WHEREAS, the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore enter into written contracts for the following named local improvements, to-wit: for the construction of extra width of reinforced concrete pavement, with curbs, adjacent to the pavement laid under a contract between the Harrison Engineering & Construction Corporation and the County of Erie, from the easterly city line of Buffalo to the Beach Road, in the Town of Cheektowaga, and the improvement of Ivanhoe Road, Marne Road, Rowan Road, a portion of Genesee St., Normandy Avenue, Rowland Road, Winkler Road, Loxley Road, Peach Tree Road, Kaufman Road, Haller Street, Hedwig Street, Hoerner Street, Wooddell Avenue and Gualbert Street, in said town, and did issue certificates of indebtedness to finance said improvements in part, which certificates were as follows; A certificate dated the 11th day of October, 1927, for \$30,000.00, due on the 9th day of January, 1928, a certificate of indebtedness dated the 10th day of October, 1927, for \$50,000.00, due on the 9th day of January, 1928, and a certificate of indebtedness dated the 11th day of October, 1927, for \$24,000.00, due on the 9th day of January, 1928; and

WHEREAS, The said certificates of indebtedness were duly renewed by a resolution of this board and new certificates of indebtedness dated the 9th day January, 1928, payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo within 90 days from their date were duly executed and delivered for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga in renewal of the aforesaid certificates of indebtedness; and

WHEREAS, the said certificates of indebtedness will become due and payable on the 9th day of April, 1928, and it is necessary to renew the same for a period not exceeding 90 days, pending the collection of the proceeds of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga heretofore sold; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the said sum of \$165,000.00, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, from the

Liberty Bank of Buffalo, upon the faith and credit of said town, for a further period of not to exceed 90 days from the 9th day of April, 1928, and that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and under its corporate seal, 4 certificates of indebtedness of said town, each to be dated as of the 9th day of April, 1928, all payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from the said 9th day of April, 1928, and which said certificates shall bear interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, and that one of said certificates shall provide for the payment of the sum of \$30,000.00, with interest of aforesaid, the third for the payment of \$50,000.00, and interest as aforesaid, and the fourth for the payment of \$24,000.00, with interest as aforesaid, and to deliver the same, to the said Liberty Bank of Buffalo, in payment of the certificates of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, now held by said bank.

Moved by Mr. Milne, seconded by Mr. Inda that the following be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga is indebted to the City of Buffalo under contracts for sewer rentals at Walden Avenue, Cochran street and at Pine Hill, in the aggregate sum of \$6,287.90, dated the 25th day of September, 1907, and the 3rd day of August 1921, respectively, which contracts have been reinstated under the decision of the Supreme Court; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga has no available funds with which to pay said indebtedness, and it is necessary to borrow the same and such interest as shall accrue thereon, pending the levy and collection thereof by assessments upon the property liable therefore; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the sum of \$6,287.90, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, for the aforesaid purpose, and that the Supervisor and Town Clerk, be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, and under its corporate seal, a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, for the sum of \$6,287.90, to be dated as of the 4th day of April, 1928, and to be payable within one year from its date to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, with interest at the rate of six per centum per annum.

Meeting was called to order by John C. Stiglmeier, Supervisor, at 2 p. m. and the following business was transacted at said meeting:

Moved by Mr. Inda, seconded by Mr. Milne that the minutes of the previous regular and special meetings be approved as published in the official paper. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Inda, seconded by Mr. Milne that the communication from the Department of Public Service, State Division Public Service Commission, in the matter of elimination of Crossings at grade of the railroads operated by the Lehigh Valley Railroad Co., the Erie Railroad Company and the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad Company and Union Road in the Town of Cheektowaga, be received and filed and the Supervisor and Town Attorney be directed to attend the hearing to be held on the 26th day of April, 1928. Carried. Ayes 7; Noes 0.

Moved by Mr. Inda, seconded by Mr. Walter that the petition from the Buffalo Interurban Bus Lines Inc., asking this Board to consent to operate a bus line in and through the following highways: French Road, Union Road, Lawson Road to the New York Central Railroad shops be laid on the table. RESOLVED, that this Board find and determine that the real property liable for the cost of construction of the said proposed improvement is of sufficient value to pay the cost thereof, and, that the said petition be granted by this Board. And be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Engineer be and he is hereby directed to prepare detailed plans and specifications for the construction of said improvement, a careful estimate of the expense thereof, and with the assistance of the attorney for this Board, a proposed form of contract covering the work to be done, and to submit the same to this Board for its approval at a meeting thereof to be held at the Town Hall in the Town of Cheektowaga on the 7th day of May, 1928, at 1.00 o'clock P. M. Eastern Standard Time, or 2.00 o'clock P. M., Daylight Saving Time.

