Minutes of a regular meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga, duly and regularly called and held at the Town Hall, in said town, at 2 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, on the 1st day of October, 1928.

Present:

Alois Schiesel, Town Clerk; Peter J. Inda, Jacob R. Pawlak, and John J. Walter, Justices of Peace; John Kaufman, Highway Superintendent.

Absent: John C. Stiglmeier, Supervisor; and Benjamin P. Milne, Justice of the Peace. A quorum was present.

The meeting was called to order by the Town Clerk, and it was moved by Justice Walter, seconded by Justice Pawlak, that Peter J. Inda, act as chairman of the meeting. Carried. Ayes 5, Noes 0.

The Town Clerk then read a certified copy of the preambles and resolutions adopted by this Board on the 20th day of August 1928, reciting an intention on the part of this Board to open and extend Harlem Avenue in a straight line across the tracks and right of way of the New York, West Shore and Buffalo Railway Company, commonly known as the "West Shore" railroad company, and also read the notice of the hearing to be held this day pursuant to said resolutions, given by said Town Clerk to the said New York, West Shore and Buffalo Railway Company and its lessee, The New York Central Railroad Company, and the proof of service of such notice on each of said railroad companies more than 15 days prior to October 1, 1928.

It was thereupon moved that said certified copies of said preambles and resolutions and of said notice and the proofs of service thereof be placed on file in the office of the Town Clerk. Carried. Ayes 5, Noes 0.

The Chairman then declared the hearing on the proposal to open and extend Harlem Avenue in a straight line across the tracks and right of way of the New York, West Shore and Buffalo Railway Company.

Mr. Howard T. Sturtevant, attorney-at-law, and Mr. F. D. Bardwell, assistant engineer of Grade Crossings for the New York Central Railroad company stated that they appeared for and on behalf of the New York, West Shore and Buffalo Railway Company and for its lessee, the New York Central Railroad Company.

Maj. Therm M. Ripley, Chief Engineer of Greater Motorways System of Erie County Appeared for the County of Erie.

E. H. Anderson, Senior Assistant Engineer, appeared for the State Department of Public Works, Bureau of Highways, of the State of New York.

After some discussion, it was agreed by all interested persons present at the hearing, that the hearing be adjourned until 2:00 o'clock p. m. on October 22, 1928.

It was then moved by Justice Walter, seconded by Justice Pawlak, that the hearing on the proposal of this Board to extend Harlem Avenue in a straight line across the tracks and right of way of the New York, West Shore and Buffalo Railway Company, be adjourned until 2:00 o'clock p. m. on the 22nd day of October, 1928, to be held at the Town Hall in the Town of Cheektowaga. Carried. Ayes 5, Noes 0.

Moved by Justice Walter, seconded by Justice Pawlak, that the hearing on the application of Catherine Brauner to conduct a soft drink business on the south side of Genesee St., near Union be held over until a special meeting to be held Thursday October 4, 1928 at 2 o'clock p. m. Standard Time.

Minutes of a special meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents held at the Town Hall with the following members present:

John C. Stiglmeier, Supervisor; Alois Schiesel, Town Clerk; Benjamin Milne, John J. Walter and Jacob R. Pawlak, Justices of the Peace; and John Kaufman, Highway Superintendent.
Absent: Peter J. Ina, Justice of the Peace.

A quorum being present to transact all business that may come before the meeting.

The hearing was called on the application of Catherine Brauner to conduct a soft drink business. Attorney Paul Batt appeared in behalf of Catherine Brauner and Alois Goergen, Joseph Kaufman and Mrs Hrusa appeared in opposition and after a discussion it was moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Justice Walter that the matter be referred to the Town Attorney. Carried.

Moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Justice Walter, that the communication from the Fire Commissioners from Forks Fire District Number 3 relative to installing a water main in and along Kennedy Road from Broadway to a point 110 feet south of Gruner Street and place four hydrants thereon. Carried.

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor, be and he is authorized and directed to notify the Buffalo General Electric Company to install one side arm ornamental street light at the intersection of Ridge Park avenue and Straley Street as directed by the Supervisor under the terms and conditions of their contract with this Board. Carried. Ayes 6, Noes 0.

Moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Kaufman that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to have the necessary street lamps installed in Alaska Street under the terms and conditions of their contract with the Western New York Gas & Electric Corporation. Carried.

Moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Justice Walter, that the deed from Anna Fiegel Thuman, deeding Andres Street to the Town of Cheektowaga for street purpose, be referred to the Town Attorney. Carried.

Moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Justice Pawlak, that the deed from Victor Finance Corporation deeding Vegola Avenue Parcel A Cunard Avenue, Parcel B and Winston Avenue Parcel C for street purpose be referred to the Town Attorney. Carried. Ayes 6, Noes 0.

Moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Justice Walter that the Supervisor be authorized to engage an engineer to prepare assessment rolls at a salary not to exceed \$200.00 dollars per month. Carried.

Moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Justice Walter that the communication from the Public Service Commission be received and filed. Carried.

Moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Mr. Kaufman that the communication from the Public Service Commission in case No. 3519 be laid on the table until the next regular meeting. Carried.

Moved by Justice Milne, seconded by Justice Walter, that the communication from the Public Service Commission case No. 4236 be received and filed. Carried.

Moved by Justice Walter, seconded by Justice Pawlak, that the Clerk be directed to advertise for proposals for two carloads of grade A run of the mine soft coal having a B. T. U. value of 13.732 units for Town Hall. Proposals to be received on the 22nd day of October, 1928, at 2 p. m. Standard Time. Carried.

Moved by Town Clerk Schiesel, seconded by Justice Walter, that the following be appointed as Election Inspectors to fill vacancies Edward S. Smith, District No. 1; Anna Cygaj, District No. 6; George C. Smith, District Number 7. Carried.

Moved by Justice Walter, seconded by Justice Pawlak, that the following be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore enter into a valid contract for the construction of sidewalks and crosswalks in and along certain public highways and public places in the Town of Cheektowaga, and certain sidewalks and crosswalks have been constructed pursuant to said contract, and the Town of Cheektowaga is indebted for said public improvements in the sum of \$10,000.00 and has no available funds with which to pay and satisfy said indebtedness, and it is necessary to borrow said sum, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, temporarily, pending the sale of bonds and the levy and collection of assessments to raise the cost of said improvements; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$10,000.00, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, be borrowed upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, for the aforesaid purpose, and that the Supervisor, be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute, issue and deliver a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, for the sum of \$10,000.00 to be dated as of the 11th day of October, 1928, to bear interest from its date at the rate of six per centum per annum, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within ninety days from its date; which said certificate shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga.

1. In and along Mapleview Road from Roycroft Boulevard, to Mapleview Road;
2. In and along Merrymont Road, from Cleveland Drive to Mapleview Road;
3. In and along Briarcliff Road, from Cleveland Drive to Mapleview Road;
4. In and along Cleveland Drive, from Harlem Avenue to Beach Road,

at the expense of the respective parcels of land fronting or abutting in and along the said respective highways, pursuant to Section 260 Article 12, of the Town Law, as amended; now therefore, be it

John C. Stiglmeier, Supervisor; Alois Schiesel, Town Clerk; Peter J. Inda, Benjamin Milne, Jacob R. Pawlak, John Walter, Justices of the Peace; and John Kaufman, Superintendent of Highways. A full quorum was present to conduct all business that may come before the meeting.

Meeting was called to order by the chairman at 2 o'clock p. m., Standard Time.

Moved by Inda, seconded by Milne, that the minutes of the previous regular and special meetings be approved as published in the official paper. Carried.

Moved by Milne, seconded by Kaufman, that the communication from the Public Service Commission in Case No. 3519 be received and filed. Carried.

Moved by Milne, seconded by Pawlak, that the petition of Frederick Stug, owner, William Clifford, tenant, to operate a dismantling automobile shop at [REDACTED] be denied.

Moved by Inda, seconded by Pawlak, that the following be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga was indebted to the City of Buffalo, in the sum of \$11,848.70, for the share of said town in the cost of paving Cochrane Street; and

WHEREAS, The Town of Cheektowaga had no available funds with which to pay said indebtedness to the City of Buffalo and did borrow the said sum of \$11,848.70, and such interest as should accrue thereon, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, for the aforesaid purpose, and did issue and deliver to said bank, the certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, for the said sum of \$11,848.70 dated the 31st day of July, 1928, and payable with interest at the rate of 6 per centum per annum, within 90 days from its date; and

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness will, by its terms, become due and payable on the 29th day of October, 1928, and it is necessary to renew the same for a further period of not to exceed 90 days, pending the levy and collection of assessments and the issuance and sale of bonds to raise said sum; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to execute, issue and deliver a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, to be issued upon the faith and credit of said town, and under its corporate seal, for the sum of \$11,848.70, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, to be dated as of the 29th day of October, 1928, and to bear interest from its date at the rate of six per centum per annum, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date, which said certificate of indebtedness shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk who is hereby authorized to countersign the same, and to impress thereon, the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga.

WHEREAS, the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore duly borrow from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, the sum of \$18,000.00 to pay valid claims duly audited by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of said town, arising out of a valid contract for the construction of a system of storm sewerage in Storm District Number 2, in town of

Cheektowaga, and, as security for said loan did duly issue and deliver a certificate of indebtedness of said town for the sum of \$18,000.00, dated as of the 16th day of July, 1928, bearing interest at the rate of six per centum per annum and payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date; and

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness, by its terms, became due and payable on the 14th day of October, 1928, and it is necessary to renew the same, temporarily, pending the issuance and sale of bonds and the levy and collection of assessments to raise the cost of said improvement; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute, issue and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, and under its corporate seal, a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, to be dated as of the 14th day of October, 1928, to bear interest from its date at the rate of six per centum per annum, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date; which said certificate shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and to impress thereon, the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Moved by Inda, seconded by Kaufman, that the following be adopted:

RESOLVED: that sidewalks in all public highways now improved or hereafter improved with pavement and curbing, in the Town of Cheektowaga, shall be laid on a grade conforming to the grade of the pavement in the respective highway, in and along which such sidewalk shall be laid, and at an elevation above the top of the curb in said highway of about one-half inch per foot, measured from the curb to the edge of such sidewalk nearest the curb; which said sidewalk shall have a drainage slope of about one-fourth inch per foot toward the curb of said highway. Carried. Ayes 7, Noes 0.

