ALL THOSE TRACTS OR PARCELS OF LAND, situate in the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie and State of New York, being part of Farm Lots Numbers 35 and 36, in Township 11, Range 7, of the Holland Land Company's Survey, bounded and described as follows:--

COMMENCING at the southwest corner of said Farm Lot Number 35, in the westerly boundary line of the Town of Cheektowaga; running thence northerly along the westerly boundary line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the northwesterly corner of lands marked "W. Hayes" on a map of the Town of Cheektowaga printed on page 14 of the New Century Atlas of Erie County, New York, dated 1909; running thence easterly along the northerly line of said lands so marked "W. Hayes", as aforesaid, to the northeasterly corner thereof; thence southerly along the easterly line of the aforesaid lands marked "W.Hayes," to the southwest corner of premises, marked on said atlas "G.F.ROOKE, Polish Cem.," which premises are now owned by United

German and French Roman Catholic Cemetery Association; thence easterly along the south bounds of the premises marked "G.F. Rooke," as aforesaid, to the center line of Pine Ridge Road; thence southerly along the center line of Pine Ridge Road, to the south line of Farm Lot Number 35, Township 11, Range 7, of the Holland Land Company's Survey; thence westerly, along the south line of said Farm Lot Number 35, to the westerly boundary line of the Town of Cheektowaga, at the point of place of beginning, be erected into and established as a sewer district, and that a sewerage system be constructed and maintained therein, in accordance with plans therefor, heretofore adopted by the Town Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga; and

WHEREAS, the estimated expense of construction and putting into operation the system proposed to be established will be approximately \$95,000; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this board meet at the Town Hall, in the Town of Cheektowaga, at Broadway and Union Road, in said town, on the 27th day of January, 1928, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, Standard time, for the purpose of considering the said petition and hearing all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same. And be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this board, be, and he is directed to give notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting in the manner prescribed by law, and that the first publication of said notice of said hearing shall be on the 12th day of January, 1928. Carried. Ayes 5, Noes-0.

Clemons, representing the Chamber of Commerce and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Depew.

Mr. Cutter stated that he had been informed by many others of the owners of the property through which the proposed boulevard would extend, that they were heartily in favor of the improvement and would develop their lands as soon as it were built.

Most of the speakers contended that several square miles of very desirable lands were held inactive because they were inaccessible and said that the proposed boulevard would open up these lands, and that rapid development and much wealth would come to Cheektowaga, as soon as the highway had been opened.

Petition of the New York Central Railroad Company, under section 91 Railroad Law, for an order determining that changes shall be made in the existing structure (highway bridge) carrying Broadway in the incorporated village of Depew, Erie County, over the Gardenville Branch of the New York Central Railroad Company. The New York Central Railroad Company having by petition filed January 6, 1927, alleged that public safety requires the reconstruction of the existing structure carrying Broadway (County Highway No. 916) over the Gardenville branch of the railroad in the Village of Depew, Erie County, and asked for a determination under section 91 of the Railroad Law directing the construction of a new bridge sufficient in strength to carry present day traffic; and hearings having been held, after due notice proof of which is of record, on March 1 and April 5, 1927, before C. R. Vanneman, Chief Engineer, specially authorized to conduct said hearings at which those named hereinbefore appeared; and the Commission after due consideration being of the opinion that the petition should be granted and the bridge reconstructed as prayed for, it is so determined and it is

Ordered: that the existing overhead crossing of Broadway (County Highway No. 916) and the railroad operated by The New York Central Railroad Company (Gardenville branch) located about one mile west of Depew station in the Village of Depew, Erie County, shall be reconstructed in a new location substantially in accordance with the plan filed at the hearing held on April 5, 1927, and marked "Exhibit No. 6" except as modified by the following general requirements:

- (a) The alignment of the center line of the changed portion of the highway shall be as follows; Beginning at a point located about 273 feet westerly from the center line of the railroad at the existing overgrade crossing; thence proceeding easterly on a tangent for a distance of about 630 feet and crossing the center line of the railroad at an angle of about 52 degrees at a point located about 28 feet southwesterly from the existing structure thence on a curve to the right with a radius of about 1042 feet for a distance of about 164 feet to a point in the center line of the present brick pavement located about 525 feet easterly from the center line of the railroad at the existing overgrade crossing.

(b) The profile of the center line of the changed portion of the highway shall be as follows; Beginning at the surface of the present brick pavement at the above mentioned point located about 275 feet westerly from the center line of the railroad at the existing overgrade crossing thence proceeding easterly on a vertical curve for a distance of 100 feet; thence on an ascending 4 per cent grade for a distance of about 65 feet; thence on a vertical curve for a distance of 200 feet; thence on a descending 4 per cent grade for a distance of about 95 feet; thence on a vertical curve for a distance of 100 feet; thence on the grade of the present highway for a distance of about 234 feet to the surface of the present brick pavement at the above mentioned point located about 335 feet easterly from the center line of the railroad at the existing overgrade crossing.

(c) The new overgrade structure shall consist of a four-span through plate girder bridge about 250 feet long supported on concrete abutments and intermediate concrete or steel bents. The structure shall carry a concrete roadway 40 feet wide between wheel guards and a 5-foot sidewalk bracketed out on the northerly side. The minimum clearance between the underside of the structure and the top of rail thereunder shall be 18 feet.

(d) The approaches shall be graded to a width of 36 feet and shall be surfaced to a width of 20 feet with a 3-inch bottom course and a 3-inch top course of water-bound macadam surface treated with bituminous material except near the ends of the structure where the roadway and pavement shall be widened to about 34 feet and 40 feet respectively and except on curves where the roadway and surfacing shall be widened and banked in accordance with the standards of the Department of Public Works, cable guide railing shall be erected wherever the height of embankment exceeds 3 feet and suitable drainage facilities shall be provided where necessary.

