At 2 P.M. Standard time the Chairman called the meeting to order.

Moved by Inda, seconded by Milne, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that the regular meetings of this Board be held the first Monday in each month at 2 o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of auditing accounts presented to the Town. And be it further.

RESOLVED, that this Board also meet on the third Monday of each month for the purpose of transacting such business as may come before this board. And be it further.

RESOLVED, that should any of such meeting fall on a legal holiday, then such will be held on the following day at the same time. Carried, Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Walter, seconded by Schiesel, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News, a weekly newspaper, published in the Village of Depew in the Town of Cheektowaga, be, and the same is hereby designated as the official paper of the Town for the purposes of publishing all legal notices of this Town Board. Carried, Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Walter, seconded by Schiesel, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that William Brennan Jr., be and he is hereby appointed Town Attorney for the Town of Cheektowaga, at a salary of Eighty five Hundred Dollars, (\$8,500.00) per year. Carried, Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Walter, Seconded by Kaufman, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that Robert Wirt and Elmer Mesner, be and they are hereby appointed as Engineers of the Town at a monthly salary of Two Hundred Dollars, (\$200.00), each. And be it further.

RESOLVED, that the engineers be under the direction and charge of the Supervisor. Carried, Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that Gertrude D. Kozminski, be and she is hereby appointed Clerk in the Town Clerk's Office, at a monthly salary of One hundred and Twenty Five Dollars, (\$125.00). And be it further.

RESOLVED, that Esther Schieder, be and she is hereby appointed clerk to the Board of Assessors, at a monthly salary of One Hundred Dollars, (\$100.00). Carried, Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that Charles Zimmer be, and he is hereby appointed caretaker of Disposal Plant Sewer District Number Five, of the Town, at a monthly salary of One hundred and Fifty Dollars. (\$150.00). Carried, Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that the position of Caretaker of Disposal Plant Sewer District Number Three, is hereby abolished, until the completion of the reconstruction work which is now in progress. Carried, Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Inda, seconded by Milne, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that all appointive positions made by this Town Board shall be subject to removal at the pleasure of this board. Carried, Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Inda, seconded by Milne, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Article 24 "A", Section 516, of the Town Law, this board hereby designates the Marine Trust Company, (Broadway Branch) as the depository of funds received by the Receiver of Taxes and Assessments. Carried, Ayes 6, Noes 0.

Moved by Walter, seconded by Kaufman, that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Article 24, Section 510, of the town law, this board hereby designates the following banks as depositories of town funds, to-wit Liberty Bank of Buffalo, (Broadway Branch).

Marine Trust Company of Buffalo, (Broadway Branch),
Bank of Lancaster,
and that the funds of the town may be deposited therein; and that all checks, notes and other instruments for payment of money made or drawn by, or upon, or payable to, the Town shall be signed, or accepted or endorsed (other than for deposit) by the following named officers of the Town and in the manner stated "John C. Stiglmeier, Supervisor" and the said banks are hereby authorized to pay such checks, notes and other instrument for payment of money, and also to receive the same for deposit to the credit of, or in payment from any holder (including checks drawn to cash or bearer or to the individual order of the officer signing same) when so, signed, or accepted, or endorsed, without inquiry of any kind whether

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Article 24, Section 500 of the town law, the Supervisor of the Town file a bond in the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars, (\$30,000.00), to inure to the benefit of the Town of Cheektowaga, and be it further.

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to notify the "Western New York Water Company" to extend its water main on Columbus Street from Kennedy Road to Walkowiak Street and to install hydrants at the following points, to-wit:-

- On the northwest corner of Milson Street and Columbus Street.
 - On the northwest corner of Pitass Street and Columbus Street.
 - On the northwest corner of Felix Street and Columbus Street.
 - On the northeast corner of Columbus and Walkowiak Streets.
- And be it further.

RESOLVED, that the said "Western New York Water Company" be directed to install its water main in St. Felix Street from William Street to Columbus Street, and to install a hydrant at the northeast corner of William Street and St. Felix Street, and one hydrant at a point about 410 feet north of William Street. Carried Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Inda seconded by Walter, that the following be adopted:-

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore borrow the sum of \$62,000.00, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo to pay the share of the said town in the cost of the extending and improving Pine Ridge Road, as a County Aid-Town Highway, from Harlem Avenue to Cayuga Street, in said town, and for the purpose of securing said loan, did duly issue and deliver a certificate of indebtedness dated the 17th day of July, 1929, for said sum to said bank; and

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness, upon its maturity, was renewed for a further period and the renewal certificate of indebtedness will become due and payable, by its terms, on the 13th day of January, 1930, and it is necessary to renew the said loan and certificate of indebtedness for a further period of 90 days, pending the issuance and sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowag; now, therefore be it.

RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the sum of \$62,000.00, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo for a further period of 90 days, from the 13th day of January, 1930, and that the Supervisor be, and he is hereby directed to execute, issue and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and upon its faith and credit, a certificate of indebtedness of said town, to be dated as of the 13th day of January, 1930, to provide for the payment of the sum of \$62,000.00, with interest thereon at the rate of six per centum per annum, to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date, which said certificate of indebtedness shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and to impress thereon the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga, and which said certificate of indebtedness shall be delivered to the said bank in renewal of the certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, dated the 15th day of October, 1929, which said bank now holds. WHEREAS, the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore borrow the sum of \$97,500.00, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, to pay valid claims for work done under written contracts with the Town of Cheektowaga for the construction of certain local public improvements and, as security therefor, did duly execute issue and deliver to the said Liberty Bank of Buffalo, a certificate of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, for the sum of \$97,500.00, dated as of the 11th day of October, 1929, and

WHEREAS, the said certificate of indebtedness will become, by its terms, due and payable on the 9th day of January 1930, to pay and satisfy said loan, and it is necessary to renew the same for a further period of 90 days, pending the issuance and sale of bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga and the collection of assessments to raise the cost of said improvements; now, therefore, be it.

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga held at the Town Hall, with the following members present.
