WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga has heretofore adopted plans and specifications and entered into contracts for the execution of certain improvement work, to wit: Aris and Crestfield sewer, Pine Ridge Road sewer, Concord sewer and Concord paving and



**RULES, ORDERS and REGULATIONS OF THE  
POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA,  
ERIE COUNTY, N.Y. AS READ BY THE TOWN CLERK.**

Pursuant to a resolution heretofore adopted by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga at a regular meeting held in the Town Hall of the Town of Cheektowaga on the 30th day of June, 1932, the provisions of Chapter 616 of the Laws of 1932, were made applicable to the Town of Cheektowaga, and a Police force was organized consisting of a Chief of Police and eleven patrolmen, and such other persons as may be appointed by the Town Board, When such members are so appointed to the Police Department, they shall have all of the powers and be subject to all the duties and liability of town constables and peace officers in all criminal and civil actions and proceedings and special proceedings of a criminal nature.

**RULE I.**

The government and discipline of the Police Department shall be such as the Town Board may from time to time, by rules, orders and regulations prescribe.

**RULE II.**

The territorial jurisdiction and authority of the Police force are co-extensive with the territorial limits of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York.

**RULE III.**

The Town Board, is empowered to enact, modify and repeal from time to time, rules, orders and regulations for the general management and discipline of the force, provided they shall not conflict with the Constitution of the United States or the Statutes of the State of New York or in the Ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga.

**RULE IV.**

For the purposes of Police, Government, the territory of the Town of Cheektowaga is divided into patrol beats, or posts, by the Chief of Police, subject to alterations, from time to time by like authority.

**RULE V.**

Persons hereinafter appointed by the Town Board to serve on the Town Police force must be citizens of good moral character, not over thirty-five years (35) of age and never convicted of a felony and must pass the Civil Service Examination as provided by the Laws of the State of New York, with the exception of Special School officers and Special Fire officers, appointed by the Town Board to act in that special service only.

**RULE VI.**

The Chief of Police shall be the Chief executive officer of the Police force. He shall have the sole control of the force and shall be held responsible for the conduct and deportment of

every member of the Police force.

It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to enforce in the Town of Cheektowaga all the laws of the State and County and the ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga including the Rules and Regulations governing the Board of Health and the Police Department.

The Chief of Police shall promptly prefer charges in every case of dereliction of duty on the part of any member of the Police force coming to his knowledge. He shall also report to the Town Board an account of any special services, or action deemed meritorious, of any officer or policeman under his command.

The Chief of Police shall be held strictly accountable for the return of all property belonging to the Town in case any policeman is discharged, removed or severs his connection with the Police Department.

#### RULE VII.

Vacancies occurring among officers, other than special officers, shall be filled in accordance with the Civil Service Law.

#### RULE VIII.

Any officer or member of the Force shall be subject to reprimand, suspension or dismissal for any of the following causes;

1. Intoxication while on duty.
2. Disobedience of orders.
3. Indecent, profane or harsh language.
4. Disrespect to a superior officer.
5. Unnecessary violence to prisoners.
6. Leaving post without just cause.
7. Not properly patrolling post.
8. Incompetency, lack of energy, or suffering from mental or physical incapacity making him unfit for service.
9. Entering liquor saloons, or gambling houses, except in discharge of duty.
10. Sleeping on duty.
11. Neglect of duty.
12. Violation of any criminal law.
13. For making known the proposed action or movement of the Force, or the provisions of any orders to persons outside of the force.
14. For violation of any rule, order, or regulation.
15. Conduct unbecoming a member of the Force tending to demoralize the same or any member thereof and bringing the same into disrepute.

#### RULE IX.

No member of the Police force of whatever rank, shall be removed except for incompetency or misconduct shown after a hearing upon due notice. Any member of the force may be immediately dismissed therefrom against whom any of the following charges may be substantiated.

