Moved by Milne, seconded by Walter that the communication from the Board of Fire Commissioners of Doyle Fire District No. 1 be received and filed and the Supervisor be directed to have the Western New York Walter Company install hydrants on the following streets: One hydrant on Shanley Street near William Street; one hydrant on Wagner Street and William Street; one hydrant on Iroquois Street about 900 feet north of William Street; one hydrant at William St. and Raymond Street; one hydrant at William Street and Union Road; all necessary hydrants in and along Cayuga Creek Road, from William Street to the northerly line of the Niagara, Lockport and Ontario Power Company right of way approximately 500 feet apart, and one hydrant at William Street and Ludwig Avenue. WHEREAS, written petitions, duly executed in accordance with the statutes relating thereto, have been presented to the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga, asking that lateral sanitary sewers be constructed in and along Pinehurst Avenue from Genesee Street to Oriole Place, and in and along Rupp Avenue, from Genesee Street to Oriole Place, in the Town of Cheektowaga, and that the expense thereof be assessed against and collected from the respective parcels of land fronting or abounding in and along the said respective highways, in front of which said sewers are proposed to be laid, and

WHEREAS, the estimated expense of constructing said sewers will amount to approximately \$3.50 per linear foot of frontage on each side of said portions of said respective highways, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that the said petitions be received and that this board meet at the Town Hall, in the Town of Cheektowaga, on the 23rd day of July, 1928, at 2 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard time, or 3 o'clock P.M., Daylight Saving Time, for the purpose of considering said petitions and hearing all persons interested in the subject matter thereof concerning the same. And be it further

RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that the Town Clerk cause a certified copy of this resolution and order to be published in the official newspaper and posted, as provided by statute. Carried. Ayes 5, Noes 0.

WHEREAS, the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore enter into a written contract for the construction of a system of storm water sewerage in Storm Sewer District Number 2, of the Town of Cheektowaga; and

WHEREAS, the contractor has entered upon the performance of said contract and there is due and owing to said contractor for actual work done under said contract the sum of \$18,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga has no funds with which to pay and satisfy said claim and it is necessary to borrow the said sum and such interest as shall accrue thereon, temporarily, pending the issuance and sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the said sum of \$18,000.00, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, be borrowed temporarily upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo for the aforesaid purpose. And be it further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized and directed to execute and deliver for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and under its corporate seal a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, to be dated as of the 16th day of July, 1928, to bear interest from its date at the rate of six per centum per annum, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date, which said certificate shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga. Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga, duly and regularly called and held at the Town Hall in said town on the 23rd day of July, 1928.

Members Present: John C. Stiglmeier, Supervisor; Peter J. Inda, Benjamin Milne, Jacob R. Pawlak, and John J. Walter, Justices of the Peace; John P. Kaufman, Superintendent of Highways.  
Absent: Alois Schiesel, Town Clerk.

The meeting was called to order at 1 o'clock p. m., Eastern Standard Time or 2 o'clock P.M., Daylight Saving Time by Supervisor Stiglmeier, who presided at the meeting.

It was moved by Pawlak, seconded by Walter, that in the absence of Alois Schiesel, town clerk, Peter J. Inda act as clerk protem.  
Carried. Ayes 6, Noes 0.

The acting clerk then read the notice of sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga as follows:

WHEREAS, the said town being indebted for work done in and about the said public improvement in the sum of \$48,000.00, and having no available funds with which to pay said indebtedness, did borrow the said sum temporarily, pending the issuance and sale of bonds and the levy and collection of assessments and did issue, for that purpose, a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, dated the 19th day of June, 1928, for the sum of \$48,000.00, with interest at the rate of six per centum per annum; and

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness became, by its terms, due and payable on the 17th day of September, 1928, and remains unpaid; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to renew the said loan of \$48,000.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon, for a further period of not to exceed 90 days, pending the issuance and sale of bonds of said town and the levy and collection of assessments, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized and directed to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and under its corporate seal, a certificate of indebtedness of said town, to be dated as of the 18th day of September, 1928, and to provide for the payment of the sum of \$48,000.00, with interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date; which said certificate shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga.
