A quorum being present to transact any and all business that may come before the meeting; in the absence of the Supervisor, the Town Clerk called the meeting to order at 2 o'clock P.M. Standard Time, and it was

Moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that Justice Peter J. Inda act as chairman of this meeting.

Carried, Ayes 6, Noes 0.

The Town Clerk then stated that the Supervisor was engaged as a member of the Finance Committee of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie, in the preparation of the annual budget of the County of Erie and was unable to attend the meeting of this board.

The Clerk then publicly read the notice of public hearings, scheduled to be held by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents this day on local public improvements and submitted proof of publication of said notice in Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News, the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga, on October 22nd, and 29th, 1931 and his certificate of posting notice of said hearings in the manner provided by statute on the 23rd day of October, 1931, and it was moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the notice be placed on file in the office of the Town Clerk. Carried, Ayes 6, Noes 0.

The Chairman then announced that the hearing as set forth in said notice of hearings to-wit, the hearing on the petition for the construction of lateral sanitary sewers in and along Fernwood Place from Beach Road to the northerly terminus of said Fernwood Place, was open for discussion and that any person who wished to speak on the subject of said proposed improvement would be heard.

No one opposed the granting of the petition for said proposed improvement. Those who appeared urged the board to grant the petition and cause the improvement to be made. After all who wished to do so had spoken, the Chairman declared the hearing closed.

It was then moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the following be adopted:

WHEREAS, a written petition was heretofore presented to this board asking it to cause a lateral sanitary sewer to be constructed and maintained in and along Fernwood Place from Beach Road to the northerly terminus of said Fernwood Place, and to assess the cost of constructing and maintaining the said improvement against the

several parcels of land benefited thereby; and

WHEREAS, this board did cause due notice of the filing of said petition to be given to all persons interested therein or in the subject matter thereof in the manner provided by statute and did this day duly hold a public hearing upon said petition, now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this board find and determine that said petition was duly executed and acknowledged as required by statute; that the respective parcels of land that will be liable for the cost of said proposed improvement are of sufficient value to pay the cost of said proposed improvement and that the said petition should be, and is hereby granted. And be it further.

RESOLVED, that the Town Engineer be directed to prepare detailed plans and specifications, a careful estimate of the cost and, with the assistance of the Town Attorney, a proposed form of contract covering said proposed public improvement and to submit the same to this board for its consideration.

The clerk then read the notice of hearing on the petition for the following local public improvement, to-wit,

The construction of park type lamp standards with underground conduits at an estimated cost of 25 cents per lineal foot of frontage in and along Concord Place from Cleveland Drive to a point 830 feet north from Cleveland Drive.

The Town Clerk submitted proof of publication of said notice of said hearing in the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News, the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga on the 22nd and 29th days of October, 1931, and his certificate of posting copies of said notice of hearing as required by statute on the 23rd day of October, 1931, and it was moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the notice of said hearing and the proof of publication and of posting thereof be placed on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga. Carried, Ayes 6, Noes 0.

The Chairman then announced that the hearing on the petition for the construction of park type standards with underground conduits in and along Concord Place from Cleveland Drive to a point 830 feet north from Cleveland Drive was open and that anyone who wished to speak upon the subject matter of said petition would be heard. No one spoke in opposition to the granting of said petition and all present were in favor of the granting of the same.

After all who wished to do so had spoken, the Chairman declared the hearing closed.

It was then moved by Milne, seconded by Walter, that the following be adopted:

WHEREAS, a petition, duly executed and acknowledged as required by statute, was heretofore presented to this board on the 19th day of October, 1931, asking the said board to cause the following named local public improvement, to-wit, park type lamp standards, with underground conduits, to be constructed and maintained in and along Concord Place from Cleveland Drive to a point 830 feet north from Cleveland Drive, at an estimated cost of 25 cents per lineal foot of frontage in and along said portion of said highway and

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WHEREAS, this board did duly adopt an order reciting the receipt of said petition and the estimated cost of the proposed improvement and did order a public hearing to be held upon the said petition on the 5th day of November, 1931.

WHEREAS, due notice of the time, place and purpose of the said hearing was duly published and posted as required by statute, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was duly held upon said petition this day now therefore, be it.

RESOLVED, that this board find and determine that the said petition, was duly executed and acknowledged as required by statute; that the respective parcels of land liable for the cost of said improvement are of sufficient value to pay the cost thereof and that public interest requires that the said petition be and the same is hereby granted. And be it further.