1. Receiving money or other valuable things contrary to the Rule, orders and Regulations of this Department or the Statutes of the State of New York.
2. Non-compliance with the Rules, Orders and Regulations.
3. Inefficiency or neglect of duty.
4. Maltreating or using unnecessary violence against a prisoner or citizen.
5. The power of dismissal and reprimand either of an officer or another member of the force shall rest solely with the Town Board, which power is not to be exercised except after a complaint is filed in writing specifying the distinct violation or violations the member of the force is charged with. The member so charged may be suspended pending a hearing by either the Chief or Town Board.

Each member against whom one or more charges are brought shall be given a hearing by the Town Board. Before such hearing is

held a copy of the charges shall be furnished the member against whom they are made and the member shall be given at least five (5) days time after receiving a copy of the charges to prepare his defense. He shall then be given a notice fixing the time of the hearing and giving him ample opportunity to defend himself and to produce witnesses and other proof in his defense, after which hearing the decision of the Town Board, if one of removal, shall be subject to the right of review by certiorari.

#### RULE X.

**DUTIES OF PATROLMEN:** The prevention of crime being the most important object in view, the patrolman's exertions must be constantly used to accomplish this end. He must examine and make himself perfectly acquainted with every part of his post, and vigilantly watch every description of persons passing his way, and he must to the utmost of his power, prevent the commission of assaults, breaches of the peace and other crimes about to be committed.

1. He must take particular notice of all persons, all taxis and other vehicles the movements of which excite suspicion and he must see that all traffic regulations and ordinances are obeyed.
2. A patrolman must constantly patrol his post; he must not leave his post except in discharge of police duty, nor shall he enter any building, except in the execution of this duty.
3. Police officers absent from duty because of sickness, must either obtain a physician's certificate or tender some satisfactory reason and cause the same to be delivered to the Chief of Police.
4. Each member of the Force, at all times, when entering upon duty, must be neat and clean in person.

#### RULE XI.

Special Fire Police and Special School Police shall be subject to all the Rules, orders and regulations when on active duty, and be subject to the Chief of Police or any officer of the department when called upon, with the exception that they will not be required to wear a uniform, but while on duty they must display their badge in a conspicuous place upon their person.

#### RULE XII.

All patrolmen, when on duty shall appear in uniform except when it may be necessary for the public interest to appear in citizen's clothes.

#### RULE XIII.

The Chief of Police shall designate two patrolmen who will act as Lieutenants, and in the absence of the Chief of Police he will designate the Lieutenant to assume command of the force and have all of the duties, privileges and requirements of the Chief of Police while so acting.

#### RULE XIV.

The following General Rules and Orders for the Department are hereinafter specifically set forth.

1. All officers and members of the force shall be deemed to be always on duty, subject to such relief therefrom as shall be allowed by the Chief.
2. Officers and members of the force shall not leave their posts unless regularly relieved except upon orders of their respective superiors, nor shall any officer or member of the force enter any building while on duty, except in execution of strict police work.

3. Officers and members of the Police force are strictly prohibited from active participation in politics. Any violation of this rule shall be punishable by fine or expulsion upon the option of the Town Board.
4. Officers and members of the force shall pay particular attention to all public buildings, automobiles, cabs and other vehicles at night which, under any circumstances excite suspicion and to immediately report to the Chief or Lieutenant on duty and take such other action as they may deem advisable.
5. Officers or members on duty shall report in person or by signal at Police Headquarters at least four (4) times every night unless otherwise ordered by the Chief of acting Lieutenant on duty, \_\_\_\_\_ (time).
6. Police officers and members of the force must at all times refrain from harsh, violent, coarse, profane or insolent language, and when required act with firmness and sufficient energy to perform their duty.
7. When any person charges another with the commission of crime, the police officer to whom the complaint is made shall require the complainant to accompany him with the accused to Police Headquarters.
8. Each member of the force shall, at all times, have with him a record book, in which he shall enter the names of the persons taken in charge by him, and such particulars as will be important on the trial of the case and also such other matters or reports which he may deem important, When any person is taken into custody it shall be the duty of the officer in charge of Police Headquarters to make a record of all property or money taken from the prisoner.
9. All persons taken to Police Headquarters must be thoroughly searched before being confined in the cells.
10. Members of the Department shall not render any assistance in civil cases, except to prevent an immediate breach of the Peace or quell a disturbance actually commenced.
11. No member of the force shall arrest or assist in making an arrest upon a warrant issued by the United States except in cases of request by United States Marshal.
12. No member of the Police force shall accept from any person while in custody or after he shall have been discharged, or from any one of his friends, any gratuity, reward or gift directly or indirectly, nor shall he receive from any person compensation for damages sustained in the discharge of his duties except by permission of the Town Board.
13. Members of the force shall carry upon their persons at all times a loaded revolver, a pair of handcuffs and a billie.
14. No member of the force shall, while wearing the police uniform and while on duty use tobacco in any form in the presence of the public.
15. All officers and members of the force must wear their Police shields upon their persons at all times.
16. Every member of the Police force shall at all times be quiet, civil and orderly in his conduct and deportment and shall at no time conduct himself in a manner unbecoming an officer and a gentleman.
17. No member of the Police force shall communicate, except to such person or persons as directed by the Chief or superior officer, any police information, nor any regulation, nor any other information of a confidential nature.

