At 4 P. M. Standard Time the chairman called the meeting to order.

Moved by Judge Faber and seconded by Judge Pawlak that the following resolutions be adopted;

RESOLVED, that the regular meetings of this Board be held the first Monday in each month at 2 O'clock P. M. in the afternoon for the purpose of auditing accounts presented to the Town and the transaction of such business as may come before the Board, and be it further,

RESOLVED, that this Board also meet on the third Monday of each month for the purpose of transacting such business as may come before this Board. And be it further,

RESOLVED, that should any of such meeting fall on a legal holiday, then such meeting will be held on the following day at the same time.

and that the funds of the Town may be deposited therein, and that

that all checks, notes and other instruments for payment of money made or drawn by, or upon, or payable to, the Town shall be signed, or accepted or endorsed (other than for deposit) by the following named officer of the Town and in the manner stated "C. Chase Zalemski, Supervisor" and the said banks are hereby authorized to pay such checks, notes, other instrument for payment of money, and also to receive the same for deposit to the credit of, or in payment from any holder (including checks drawn to cash or bearer or to the individual order of the officer signing same) when so signed, or accepted, or endorsed, without inquiry of any kind, whether payable to or tendered for deposit to the credit of, or in payment of the obligation of any officer or officers of the corporation, or otherwise.

RESOLVED, that a bond be provided for the collection of State, County and Town Taxes as provided by Section 114 of the Town Law. Carried.

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Article 24, Section 500 of the Town Law, the Supervisor of the Town file a bond in the sum of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00) dollars, to inure to the benefit of the Town of Cheektowaga. Carried.

Moved by Judge Faber, seconded by Judge Pawlak, that the following resolutions be adopted;

RESOLVED, WHEREAS the records of this Board indicate that more than twenty-five taxpayers of the Town of Cheektowaga, pursuant to the provisions of Section 121 A of the Town Law, petitioned the Town Board, asking that a sum of money not exceeding one tenth of one percent of the assessed valuation of taxable property of said Town be raised annually for the purpose of defraying the expenses necessary for the preservation of the public peace of said Town and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of this Town in its regular meeting of November 16th, 1931, did pass the following resolutions;

"WHEREAS, a petition has been presented to this Board by more than twenty-five taxpayers of the Town of Cheektowaga, pursuant to the provisions of Section 121-A of the Town Law, asking that a sum of money, not exceeding one-tenth of one per centum of the assessed valuation of taxable property of said Town be raised annually for the purpose of defraying the expenses necessary for the preservation of the public peace of the said town; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 465 of the Town Law, as last amended by Chapter 710 of the Laws of 1931, constables appointed by this Board as peace officers of the Town of Cheektowaga, pursuant to the provisions of Section 121-A of the Town Law, may not be removed from the police force to which they shall have been appointed, except for incompetency or misconduct shown after a hearing upon due notice upon stated charges; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable in the public interest that secure and continuous tenure of office, during competency and good

behavior, be given to police officers, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the hereinafter named duly qualified persons, who are now constables of the Town of Cheektowaga and who now constitute the police force of the said town, be, and they are hereby appointed as constables and police officers of the Town of Cheektowaga, of the respective rank set opposite their names, pursuant to the provisions of Section 121-A of the Town Law, as modified and amended by Section 465 of the Town Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 465 of the Town Law, to hold office during good behavior and competency subject to removal for incompetency or misconduct shown after a hearing upon due notice upon stated charges, only, and with the right to review by certiorari any action that may be taken for their removal or the removal of any of them, and that each of said officers shall continue to receive a salary at the rate set opposite the name of such respective officer to-wit;

The foregoing motion having been put to a vote, Six members of the Board voted "aye" and Justice Pawlak voted "no".

The Chairman then declared the motion and resolution duly adopted."

WHEREAS, the total assessed valuation of said Township is the sum of \$24,973.25 dollars, and

WHEREAS, one-tenth of one per cent of said assessed valuation is the sum of \$24,973.25 dollars, and

WHEREAS, the total salaries of the Chief Constable and Constables as set forth in the aforesaid resolution is the total sum of \$27,599.88, and

WHEREAS, the expenditures for Town Police, Police material and supplies, automobile, motorcycle maintenance and other expenses for the year of 1930 amounted to \$1,935.97 dollars, making a total expenditure of \$29,535.85 dollars, and

WHEREAS, if the police force is continued on the same basis for the year of 1932, it is estimated that the total expenditure would be the sum of approximately \$29,535.85 dollars, which would be \$4,562.60 dollars over and above the sum of \$24,973.25 dollars which is one-tenth of one per cent of the annual assessment of the Town, and

WHEREAS, Section 465 of the Town Law provides that the Town Board provide for compensation per diem or by the week, month, or otherwise in its discretion, but not exceeding at the rate of One Hundred and Fifty (\$150.00) dollars per month, for any constable or special constable, and not exceeding the rate of Two Hundred (\$200.00) dollars, per month for such Chief Constable appointed, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid resolution appointing John F. Mersman, exceeds the rate prescribed by law by Sixteen dollars and sixty-six cents (\$16.66) and is therefore contrary to law, and

WHEREAS, it is desirable in the public interests that the aforesaid laws be complied with and that expenses be kept at a minimum, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the aforesaid resolution of November 16, 1931, purporting to appoint, name, designate and fix the salary of the aforesaid Chief Constable and Constables, be and hereby is reconsidered and rescinded.

The foregoing motion having been put to a vote, six members of the Board voted "aye", and Justice Milne voted "no".

The Chairman then declared the resolution and motion duly adopted.

Moved by Faber, seconded by Mr. Eberl, that the following resolution is adopted;

WHEREAS, it is desirable that in the public interests a proper police protection be given to the Township under competent supervision and at minimum cost to the taxpayers, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Amedeo L. Cappola, Chief Constable of the Town of Cheektowaga, be, and he hereby is removed from his office and rank as Chief Constable and he hereby is reduced to the rank of Constable to serve at the pleasure of this Town Board to receive a salary hereinafter named, and

Moved by Judge Pawlak, and seconded by Judge Piatek that the following resolution be adopted;

RESOLVED, that Charles Wohlford Jr., be, and he hereby is appointed Chief Constable and is to receive a monthly salary of One Hundred and Seventy-five (\$175.00) dollars.

Moved by Judge Pawlak, seconded by Judge Faber that the following resolution be adopted;

RESOLVED, that Peter Weber, be, and he hereby is appointed Constable at a yearly salary of Eighteen Hundred (\$1,800.00) dollars.

The following is a copy of letter as presented to this Board.
TO THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, N.Y.

Gentlemen:-

On behalf of such of the peace officers of the Town of Cheektowaga as have been adversely affected by the action taken by your Board today, the undersigned respectfully notified your Board that such peace officers claim the protection afforded to them by Section 465 of the Town Law.

And further that all such peace officers of the Town of Cheektowaga claim the protection afforded to them by Section 22 of the Civil Service Law, each of them having served either as volunteer fireman for the full term required by law, or having served as soldiers, sailors or marines in the World War, thereafter receiving an honorable discharge from such service.

On behalf of such peace officers I beg to protest against the action taken by your Honorable Board, and demand that the action taken be immediately rescinded. In the meantime all such peace officers will hold themselves in readiness to discharge the duties of peace officers, and demand that their status as peace officers, as aforesaid, be recognized by your Board and by the Town.
