Moved by Inda, seconded by Pawlak that the Soft Drink permit of Dorothy Gorney be granted, carried

Moved by Milne seconded by Kaufman that the Town Engineer be directed to make up a General scheme for a subway to carry Union Road under the main line under the New York Central Railroad Company's tracks and with an estimate of the cost, carried

Moved by Milne seconded by Pawlak that the Town Clerk be directed to notify Western New York Water Company to extend its water mains in Ludwig Avenue about 500 feet south from Broadway and install one Hydrant thereon, carried.

Moved by Milne seconded by Kaufman that the Supervisor be directed to have the necessary lamps installed in Harlem Avenue north from Genesee St. carried

Moved by Schiesel seconded by Kaufman that the following be adopted:

Whereas, the Board of Supervisor of the County of Erie has authorized the construction and improvement of what is known as Old Kensington County Aid-Town Highway Number 141, in the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York in accordance with plans and specifications prepared by George C. Diehl, County Engineer, and approved by said Board of Supervisor, at an estimated total cost of \$132,000.00: and

Whereas, the low bidder for the improvement of said highway was The Harrison Engineering & Construction Corporation, the amount of its bid being \$129,279.50 and the estimated cost of inspection being \$2,720.50 making a total of \$132,000.00, of which the County of Erie pays \$66,000.00 and the Town of Cheektowaga, \$66,000.00; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the Town of Cheektowaga deposit its share of the cost of said improvement, to-wit: \$66,000.00 with the County Treasurer of the County of Erie prior to the execution and delivery of a contract between the County of Erie and the Harrison Engineering & Construction Corporation for said work: and

Whereas the Town of Cheektowaga has no available funds out of which to pay its share of the cost of said improvement, and it is necessary to borrow the said sum, temporarily pending the issuance and sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga; now therefore be it:

Resolved that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the said sum of \$66,000.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo and that the Supervisor and Town Clerk, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute, issue and deliver, for an on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and under its corporate seal, a certificate of indebtedness of said town, to be dated as of the 28th day of September 1926, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, with interest at the rate of six (6%) per centum per annum within 90 days from the date thereof, carried. Ayes 7, noes none.

Moved by Inda seconded by Milne that this meeting adjourn, carried

It was moved by Inda, seconded by Milne that the following be adopted:

Whereas a written petition, duly signed and acknowledged by the owners of the real estate fronting or bounding on both sides of Alexander Street, from Walden Avenue to Straley Street, to the extent of at least one-half of the entire frontage, or bounds, on both sides of said portion of said

Alexander Street and also duly signed and acknowledged by the resident owners of the premises fronting or bounding, on both sides of the aforesaid portion of Alexander Street, representing not less than one-half of the frontage owned by resident owners residing in and along said portion of said Alexander Street, covered, represented and referred to in said petition asking this board to cause said portion of said Alexander Street between Walden Avenue and Straley Street, to be paved with concrete for a width inside curbs, of 26 feet, with suitable curbing and that the expense of constructing and maintaining said pavement shall be assessed against the property fronting or bounding, on said portion of said highway; and

Whereas, the estimated expense of said pavement will be approximately \$29,600.00; now therefore be it:

Minutes of an adjourned meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga duly and regularly called and held at the Town Hall, in said town, on the 24th day of September, 1926, at 1 o'clock P.M. Standard Time, or 2 o'clock P.M. Daylight Saving Time. Present - Alois Schiesel, Town Clerk, Peter J. Inda, Henry Besser, Jacob R. Pawlak, Benjamin P. Milne, Justices of the Peace, and John P. Kaufman, Town Superintendent of Highways. Absent - John C. Stiglmeier, Supervisor.

The meeting was called to order by the Town Clerk and a quorum was present.

It was moved by Mr. Besser, seconded by Mr. Milne, that Peter J. Inda act as chairman of the meeting in the absence of the Supervisor, carried, ayes six, noes none.

Mr. Inda took the chair and presided for the balance of the meeting.

The Town Clerk then read the notice of hearing on the petition dated July 31st, 1926 asking this Board to cause Cleveland Drive formerly known as Zumstein Road and Old Kensington Avenue, from the easterly city line of Buffalo to Harlem Avenue, in the Town of Cheektowaga, to be improved by the construction of extra width of reinforced pavement in addition to the reinforced concrete pavement to be laid therein under a contract awarded to The Harrison Engineering & Construction Corporation by the County of Erie, and submitted proof of publication of said notice of said hearing in The Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News, the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga and the Town Clerk's certificate of posting said notice of hearing, as required by statute.

It was moved by Mr. Milne, seconded by Mr. Besser, that the proof of publication and of posting be placed on file in the office of the Town Clerk, carried, ayes six, Noes None.

The Chairman then invited any one who wished to be heard on the subject matter of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, to speak.

After considerable discussion by the owners of property in and along a portion of said Cleveland Drive, referred to in said petition all present stated that they were in favor of the construction

of 9 additional feet of reinforced concrete pavement, including curbing on each side of the 18 feet of concrete pavement to be laid pursuant to the contract between, the County of Erie and The Harrison Engineering & Construction Corporation, as a County Aid-Town Highway.

It was moved by Mr. Besser seconded by Mr. Milne, that the following preambles and resolutions be adopted:

Whereas, a written petition dated the 31st day of July, 1926, duly executed as provided by statute, asking the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga to cause additional reinforced concrete pavement with curbing, to be laid in and along that portion of Cleveland Drive formerly known as Zumstein Road and Old Kensington Avenue, from the easterly boundary line of the City of Buffalo to Harlem Avenue, in the Town of Cheektowaga and that the expense of said improvement be assessed against and collected from the real estate bounding upon that portion of said Cleveland Drive in front of which such additional pavement shall be laid: and

Whereas, this Board, did on the 3rd day of September 1926, duly adopt an order, reciting the receipt and filing of said petition and the estimated expense of said improvement and did order that a hearing be held on the subject matter of said petition at the Town Hall in the Town of Cheektowaga, on the 24th day of September, 1926, at 1 o'clock P.M. Standard Time or 2 o'clock P.M. Daylight Saving Time and did order the Town Clerk to order a certified copy of said resolution to be published in the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga and to be posted in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided; and

Whereas, the said order was duly published and posted in accordance with the terms of the statute of said order; now, therefore, be it.

Resolved, that the prayer of said petition be granted, and that the Town Engineer be, and he is hereby directed to prepare detailed plans and specifications for the construction of a strip of reinforced concrete pavement 9 feet in width including curbing to be laid in and along Cleveland Drive formerly known as Zumstein Road and Old Kensington Avenue, from the easterly city line of Buffalo to Harlem Avenue, in the Town of Cheektowaga, along each side of the 18 feet of reinforced concrete pavement to be laid in said portion of said highway under the contract between the County of Erie and The Harrison Engineering & Construction Corporation for the improvement of said Cleveland Drive as "Old Kensington County Aid-Town Highway Number 141" and that the said Town Engineer prepare a careful estimate of the cost of such additional pavement and with the assistance of the attorney for this Board, a proposed contract covering the aforesaid work and that he submit the same to this Board for approval, at a meeting thereof to be held at 2 o'clock P.M. on the 4th day of October 1926, at the Town Hall in the Town of Cheektowaga.