18. Every member of the Police force shall acquaint himself thoroughly with the duties of his office, or to which he is detailed or assigned and shall perform his duties properly and with care and attention.
19. All motorcycles, automobiles or any vehicles or apparatus belonging to the Police Department shall be stored upon property designated by the Town Board and shall not leave the confines of the Town except when necessary and then only upon the consent of the Chief or a superior officer.
20. Officers and members of the Police force must not encourage crime by waiting for such perpetration, but must prevent by immediate intervention.
21. Any question or proposition which may arise and which is not covered by these rules, orders and regulations shall be referred to the chief or superior officers, whose orders shall be final until action shall be taken by the Town Board.
22. No one except a member of the Police force, unless upon orders from the Chief, or superior officer shall be allowed to ride or become a passenger upon or in any motor vehicle owned by controlled by the Police Department.
23. Any officer or member of the force arresting any person who is charged with a criminal offense shall be brought before the Chief, acting Lieutenant or acting Desk Officer where a complete written record of the case shall be immediately made and entered.
24. All arrests made by any officer or member of the Police force shall be immediately reported to Police Headquarters.

#### RULE XV.

Ignorance of these rules, orders and regulations of the part of any officer or member of the Police force will not be deemed any excuse for violation of the letter or spirit of these rules, orders and regulations and shall be deemed just cause for immediate dismissal pending a hearing as provided hereinbefore.

Judge Pawlak offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was duly seconded by Judge Faber.

WHEREAS, heretofore and on or about the 30th day of June, 1932, a Police Department was created in this Town of Cheektowaga, pursuant to Chapter 616 of the Laws of 1932,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the rules, orders and regulations for the government, discipline, administration and disposition of the Police Department of this Town of Cheektowaga and members thereof, be and the same hereby is duly adopted as read, to become effective immediately and the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to have the said Rules, Orders and Regulations printed and copies of the same distributed to each member of the Town Police force and a copy thereof duly posted in a conspicuous place in the Town Police Headquarters.

WHEREAS, there being no reasonable objection to the formation of the said district as set forth in the petition, with the exception of the objection of one Anna Schultz, who objects to the inclusion of certain portions of land owned by her, which are now in acreage and asks that they be excluded therefrom, and it appearing that said lands will derive no benefit at this time from the formation of the aforesaid district.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the petition be, and the same hereby is granted and a district for the purpose of the collection and disposition of all ashes, refuse, or other indestructible matter, swill, or garbage, hereby is created, the boundaries of which are described as follows;

ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND, situated in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York described as follows;

BEGINNING at a point in farm lot No. 35, Township 11, Range 7, Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, said point being the intersection of the center line of Sugar Road, and the

