A quorum being present to conduct any and all business that may come before the meeting.

At 2 o'clock P. M. Daylight Saving Time or 1 o'clock Eastern Standard Time the Supervisor called the meeting to order.

The Clerk then read the notice of hearing for the construction of sidewalks in and along the east side of Vegola Street from Genesee Street northerly to subdivision lot No. 97, and submitted due proof of the publication and posting of said notice of hearing as required by statute.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga has no available funds with which to pay and satisfy said claims, and it is necessary to borrow the said sum of \$15,000.00 and such interest as shall accrue thereon, temporarily, upon the faith and credit of said town, pending the issuance and sale of bonds and the collection of the proceeds of the sale thereof and the levy and collection of assessments, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the said sum of \$15,000.00, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, and that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute and issue, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, a certificate of indebtedness of said town, for the sum of \$15,000.00 to be dated as of the 14th day of July, 1930, to bear interest from its date, at the rate of six per centum per annum, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within 90 days from its date; which said certificate shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same and to impress the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga thereon, and which said certificate of indebtedness shall be delivered by the Supervisor to the said bank, for the purpose aforesaid.



to Lafayette Square, Buffalo -- - - - - 15¢

GOING NORTH AND SOUTH:

Harlem Avenue, Kensington Avenue to Broadway - - - - 10¢  
Harlem Avenue, Kensington Avenue to Genesee St. - - - 5¢

From and after the completion of the viaduct to carry Harlem Avenue over the New York Central Railroad, the Buffalo Transit Co. Inc., shall issue transfers from or to the Harlem Avenue Buses, from or to the Broadway, Genesee Street or Cleveland Drive buses for five cents additional fare, and, thereafter the fare between Lafayette Square, in the City of Buffalo, and Harlem Avenue in the Town of Cheektowaga, on Broadway, Genesee Street, or Cleveland Drive or Kensington Avenue buses shall not exceed 10 cents.
