At 2 o'clock P. M. Standard Time, the Chairman called the meeting.

The Clerk then read the invitation to coal dealers as published in Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News, to submit proposals for tow carloads of soft coal to be delivered in the coal bin at the Town Hall.

The following proposals were submitted:

R. Vanneman, Chief Engineer, specially authorized to conduct such hearing, at which those named hereinabove appeared; and said plan having been marked Exhibit 20; and after due consideration it appearing that said plan shows a proper method of the elimination of said crossings, it is

ORDERED: 1. That the elimination of the grade crossings of William Street and South Ogden Street in the City of Buffalo, Town of Cheektowaga, and Village of Sloan, Erie County, and the railroads operated by Erie Railroad Company and Lehigh Valley Railroad Company shall be accomplished in accordance with the details indicated on a plan filed at the hearing on April 30, 1930, and marked Exhibit 20.

2. That the Grade Crossing and Terminal Station Commission of the City of Buffalo shall prepare the plans, specifications and estimates of cost for the approaches and the pavement and the drainage of the subways, including any support which may be necessary in order to carry the tracks of the railroad operated by The Delaware, Lackawanna, and Western Railroad Company; that the Erie Railroad Company shall prepare the plans, specifications and estimates of cost for the superstructure, substructure and temporary track supports necessary to provide that portion of the structure which will be required to carry the tracks of said company; that the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company shall prepare the plans, specifications and estimates of cost for the superstructure, substructure and temporary track supports necessary to provide that portion of the structure which will be required to carry the tracks of said company; that each of said railroads shall with all convenient speed submit such plans specifications and estimates of cost to this Commission for its approval; that the Grade Crossing and Terminal Station Commission of the City of Buffalo shall prepare forthwith and submit to this Commission a plan showing other than necessary for the elimination which is desired by any party in interest.

3. That the Grade Crossing and Terminal Station Commission of the City of Buffalo shall carry out the work on the approaches and the pavement and frainange in subways and the support of the tracks of the railroad operated by the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company if necessary; that the Erie Railroad Company and Lehigh Valley Railroad Company shall each carry out the work in connection with the false work, substructure and superstructure to support and carry their respective tracks, together with any other changes in their respective tracks or other railroad facilities as may be necessary to accomplish the elimination.

4. That of the cost of accomplishing the elimination, the Erie Railroad Company shall bear 50 per cent of the total cost of providing the temporary tracks, false work and the permanent substructure and the superstructure necessary to accomplish the elimination of the tracks of said company as they now exist; that of the cost of accomplishing the elimination, the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company shall each bear 50 per cent of the statutory cost chargeable to the railroad corporation of the remainder of the work; that each railroad corporation shall bear the entire expense of providing any additional railroad facilities other than those which exist at this time.