(e) A suitable connection shall be made between the westerly end of the changed portion of the highway and the existing highway.

2 That the New York Central Railroad Company shall prepare the necessary plans, specifications and estimates for the new overgrade crossing and approaches hereinabove authorized and directed and shall do all the work in connection therewith.

The chairman then announced that the hearing on the petition for the construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Hemmenway Road, from Beach Road to the westerly terminus of said Hemmenway Road, in the Town of Cheektowaga, was open for discussion and that anyone who wished to speak upon the subject matter of said petition would be heard. No one spoke in opposition to the granting of said petition and all present were in favor of the granting of the same.

The chairman then announced that the hearing on the petition for the construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along each side of Aurora Road, from Leroy Road to Marsdale Road, in the Town of Cheektowaga, was open for discussion, and that anyone who wished to speak upon the subject matter of said petition would be heard. No one spoke in opposition to the granting of said petition and all present were in favor of the granting of the same.

The chairman then announced that the hearing on the petition for the construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along each side of Leory Road, from Cleveland Drive to Aurora was open for discussion, and that anyone who wished to speak upon the subject matter of said petition would be heard. No one spoke in opposition to the granting of said petition and all present were in favor of the granting of the same.

The chairman then announced that the hearing on the petition for the drainage and construction of a reinforced concrete pavement in and along Roycroft Boulevard, in the Town of Cheektowaga, from Cleveland Drive to the northerly boundary line of said town, was open for discussion, and that anyone who wished to speak upon the subject matter of said petition would be heard. No one spoke in opposition to the granting of said petition and all present were in favor of the granting of the same.

At the conclusion of the hearings, it was moved by Mr. Inia, seconded by Mr. Milne, that the following preambles and resolutions be adopted:--

WHEREAS, written petitions, duly executed and acknowledged, as provided by statute, have been presented to the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga asking it to cause the following named public improvements to be made in and along the hereinafter named public highways, in said town, to-wit:--

1. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along the north side of Delavan Avenue, from Preston Road to the westerly boundary line of the Town of Cheektowaga, at an estimated expense of \$7.50 per lineal foot;
2. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Kokomo Place, in the Town of Cheektowaga, from Clover Place, also known as Clover Street, to Oriole Place, in the Town of Cheektowaga, at an estimated expense of \$3.50 per lineal foot;
3. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along each side of Southcrest Avenue, from Union Road to the easterly terminus of said Southcrest Avenue, in the Town of Cheektowaga, at an estimated expense of \$3.50 per lineal foot;
4. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in Clover Place, from Meadow Place to the easterly terminus of said Clover Street, in the Town of Cheektowaga, at an estimated expense of \$3.50 per lineal foot;
5. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along each side of Northcrest Avenue, from Union Road to the easterly terminus of said Northcrest Avenue, in the Town of Cheektowaga at an estimated expense of \$3.50 per lineal foot;
6. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along each side of Union Road, from Genesee Street to Orchard Place, in the Town of Cheektowaga, at an estimated expense of \$3.50 per lineal foot;
7. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Hemenway Road, from Beach Road to the westerly terminus of said Hemenway Road, in the Town of Cheektowaga, at an estimated expense of \$3.50 per lineal foot;
8. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along each side of Aurora Road, from Leroy Road to Marsdale Road, in the Town of Cheektowaga, at an estimated expense of \$3.50 per lineal foot;

9. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along each side of Leroy Road, from Cleveland Drive to Aurora Road in the Town of Cheektowaga, at an estimated expense of \$3.50 per lineal foot;
- 10.- The drainage and construction of a reinforced concrete pavement in and along Roycroft Boulevard, in the Town of Cheektowaga, from Cleveland Drive to the northerly boundary line of said Town at an estimated expense of \$36.00 per lineal foot;

and asking this board to cause the expense of making and maintaining said improvements to be assessed against and collected from the real estate fronting or bounding upon said respective public highways, or portions thereof, in and along which said respective improvements shall be made; and

WHEREAS, this board did, on the 5th day of March, 1928, duly adopt orders reciting the receipt and filing of each of the aforesaid petitions for the said respective local improvements, and did duly order that hearings be held on the subject matters of said respective petitions at the Town Hall, in the Town of Cheektowaga, on the 20th day of March, 1928, commencing at 2 o'clock P. M., Eastern Standard time, and did order that the Town Clerk cause a certified copy of each of the aforesaid resolutions and orders to be published in the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga and to be posted, in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided; and

WHEREAS, said orders were duly published in the minutes of this board in the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News, the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga, and certified copies of each of said orders were likewise duly published in said newspaper and were duly posted, in accordance with the statute and with the orders of this board, adopted, as aforesaid on the 5th day of March, 1928; and

WHEREAS, public hearings have been duly held upon each of said petitions this day; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this board find and determine that the real property liable for the cost of the construction of said respective improvements is of sufficient value to pay the cost of the construction thereof; and that the prayers of said respective petitions be granted by this board. And be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Engineer be and he is hereby directed, to prepare detailed plans and specifications for the construction of said improvements, a careful estimate of the cost thereof, and, with the assistance of the attorney for this board, proposed contracts covering the said work, and that he submit the same to this board for approval at a meeting thereof to be held at the Town Hall in the Town of Cheektowaga, on the 16th day of April, 1928, at 2 o'clock P. M., Eastern Standard time. Carried. Ayes 6, Noes 0.

It was moved by Mr. Inda, seconded by Mr. Milne, that this meeting adjourn. Carried. Ayes 6, Noes 0.