west line of the Township of Cheektowaga, thence easterly along the center line of Sugar Road, to the northeast corner of lands now or formerly owned by Joseph Sahlen, thence southerly along the east line to a point of 395 feet more or less from the center line of Sugar Road, thence westerly from said point to a point 409 feet more or less from the east line of said land thence southerly along the east line of said lands 541 feet more or less to the southeast corner of said lands, thence easterly along the north line of the Sub-division called Delavan Acres, cover 1389 filed in the Erie County Clerk's Office to the northeast corner of the Sub-division thence southerly along the east line of said Sub-division also the east line of land now or formerly owned by School District No. 11 also along the east line of the Sub-division known as the Long Sub-division cover 475 filed in the Erie County Clerk's Office, to the southwest corner of the lands now or formerly owned by Mt. Hope Cemetery thence easterly along the said Cemetery land to the center line of Pine Ridge Road, thence southerly along the center line of Pine Ridge Road to the center line of Genesee Street, thence northeasterly along the center line of Genesee Street to the west line of a sub-division known as the Beach Land Sub-division cover 1266 filed in the Erie County Clerk's Office, thence northerly along the west line of said Sub-division, thence easterly along the north line of said Sub-division, to the northeast corner of said Sub-division, thence southerly along a line 300 feet south of the south line of Genesee Street and parallel to Genesee Street to the center line of Mildred Street, thence southerly along the center line of Mildred Drive to the north line of lands now or formerly owned by Louis Schies, thence westerly along the north line of said lands to the southeast corner of a Sub-division known as Pine Ridge Heights No. 2 cover No. 1469 filed in Erie County Clerk's Office, thence westerly along the south line of said Sub-division to the center line of Harlem Road, thence northerly along the center line of Harlem Road, to the southeast corner of a Sub-division known as Pine Ridge Heights No. 1 cover No. 1417 filed in the Erie County Clerk's Office, thence westerly along the south line of said Sub-division to the northeast corner of Sub-division known as Loeb Sub-division, cover 698 filed in Erie County Clerk's Office, thence southerly along the east line of said Sub-division to the southeast <sup>corner</sup> of said Sub-division, thence westerly along the south line of said Sub-division, to the center line of Pine Ridge Road, thence southerly along the center line of Pine Ridge Road to the southeast corner of the Sub-division known as the Baehre Tract, cover No. 1040 filed in Erie County Clerk's Office, thence westerly along the south line of said Sub-division to the northeast corner of the Sub-division filed in the Erie County Clerk's office under cover No. 729, thence southerly along the east line of said Sub-division to the southwest corner, thence northerly along the west line of said Sub-division to the southeast corner of the lands now or formerly owned by George P. Urban, thence westerly along the south line of said lands to the southwest corner of said lands, this point being the intersection of said line with the west line of Town of Cheektowaga, thence northerly along the west line of Town of Cheektowaga to place of beginning.

Notice is further given that a hearing upon the establishment of the portions of the Town of Cheektowaga hereinbefore described as a district for the collection of and disposition of ashes, refuse, or other indestructible matter, swill or garbage, pursuant to Chapter 470 of the Laws of 1926, will be held at the Town Hall of the Town of Cheektowaga on the 30th day of September, 1932, at 7 o'clock P.M. (Eastern Standard Time) at which time full opportunity to be heard will be granted to all interested persons.

If at such hearing the Town Board shall determine it to be in the public interest to grant the relief sought in any or all of said petitions, either in whole or in part, and to establish the districts in accordance with said Chapter 470 of the Laws of 1926, a further public hearing will be held at the same time and place pursuant to Section 477-A of the Town Law to consider a contract with either persons or corporations for the collection and disposition of the waste matter hereinbefore described or such other method of collection and disposition as shall be most advantageous to the districts and the inhabitants and taxpayers thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the aforesaid District be known as garbage and refuse district number four, Pine Hill.

Carried. Ayes -7- Noes -0-

The question was raised by several taxpayers as to the disposition of garbage and other refuse, and if the Town was going to collect same, or let it out by contract.

After some discussion on this subject the following resolution was adopted.

On motion of Eberl, and seconded by Pawlak, it was,

RESOLVED, That the Town Attorney prepare specifications for the disposition of garbage and other refuse matter to be submitted to various bidders and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and he hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for sealed bids for the collection and disposal of garbage and refuse in garbage and refuse districts number "one" "two" "three" and "four" of the Town of Cheektowaga, said bids to be submitted to the Town Clerk at the Town Hall, at or before 8 P.M. October 7th, 1932 and to be opened by the Town Board at or after that hour, and that the Town Board reserves the right to accept or refuse any and all bids.