Carried. Ayes 7, Noes 0.

It was moved by Justice Inda, seconded by Justice Milne, that consideration of the plans, specifications, estimates and proposed forms of contracts covering local improvements that the Town Engineer was directed to submit to this Board for its consideration and approval today, be deferred until the meeting of this Board to be held on the 7th day of May, 1928.

It was moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Justice Pawlak, that the claim of William Brennan, Jr. for legal services and disbursements relating to public improvements and bond issues in the sum of \$10,123.94 be audited and paid and that the Town Clerk be directed to draw an order on the Supervisor for the amount thereof. Carried. Ayes 7, Noes 0.

The Board then took up the consideration of the salaries to be paid to the various officers and employees of the Town of Cheektowaga to take effect May 1st, 1928.

Gentlemen:

From a statement made by the official newspaper, it appears that your honorable Board intends to determine, on the 30th day of April, 1928 the compensation to be paid to the various officers and employees of the Town of Cheektowaga, to take effect from May 1st, 1928.

Before you determine the compensation to be paid to the Town Attorney, I beg to respectfully call your attention to certain facts.

The Town of Cheektowaga has, during the past year, undertaken about one-third as many public projects and local improvements as have been undertaken by the City of Buffalo.

The volume of legal work involved in these public projects has been very great, but the cost of said legal work has been comparatively small.

The salaries alone in the main Legal Department of the City of Buffalo amount to \$106,620.00, per year. In addition to this, \$18,700.00 is allowed that office for expenses. This expense account does not include the rental of the offices in the Crosby Building, occupied by the Legal Department of Buffalo. In addition to the above amount, the City of Buffalo pays a salary of \$7,000.00 per year, to the attorney for the Grade Crossing and Terminal Station Commission and allows the additional sum of \$2500.00 for legal and court expenses, to that commission. The City of Buffalo also pays a salary of \$2280.00 to a lawyer for the Department of Health and furnishes him with free stenographic service. The aggregate expenses of the Legal Department of the City of Buffalo, not including rentals paid, amounts to over \$137,000.00 per year.

The attorney for the Town of Cheektowaga has to furnish his own paper and other supplies, office equipment, library and stenographic work, which expenses amounts to a very considerable sum in the course of a year.

The office of Town Attorney for the Town of Cheektowaga requires fidelity, much study and constant attention. The Town Attorney is responsible for forms of franchises and contracts of vital interest to the taxpayers and residents of the Town of Cheektowaga, not only of the present but of the future. The corporations who deal with the Town are represented by the best legal talent available and the Town of Cheektowaga should be represented by a lawyer of experience and training in municipal law.

In the past, the expense for legal services has been considered as part of each project and amounted to approximately 1 per cent of the cost of the improvement. An architect is paid 6 per cent of the cost of a project, an engineer from 4½ to 6 per cent, and the duties of the legal advisor of a municipality are equally as important as those of an architect or engineer and require at least as much technical training and involve as much work. I have had as many as three assistants working on the legal matters of the Town of Cheektowaga during the past year, all of whom were paid by me personally.

If the Legal Department of the City of Buffalo costs, without rentals of offices, the sum of \$137,000.00, per year, it is plain

that \$15,000.00, per year, would be a relatively small sum for the Town of Cheektowaga to pay for the maintenance of its Legal Department, in view of the increasing volume of legal work of the highest importance to be done, each year.

The compensation of the Town Attorney shall be at the rate of \$8500.00 per year.

The salary of each of two Justices of the Peace who shall serve between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m., shall be at the rate of \$3600.00 per year.

The salary of the chairman of the Board of Assessors shall be at the rate of \$2500.00 per year for which he shall also furnish and operate a vehicle to carry the board of assessors and the necessary books during field work by said assessors.

The salary of the other two assessors shall be at the rate of \$1800.00 per year, each.

The salary of the Town Engineer shall be at the rate of \$2400 per year: it being understood by this Board that additional engineering service must be employed as occasions may require on public projects.

The salary of the Health Officer shall be at the rate of \$1500 per year.

The salary of the Overseer of the Poor shall be at the rate of \$1200.00 per year.

The salary of the Chief Constable shall be at the rate of \$2200 per year.

The salary of the Lieut. Constable shall be at the rate of \$2000 per year.

The salary of nine patrolmen shall be at the rate of \$1800 each per year.

The salary of the Soft Drink Inspector shall be at the rate of \$1200.00 per year.
