1. WHEREAS, the State Department of Public Works, Bureau of Highways, has tentatively determined to resurface, reconstruct, and widen such portion of County Highway located within the Town, and hereinafter described in paragraph 2, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Board, pursuant to Article Seven of the Highway Law, requests that the plans for resurfacing, reconstructing and widening, as described in this paragraph, be as provided in paragraph 3, to-wit: Genesee Street, County Highway 1212 beginning at the Buffalo City Line and extending to Cayuga Street, having a total length of 15,400 feet. And be it further

RESOLVED, that this Board requests that curbs and necessary Storm Sewer be constructed, and charged upon the Town of Cheektowaga, as provided by Section 177 of the Highway Law.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore borrow the sum of \$18,000.00, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, to pay valid claims against said town, duly audited by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents thereof, and did duly issue and deliver therefore the certificate of indebtedness of said town, for the said sum of \$18,000.00 dated the 8th day of January, 1929 and payable to the order of said bank within 90 days from its date; and

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness will become due and payable, by its terms, on the 8th day of April, 1929, and it is necessary to renew the said loan temporarily for a further period of not to exceed 90 days, pending the collection of taxes; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, upon its faith and credit and under its corporate seal, to be dated as of the 9th day of April, 1929, and to provide for the payment of the said sum of \$18,000.00, to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo at its Broadway Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, with interest thereon at the rate of six per centum per annum, within 90 days from its date. And be it further

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RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be, and he is hereby, directed to countersign said certificate of indebtedness and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore borrow, the sum of \$18,000.00, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, to pay for materials furnished and work done in and about the construction of a storm sewerage system in Storm Sewer District Number 2, of the Town of Cheektowaga, in anticipation of the sale of bonds and the collection of assessments, and

WHEREAS, the said loan by its terms will become due and payable on the 15th day of April, 1929 and it is necessary to renew the said loan for a further period of not to exceed ninety (90) days pending the sale of said bonds and the collection of assessments, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he is hereby, authorized and directed to execute, issue and deliver for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, and under its corporate seal, a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, to be dated as of the 16th day of April, 1929, to bear interest from its date at the rate of six per centum per annum, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office in the City of Buffalo, New York, within ninety (90) days from its date; which said certificate shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and to impress thereon, the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga.

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to execute, issue and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, and under its corporate seal, a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, to be dated as of the 10th day of April, 1929, to bear interest from its date at the rate of six per centum per annum, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within ninety (90) days from its date; which said certificate shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and to impress thereon, the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga.

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute, issue and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and under its corporate seal, a certificate of

indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga for the sum of \$6,500, to be dated as of the 5th day of April, 1929, to bear interest from its date at the rate of six per centum per annum, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within ninety (90) days from its date; which said certificate of indebtedness shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Meeting was called to order by the chairman at 2 o'clock P.M.

sidings from Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company to such owners' adjacent property, any such electric line reconstruction to be made and maintained in accordance with the provisions of the National Electrical Safety Code of the Bureau of Standards, U. S. Department of Commerce.

Moved by Inda, seconded by Milne, that the following be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga has requested that the State Department of Public Works, Bureau of Highways, to modify the plans for the reconstruction of Genesee Street, Part 1, Highway Number 1212, in the Town of Cheektowaga to provide for extra width of pavement, curbing and improved drainage and.

WHEREAS, the share of the Town of Cheektowaga in the cost of said improvement as estimated and stated by the State Department of Public Works, Bureau of Highways, is \$101,900, which sum must be made immediately available and deposited by the Town of Cheektowaga with the Comptroller of the State of New York, before said improvement can proceed; and

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and under its corporate seal a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga for the sum of one hundred and one thousand nine hundred dollars; to be dated as of the 4th day of June, 1929; to bear interest from its date at the rate of six per centum per annum and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo

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at its Broadway Branch Office in the City of Buffalo, New York, within six months from its date; which said certificate of indebtedness shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same and impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga, And be it further.

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to deposit the proceeds of said loan, to-wit, the sum of \$101,900 with the Comptroller of the State of New York for an on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga. Carried, Ayes 6, Noes 0.

Moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the following resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County has requested the State Department of Public Works, Bureau of Highways, to modify the plans for the reconstruction of the Genesee Street, Part 1, Highway Number 1212, under reconstruction Contract No.....so as to provide for a greater width or for a different style of construction; and

WHEREAS, the said Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga, has adopted resolution providing for the raising of funds for the estimated cost either by authorizing the issuance and sale of Town Bonds, or the levying of taxes; and

WHEREAS, the State Department of public works, Bureau of Highways has prepared plans, specifications and estimate of cost for the reconstruction of said highway, which includes the extra work desired by the Town of Cheektowaga, and has transmitted the same to this board, accompanied by a communication stating that the estimated cost of such work to be borne by the Town is one hundred and one thousand nine hundred dollars.

RESOLVED, that such plans, specifications and estimate of cost be and the same are hereby approved.
