as the Town Board may, from time to time require.
- (h) The application shall be signed and sworn to before a notary public, or other officer authorized to administer oaths in the County of Erie. If the applicant has a seal it shall also be impressed or affixed upon the application.

Section 4 **Investigation** Upon receipt of any such application, the Supervisor shall cause investigation to be made concerning the statements contained in such application, the character and

reputation of the applicant, or applicants, the cleanliness and sanitary condition of the premises, the arrangement of rooms where such drinks or beverages are to be sold, or consumed, the equipment and method to be used, with a view to the preservation of public peace, morals, health and safety. For the purpose of such investigation, the Town Board shall designate a Constable or Special Constable who shall, during the pleasure of the Town Board, be in charge of making said investigations or any other inspection required by the Supervisor, and it shall be the duty of the Chief Constable to assign an additional constable, or special constable to assist such Constable or special Constable assigned as aforesaid, to make the investigations and inspections herein mentioned if requested so to do by the Supervisor.

Section 5 Granting or Refusing License Upon the completion of such investigation of the applicant and of the statements made in his application, referred to in the last above section, the Supervisor shall promptly transmit such application, together with the report of the investigation made thereon, to the Town Board. And the said Town Board shall consider and act upon such application at the meeting of said board at which the same shall be presented by the Supervisor, or at the next meeting of said board, thereafter. The Supervisor may, subject to the approval of the Town Board, grant a temporary permit to any applicant, if in his judgment, the public peace, morals, health or safety, will not be endangered thereby, which temporary permit shall be in effect until the application of such applicant shall have been acted upon by the Town Board and notice of the action of such board shall have been given to such applicant as hereinafter provided in "Section 16" of this ordinance.

Section 6 Transfer of Licenses No licenses shall be transferred from one place to another. A license may be transferred from one place to another upon the approval, in writing, by the Supervisor, after being authorized to consent there to by the Town Board.

Section 7 License to be Posted. Every license issued in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance shall be immediately posted by the license and, while in force shall be kept posted in a conspicuous place in the room, or place on the premises where such business is authorized to be carried on.

Section 8 Closing Hours. Except under special permit, granted as herein provided, it shall be unlawful to keep open to the public, or to conduct a refreshment business as herein defined on any day between the hours of 12 o'clock midnight and 6 o'clock A.M. The special permits mentioned in this section may be issued by the Supervisor, subject to the approval of the Town Board, for the unexpired license term under such circumstances and conditions as shall not be detrimental to the public health, safety, good order or morals. The fee for each special permit mentioned in this section shall be at the rate of \$1.00 per month.

Section 9 Not to Harbor Intoxicated Persons or permit Immoral Conduct. It shall be unlawful for any person owning, conducting or in charge of any refreshment business, as defined in this ordinance to harbor intoxicated persons on the premises or to permit the drinking of intoxicating beverages therein, or to allow intoxicated persons to resort thereto: to permit any disorderly, indecent, immoral, or unlawful conduct on, or in such premises or to have, or to allow, on the premises where a refreshment business is carried on any slot machine or gambling device, of any kind.

Section 10 Liquor on Premises Prohibited. No person to whom a license is granted under the provisions of this ordinance shall receive, possess, give away or sell, have or permit, upon the licensed premises, any liquor or beverage, which contains alcohol in excess of the amount permitted by law. This section shall not apply to any drug store or pharmacy conducted in good faith, wherein a pharmacist, duly registered under the laws of the State of New York, is in actual and personal charge.

Section 11 Premises to be kept Sanitary. It shall be the duty of every person conducting a refreshment business, as herein defined, at all times to keep the premises where such refreshment business is conducted, in a clean and sanitary condition. All persons employed or working in such premises shall be clean and cleanly clothed and free from communicable disease. Each and every utensil, appliance, vessel receptacle, refrigerator place or thing whatsoever which is used for the purpose of serving or storing, must at all times be kept in a clean wholesome and sanitary condition. An adequate supply of hot and cold water for cleaning purposes shall be provided, and all glasses, dishes and spoons shall be sterilized in boiling water or live steam. Sterile dishes, cups and spoons made of paper, wood or any other suitable material and handled in a sanitary manner for one service only may be used. All glasses, dishes and straws, used, must be reasonably protected from dust and flies.

Section 12 Inspection. The Health Officer of the Town of Cheektowaga is hereby authorized and required from time to time to inspect and examine or cause to be inspected or examined, each place in the Town of Cheektowaga where a refreshment business, as herein defined, is conducted, and the premises in or upon which such business is conducted for the purpose of ascertaining whether all of the ordinances of the said town and the laws of the State of New York relative to conducting such business are being complied with in such premises. Such an inspection and examination may be made at any time when the place inspected shall be open for business, or in operation. It shall be the duty of

each and every person conducting a refreshment business as herein defined, and his, or its, representatives or employees to assist the said Health Officer and his inspectors, or employees in the making of such inspection, and, when required to furnish samples, as hereinafter provided of any beverage whatsoever, which is kept, or offered, for sale, which samples shall be examined, or analyzed, by or under the direction of, such Health Officer, and the record of such examination, or analysis, shall be kept on file in his office. It shall be the duty of the constable or Special constable, designated by the Town Board, in charge of investigation under this ordinance and he is hereby authorized and empowered, from time to time, to inspect and examine or cause to be inspected and examined, all premises where a refreshment business, as herein defined, is conducted, for the purpose of ascertaining the general reputation and character of the place and of the persons who habitually frequent such places, the nature and kind of entertainment, if any, given or offered at such places; and whether such place is conducted in a lawful quiet and orderly manner. Such inspection and examination may be made at any time when the place inspected is open for business, or in operation.

