Minutes of a regular meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga held at the Town Hall with the following members present:

John C. Stiglmeier, Supervisor; Alois Schiesel, Town Clerk; Peter J. Inda, Jacob R. Pawlak, John J. Walter, Benjamin Milne, Justices of the Peace; and John Kaufman, Town Superintendent of Highways, the full Board was present

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 1 o'clock P. M., Eastern Standard Time or 2 P. M. Daylight Saving Time.

The Town Clerk read the notice of hearings to be held, today, on the petitions asking for the following local public improvements, to-wit:-

Item No.

1. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along each side of Wanda Street, from Straley Street to a point about 850 feet south of Straley Street;
2. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Reo Street, from Straley Street to a point about 850 feet south of Straley Street;
3. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Hedwig Street, from Straley Street to a point about 850 feet south of Straley Street;
4. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Gualbert Street, from Straley Street to a point about 850 feet south of Straley Street;
5. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Ridge Park Avenue, from Straley Street to a point about 850 feet south of Straley Street;
6. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Wooddell Avenue, from Straley Street to a point about 850 feet south of Straley street;
7. The construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along Alexander Avenue, from Straley Street to a point about 850 feet south of Straley Street.

The Town Clerk also submitted proof of publication of notice of said hearings in the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News, in the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga, on June 20th and 27th, 1929 and proof of posting of notice of said hearing by the Town Clerk on June 21st, 1929, and it was moved by Inda, seconded by Milne, that the notice of hearings and proof of publication and of posting thereof, be placed on file in the office of the Town Clerk. Carried. Ayes 7, Noes 0.

The Supervisor then declared the hearing open on Item Number 1, to-wit: The petition for the construction of a lateral sanitary sewer in and along each side of Wanda Street, from Straley Street, to a point about 850 feet south of Straley Street, in the Town of Cheektowaga, point 850 feet south of Straley St., in the Town of Cheektowaga.

No one opposed the granting of the petition. Those present who spoke on the subject matter of the petition, urged that it be granted. After all who desired to do so, had spoken, the chairman

No one opposed the granting of the petition. Those present who spoke on the subject matter of the petition, urged that it be granted. After all who desired to do so, had spoken, the chairman declared the hearing on Item Number 7, closed.

Upon the conclusion of the hearings upon the above mentioned items of local improvements, and after due consideration by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents, it was moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the following be adopted:

After all bids received had been publicly opened and read it was moved by Inda, seconded by Walter, that all bids be laid on the table until Monday, July 8th, 1929, at 2 o'clock P.M. Daylight Saving Time for further consideration and tabulation. Carried. Ayes 7, Noes 0.

A public hearing was then held on the application No. 1 of the Buffalo Transit Company for a certificate of convenience and necessity to operate a bus line in the Town of Cheektowaga beginning at Zurbrick Road and Transit Road thence west on Zurbrick Road to Borden Road; north on Borden Road to Rowley Road; thence west on Rowley Road to the Buffalo-Depew Road and thence on the Buffalo-Depew Road to Union Road thence north on Union Road to Broadway and west on Broadway to the City of Buffalo.

The granting of the petition was opposed by most of the speakers who stated that if the petition were granted, the result would be the discontinuance of trolley car service, which would work great injury to the residents and owners of property along the trolley car line and loss of taxes to the town.

After hearing all concerned in the subject matter there it was moved by Inda, seconded by Kaufman, that application No. 1 of the Buffalo Transit Company be denied. Carried. Ayes 7, Noes 0.

A public hearing was then held on application No. 2 of the Buffalo Transit Company to operate a bus line in the Town of Cheektowaga beginning at Kensington, Avenue and the easterly city line of Buffalo, proceeding thence east on Kensington Avenue to Cleveland Drive; thence east on Cleveland Drive to Cayuga Street also known as Williamsville Road thence south of Cayuga Street; to Genesee Street; the said proposed route being part of a proposed route commencing at Lafayette Square in the City of Buffalo and connecting at Genesee St in the Town of Cheektowaga with a bus route operated by the petitioners which passes over and along Genesee St. in the Town of Cheektowaga and has its westerly terminus in the City of Buffalo. After hearing all persons concerned in the subject matter of said petition it was moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the hearing on application No. 2 of the petitioner be adjourned until Monday, July 22, 1929, at 2 o'clock P. M., Daylight Saving Time. Carried. Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Inda, seconded by Schiesel, that the proof of publication and certificate of posting of notice of hearing upon the applications of Buffalo Transit Company for permission to operate bus lines be received and filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga. Carried. Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Inda, seconded by Milne, that the adjourned hearing on the application of the Buffalo Valley Bus Line, Inc., be adjourned until July 15, 1929 at 2 o'clock P. M., Daylight Saving Time. Carried. Ayes 7, Noes 0.
