1. The south side of Genesee Street, from Mildred Drive to a point 116 feet west of Stratford Place;
2. Awood Place, from Genesee Street to the northerly terminus of Awood Place;
3. Each side of Grand Boulevard, from West Grand Boulevard to George Urban Boulevard;
- Each side of Kilbourne Road, from East Grand Boulevard to George Urban Boulevard;
- Each side of Midland Drive, from Grand Boulevard to George Urban Boulevard;
- Each side of Rosewood Terrace, from Grand Boulevard to George Urban Boulevard;
- Westland Terrace, from Grand Boulevard to George Urban Boulevard;
- West Grand Boulevard to George Urban Boulevard;
- Each side of East Grand Boulevard, from Genesee Street to George Urban Boulevard;
- Genesee Street, from Harlem Avenue to Midland Drive;
4. In and along each side of Wanda Street, Reo Street, Hedwig Street, Gualbert Street, Ridge Park Avenue, Woodell Avenue and Alexander Street, from Straley Street to a point 850 feet south of Straley Street;
In and along Hoerner Street, from Wildy Street to a point 430 feet south of Wildy Street.
5. In and along each side of Chapel Avenue from Union Road to center Lot 102, South Center Line Lot 103.
6. In and along each side of Cayuga Street, also known as Cayuga Road, from Chapel Avenue, to the south line of Farm Lot 13, Township 11, Range 7;

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7. In and along Dellwood Place, from Genesee Street to the northerly terminus of Dellwood Place.

And be it further.

RESOLVED, that said bonds shall be dated as of April 1st, 1930, and shall consist of 60 bonds of the denomination of \$1000. each, 14 bonds of the denomination of \$263.65 each and 1 bond of the denomination of \$263.59; which said bonds shall be numbered consecutively, from Number 1 to Number 75 both inclusive, and shall mature in the sequence in which they shall be numbered, so that five of said bonds, of the aggregate par value of \$4,263.59, will become due and payable on the First day of July, 1930, and five of said bonds, of the aggregate par value of \$4263.65, will become due and payable on the First day of July of each year, from and including the First day of July 1931, up to and including the First day of July, 1944.

4. Merrymont Road and Briarcliff Road, from Cleveland Drive to the north boundary line of Abbott and Beymer's Crest-view Subdivison.

RESOLVED, that said bonds shall be dated as of April 1st 1930, and shall consist of 170 bonds of the denomination of \$1,000. each and 10 bonds of the denomination of \$147.60 each; which said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from Number 1 to Number 180, both inclusive, and shall mature in the sequence in which they shall be numbered, so that 18 of said bonds, of the aggregate par value of \$17,147.60, will become due and payable on the first day of July of each year, from and including the First day of July 1930, up to and including the First day of July, 1939. RESOLVED, that bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, of the aggregate par value of \$103,916.67, be issued and sold upon the faith and credit of said town and under its corporate seal, to pay the expense of reconstructing the Sewage Disposal Plant of Sewer District Number Three of the Town of Cheektowaga; which said bonds shall be dated as of the 1st day of July, 1930, and shall consist of 87 bonds of the denomination of \$1000 each 28 bonds of the denomination of \$583.33, each, and 1 bond of the denomination of \$583.43; and which said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from Number 1 to Number 116, both inclusive and shall mature, in the sequence in which they shall be numbered, so that 4 of said bonds, of the aggregate par value of \$3,583.43, will become due and payable on the First day of July 1931, and 4 of said bonds of the aggregate par value of \$3,583.33, will become due and payable on the First day of July of each year, from and including the First day of July 1932, up to and including the First day of July, 1959. And be it further.

RESOLVED, that said bond shall bear interest from their date, payable semi-annually on the First day of each January and July, at such lawful rate not exceeding six per centum per annum, as the successful bidder therefor shall specify in his bid; that both the principal and such interest as shall accrue on said bonds shall be payable in New York exchange, at the banking house of Liberty Bank of Buffalo, in the City of Buffalo, New York, or at the banking house of such other bank or trust company as shall be mutually agreed upon between the purchaser or purchasers of said bonds and this board. RESOLVED, that this board approve and urge the passage of the bill now before the New York State Legislature entitled: "An Act to Amend the Town Law in relation to giving notice of assessments for public improvements," as this bill if enacted into law, will save the taxpayers of the Town of Cheektowaga at least fifteen hundred dollars per year, and will save the taxpayers throughout the State of New York, many thousands of dollars, annually.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore borrow the sum of \$62,000.00, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo to pay the share of the said town in the cost of extending and improving Pine Ridge Road, as a County Aid-Town Highway, from Harlem Avenue to Cayuga Street, in said town, and, for the purpose of securing said loan, did duly issue and deliver a certificate of indebtedness for said sum to said bank; and

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness, dated the 13th day of January, 1930, became due and payable, by its terms, on the 14th day of April, 1930, and it is necessary to renew the said loan and certificate of indebtedness for a further period of 90 days, pending the issuance and sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the sum of \$62,000.00, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, for a further period of 90 days, from the 14th day of April, 1930, and that the Supervisor be, and he is hereby, directed to execute, issue and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and upon its faith and credit, a certificate of indebtedness of said town, to be dated as of the 14th day of April, 1930, to provide for the payment of the sum of \$62,000.00, with interest thereon at the rate of six per centum per annum, to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date, which said certificate of indebtedness shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk of Cheektowaga, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga, and which said certificate of indebtedness shall be delivered to the said bank in renewal of the certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, dated the 13th day of January, 1930, which said bank now holds.

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness became, by its terms, due and payable on the 9th day of April, 1930, and it is necessary to renew the same for a further period of 90 days pending the issuance and sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga and the collection of assessments to raise the cost of said improvements; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga be, and he is hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, and under its corporate seal, to execute and issue a certificate of indebtedness of said town for the sum of \$97,500.00, to be dated as of the 9th day of April, 1930, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date, with interest at the rate of six per centum per annum; which certificate of indebtedness shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and shall be delivered to the said bank in renewal of the certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, dated the 9th day of January, 1930, now held by said bank.