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be directed to cause park type lamp standards with underground conduits to be installed and maintained in and along Concord Place from Cleveland Drive to a point 830 feet north from Cleveland Drive and that the expense of said improvement be levied and spread against the respective parcels of land fronting or bounding in and along said portion of said Concord Place.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore borrow the sum of \$25,000.00, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, to pay valid claims duly audited by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of said town and did duly issue a certificate of indebtedness, dated as of the 10th day of August, 1931, for said sum of \$25,000.00, payable to the order of said Liberty Bank of Buffalo, which said certificate of indebtedness, by its terms, will become

due and payable on the 9th day of November, 1931, and it is necessary to renew the same, temporarily, pending the issuance and sale of bonds and the collection of the proceeds of the sale thereof, and the levy and collection of assessments; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the said sum of \$25,000.00, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, be borrowed, temporarily, from the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, and that the Supervisor be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute, issue and deliver, for and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga and under its corporate seal, a certificate of indebtedness for the sum of \$25,000.00, to be dated as of the 9th day of November, 1931, and to be payable to the order of the Liberty Bank of Buffalo, at its Broadway Branch Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, with interest thereon at the rate of six per centum per annum, within 90 days from its date. And be it further.

On Monday of this week the local Unemployment Relief Committee of the Board of Supervisors of Erie County received notification that their list of projects which were submitted to the Temporary Emergency Relief Administration had been approved, and that \$75,000, would be immediately available to be distributed on such projects. Yesterday the allotments which had been previously made by the chairman of the local committee to each project were approved by the entire committee at their meeting in the County Hall. The action of those two boards now makes available \$50,000. from the State funds to be paid in two allotments of \$25,000. each to two of the following projects.

Sewer system for the Village of Springville, sewer system for the Village of Alden, sewer system for the Village of Orchard Park, or Scajaquada Creek drain for the Town of Cheektowaga.

The local Board has received unofficial authorization that there will probably be available an additional \$50,000. to be allotted to these projects, so that there will be \$25,000. avail-

able for each.

On the list of approved projects accepted by the Temporary Emergency Relief Administration each of the above projects was estimated to cost \$125,000.

It is the wish of the Temporary Emergency Relief Administration that all projects get under way at once so as to give employment to those needing it. The State funds will not be available until a bond issue guaranteeing the payment of the remaining cost of the project is authorized by your Town.

In order to secure the quickest approval of this proposition by your Board, I would suggest that you get in touch with your Attorney and find out what steps have to be taken. It will probably be necessary to decide on a district which will pay for the improvement or decide if the Town as a whole would be liable for the project.

In talking with Art Leupold I find that the last estimate of \$125,000. on this job did not include all the items and that it would be necessary to appropriate approximately \$150,000. to finish the easterly end of the job. If this is the case it might be possible to get some additional beyond the \$25,000. allotment to apply on your particular project.

Your own local unemployed men can work on this project and when the matter received local publicity it is the suggestion of the Unemployment Committee that you have men out of work register with the Town Clerk, or any other proper official, so that when the work is started these men can have their applications approved and be ready to start.

If there is any further information you would like from our office we would be very glad to get it for you.

You will receive official notification from Mr. Brockett, chairman of the Erie County Unemployment Relief Committee, in the near future, if you have not already received same.



The full board and a quorum being present to transact any and all business that may come before the meeting. At 2 o'clock P.M., the Chairman called the meeting to order.

Moved by Inda, seconded by Walter, that the map showing the exchange of lands between the Fermoy Land Corporation and the Town of Cheektowaga be approved and filed in the Erie County Clerk's office.

Carried. Ayes 7, Noes 0.

Moved by Milne, seconded by Pawlak, that the following be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga did heretofore duly and lawfully issue, sell and deliver, upon its full faith and credit, bonds of said town to raise funds for various public improvements of general benefit within said town; and

WHEREAS, \$20,000.00 of the principal sum, and \$54,664.48, accrued interest, secured to be paid by the aforesaid bonds, will become due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1932; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga did duly and regularly appropriate a sum sufficient to pay the principal and interest secured by said bonds, as the same should become due and payable, to be raised by taxes to be levied upon and collected from the taxable property within the Town of Cheektowaga, and did duly prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie an estimate and a statement of the sum required to be levied and spread against the taxable property within the Town of Cheektowaga on the County tax roll of the County of Erie for the year 1931, for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors did duly and regularly levy and spread against the taxable property within the Town of Cheektowaga, on the County tax roll for the year 1931, a sum sufficient to pay the principal and interest secured by said bonds, which will mature on the 1st day of January, 1932; and