A majority of the said Board and a quorum for the transaction of business were present.

The meeting was called to order at 2:30 P.M., by Supervisor Stiglmeier, who acted as chairman of the meeting.

The Commission having by its order in the above entitled matter dated November 29, 1927, determined that the existing highway-railroad crossings at grade of the railroads operated by The New York Central Railroad Company, Lehigh Valley Railroad Company, The Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad Company and Erie Railroad Company and Transit Road (County Highway No. 1334) in the Village of Depew, Erie County, be designated for elimination, and directed the general manner in which such elimination should be accomplished; and further hearing with respect to plans having been held on February 7, 1928, by and before E. J. Govern, Assistant Engineer, specially authorized to conduct said hearing at which those named hereinbefore appeared; and the Commission having determined the details of such elimination of the plans and evidence submitted; it is now

ORDERED: 1. That the said existing highway-railroad at grade shall be eliminated substantially in accordance with a plan filed at the hearing held on October 27, 1927, and marked "Exhibit NO. 7" except as modified by the following general requirements:

(2) The new undercrossings of the railroads shall consist of three-span plate girder bridges supported on concrete abutments and steel columns located at the curb lines. The bridges shall have solid floors and shall be designed to carry the existing tracks of the railroads. The girders shall be painted a color to harmonize with the concrete abutments. The width between abutments measured at right angles to the center line of the highway shall be such as to provide a roadway having a clear width of 5 feet. The minimum clearance from the underside of the bridges to the finished surface of the roadway thereundershall be 14 feet.

(b) The changed portion of the highway shall be graded to a width of 56 feet between outside slopes, shall be surfaced with reinforced concrete to a width of 40 feet and shall have two concrete sidewalks 5 feet in width each.

(c) The drainage system shall consist of a 24-inch extra strength vitrified pipe gravity drain extending from the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western subway along the westerly side of the highway to a point near the southerly right of way line of the Erie Railroad thence westerly on the right of way of the Erie Railroad for about 20 feet; thence southwesterly to the westside of Bellvue Avenue for about 32 feet; thence southerly along the westerly side of Bellvue Avenue for about 1426 feet to Cayuga Creek. The Lehigh Valley and the New York Central subways and approaches shall be drained to a sump located near the Lehigh Valley subway. Duplicate centrifugal pumps shall be installed and the drainage shall be discharged to a catch basin located at the end of the gravity drain above described. Necessary manholes and catch basins shall be provided. The drainage along the Lehigh Valley Railroad shall be carried across the highway by means of an inverted syphon or dive culvert.

(d) Gould avenue and Westfield avenue shall be depressed on their present alignments and with grades not to exceed 4 per cent to meet the new grade of the southerly approach. The changed portion of said avenues shall be surfaced in the same manner as is the existing avenues.

2. That highway traffic shall be maintained over a temporary highway with temporary crossings at grade substantially as shown on said plan "Exhibit No. 7" The grade crossings of all railroads shall be protected at all times by flagmen until the new undergrade crossing is completed and opened to traffic after which the temporary grade crossings shall be removed and the temporary highway discontinued.

3. That the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad Company shall with all convenient speed prepare plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of such elimination except those portions of the work hereinafter specified; that Erie Railroad Company, Lehigh Valley Railroad Company and The New York Central Railroad Company shall each with all convenient speed prepare plans, specifications and estimates of cost of the necessary temporary track construction and new superstructure to support and carry its respective tracks; and that all such plans, specifications and estimates shall be submitted to this Commission for its approval.

4. That the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad Company shall carry out all work in connection with said elimination, except as hereinafter provided; that Erie Railroad Company, Lehigh Valley Railroad Company and The New York Central Railroad Company shall each carry out all of the work in connection with the temporary track construction and new superstructure to support and carry its respective tracks.

5. That of the construction and work hereinabove authorized and provided for, the additional work of constructing the reinforced concrete pavements to a width of 40 feet between the Erie and the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western structures, and the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western and Lehigh Valley Structures over and above that of constructing such pavement to a width of 16 feet between said points, together with the additional work of constructing the reinforced concrete pavement to a width of 40 feet between the New York Central structure and Ellicott road over and above that of constructing such pavement to a width of 34 feet between said points shall be considered as additional work desired by the Department of Public Works, other than necessary for the eliminations.

6. That the proportion (fifty per cent) of the cost of such eliminations chargeable to all parties in interests to be borne by the railroad corporations shall be divided as follows: The Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company, Lehigh Valley Railroad Company and The New York Central Railroad Company shall each bear fifty per cent of the cost of the work within its respective property lines, and in addition one-fourth of fifty per cent of the balance of the work including the drainage system of the undercrossings.