No sample, however, of any beverage kept or offered for sale as a part of any refreshment business shall be required by any person pursuant to this ordinance, except by the Health Officer, or the constable, or special constable designated by the Town Board in charge of investigations under this ordinance to demand and take such samples in the interest of the public health: or by a member of the police force having in his possession and exhibiting written authority, signed by the constable or special constable, designated by the Town Board to make investigation under this ordinance, to take such sample, or samples, in the interest of public peace, morals, health and safety. No such written authority shall be signed by the Health Officer, except upon information affording him reasonable grounds for belief that a beverage is being sold, or offered for sale, at the place designated by him in such order, which is adulterated, or impure, and detrimental to health; and no such written authority shall be signed by the constable or special constable, designed by the Town Board in charge of investigations under this ordinance, except upon information affording reasonable ground for belief, that a beverage is being sold, or offered for sale at the place designated in such order, the sale of which is prohibited by law. No such written authority signed by the Health Officer, constable or Special Constable, designated by the Town Board in charge of investigations under this ordinance shall be valid without the approval of the Supervisor endorsed thereon.

When an person, duly authorized, as above stated, shall in the discharge of his duties, take samples of any such beverage, he shall cause said beverage to be thoroughly stirred or mixed before the sample shall be taken. The person taking the sample for analysis shall take duplicate samples in the presence of at least one witness, and he shall, in the presence of such witness, seal both of such samples and shall tender, and if accepted, deliver at the time of taking, one sample to the proprietor, or person in charge of the place where the same is taken. If demanded, the person taking the same shall pay therefor the retail price of the quantity of the beverage taken.

Section 13 Revocation may be Recommended. The Health Officer, or constables or special constable, designated by the Town Board, in charge of investigations under this ordinance may at any time, in writing, recommend the revocation of any license issued pursuant to this ordinance, stating the grounds upon which such recommendation is made, and the Town Board may revoke such license by Notice in writing whenever it shall appear to its satisfaction, from the recommendation of the Health Officer, constable or special constable, designated by the Town Board in charge of investigations under this ordinance, or otherwise, that such license has violated any of the provisions of this, or any other, ordinance of the Town of Cheektowaga or of the laws of the State of New York. The Health Officer and all other officers who are charged with the enforcement of this ordinance, shall, at all times, when such premises shall be open for business, or in operation have access to any part of the premises occupied for the conduct of a refreshment business, and shall be allowed to take samples of any liquors, or beverages, found upon said premise; and refusal by any person conducting such business, or in charge thereof, or by his agent, or employee, to permit the examination of such premises or the taking of any samples, shall be a violation of this ordinance and shall be sufficient reason for the revocation of the license.

Section 14 Hearing on Complaint. Whenever the Town Board upon complaint or recommendation, or on its own motion, believes that sufficient cause therefor exists, it shall cause to be served upon any license, or person, conducting a refreshment business, as herein defined, a notice specifying the grounds for complaint, and fixing a time and place at which the Town Board will hear and determine the charges made, which shall not be less than three days from the date of service of such notice, at which time and place the person against whom the charges are filed shall have an opportunity to be heard and to make his defense against such charges. After such hearing, the Town Board may dismiss the complaint against the holder of the license in question, or may suspend or revoke, the license held by him.

Section 15 Revocation or suspension of License The license of any licensee who shall be convicted of a crime, or of a violation of any provision of this ordinance, shall by virtue of such conviction be canceled and forfeited without further or other, proceedings to cancel or forfeit the same, anything in 'Section 14' of this ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.

Section 16 Notices Any notice provided for in this ordinance shall be served either by delivering a copy thereof personally to the licensee, or by leaving a copy with some person of suitable age and discretion at the place of business of the licensee and actually, or apparently, in charge thereof or if no such person can be found at the place of business of the licensee, by posting such notice in a conspicuous place on the premises and mailing a copy thereof to the licensee at his place of business, as set forth in his, or their application for a license.

Section 17 Whenever a license shall have been revoked, no other license shall be issued to the same license within one year from date of such revocation.

Section 18 Penalties - Any person who by himself, or itself, or by his or its clerk agent or employee, shall conduct a refreshment business without the license required by this ordinance, or shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance or who, having had his or its license suspended, or revoked, shall continue to conduct such refreshment business during the prohibited time, shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine, or penalty of not more than fifty dollars and in addition may have his license, if then in force, suspended, or revoked, by the Town Board. Any person convicted of a violation of any provision of these ordinances who shall fail to pay any fine, or penalty, imposed upon him for such violation, may be committed to the Jail of Erie County for a term not exceeding one day for each and every dollar of said fine, or penalty, so imposed for each violation until the same shall be paid. Each day on which such violation continues will constitute a separate offense.

Section 19 The constable or special constable, designated by the Town Board in charge of investigations under this ordinance, shall be entitled to 40 per cent of all money paid to the Supervisor for licenses and special permits under this ordinance, as compensation for such service as shall be rendered by such constable, or special constable, under these ordinances.