WHEREAS, there remain upon said tax roll for the current fiscal year of 1931, valid, uncollected taxes, aggregating the sum of approximately \$162,874.92 against the taxable property within the Town of Cheektowaga, which include the taxes levied and spread, as aforesaid, to raise the principal and interest secured by the aforesaid bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid taxes were, pursuant to the statute relating thereto, in or about the month of November, 1931 duly sold

to and purchased by the County of Erie and its County Treasurer, but the purchase price due and owing to the Town of Cheektowaga for said taxes, although duly demanded, has not been paid over to The Town of Cheektowaga by the County Treasurer of Erie County, and by reason of such default on the part of the County of Erie and of its County Treasurer, the Town of Cheektowaga has no available funds with which to pay the principal and interest secured by the aforesaid bonds, which will mature on the 1st day of January, 1932, and it is necessary to borrow a sum sufficient to pay the aforesaid principal and interest, temporarily, pending the collection of the moneys due the Town of Cheektowaga from the County of Erie; and

WHEREAS, the M. & T. Trust Company, of the City of Buffalo, New York, is willing to loan the sum required by the Town of Cheektowaga to meet its aforesaid obligations, provided, among other things, that it receive, as collateral security for said loan, and such interest as shall accrue thereon, an assignment of all the right, title and interest of the Town of Cheektowaga in and to the sum of \$162,874.92, now due and owing from the County of Erie and its County Treasurer, to the Town of Cheektowaga, as the purchase price of unpaid taxes and assessments against property within the said town, levied and spread upon the County Tax Roll of the County of Erie for the current fiscal year of 1931, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow the sum of \$74,664.48, and such interest as shall accrue thereon from M. & T. Trust Company, of Buffalo, for the purpose of paying principal and interest of bonded indebtedness of the said town which will become due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1932, and be it further

RESOLVED, that as security for said loan and as evidence thereof, the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, be and he is hereby, authorized and directed to execute, issue and deliver upon the faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga and under its corporate seal, one or more certificates of indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga of a par value not exceeding, in the aggregate, the sum of \$74,664.48, to be dated as of the 31st day of December, 1931, to bear interest from their date, at six per centum per annum, and to be payable to the order of the M. & T. Trust Company, at its Main Office, in the City of Buffalo, New York, within six months from the date of such certificate, or certificates, and which said certificate, or certificates, shall be countersigned by the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, who is hereby authorized and directed to countersign the same, and to impress thereon the corporate seal of said town. And be it further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, be and he is hereby, authorized and directed to execute, acknowledge and deliver, for and on behalf of this board and on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, and under the corporate seal of said town, such written instrument or instruments as shall be necessary, or proper to assign and transfer unto said M. & T. Trust Company, its successors, and assigns, as collateral and continuing security for the payment of the aforesaid certificate, or certificates, of indebtedness to be executed and delivered by the Town of Cheektowaga to the said M. & T. Trust Company, as hereinbefore recited, all of the right, title and interest of the Town of Cheektowaga in and to all money now due and owing and / or such as may hereafter become due and owing to the Town of Cheektowaga from the County of Erie and / or the County Treasurer of said county for or on account of unpaid taxes and assessments against property within the Town of Cheektowaga upon the County Tax Roll for said county for the year of 1931, heretofore purchased by and / or sold to said County of Erie, together with the right to said M. & T. Trust Company, in the event that the Town of Cheektowaga shall fail to

rapay to said M. & T. Trust Company, the said loan of \$74,664.48, or any part thereof upon its maturity, to collect the said moneys due and owing to said town from the County of Erie, in its own name or, in the name of the Town of Cheektowaga, in such lawful manner as it shall deem proper or expedient; it being provided, however, that the Town of Cheektowaga shall have and retain the right to demand, and collect its aforesaid claim against the County of Erie, as the agent of M. & T. Trust Company, unless and until it shall default in repaying its said loan to said M. & T. Trust Company, and it being further provided that, in the event of default on the part of the Town of Cheektowaga and the collection by the M. & T. Trust Company of the claim of said town against the County of Erie, the said M. & T. Trust Company, after deducting from the moneys so collected the sum, or sums, due to said bank as principal of its said loan, and such interest as shall have accrued thereon, together with the reasonable and lawful expenses necessarily incurred by said M. & T. Trust Company in making such collection, shall pay over the balance, if any, of said moneys so collected, to the Town of Cheektowaga.

The Town Attorney then presented a proposed form of assignment to be executed and delivered by the Town of Cheektowaga to M. & T. Trust Company as collateral security for the proposed loan of \$74,664.48 by said Trust Company to the Town of Cheektowaga, And it was

WHEREAS, the Town Superintendent of Highways has certified to this board that that portion of Broad Street, so-called, which lies within the bounds of premises owned by Help of Christians Roman Catholic Church Society of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, have been used for many years, last past, as a cemetery and have not been opened, worked or used by the public for upwards of six years, last past, and that the said lands are useless as a public highway and are not required for such use by the public; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this board make, execute, file and record in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, a certificate abandoning and disclaiming said portion of said Broad Street as a public highway.


