On motion of Eberl, seconded by Pawlak the following building petitions were granted and the Town Clerk was duly authorized to issue permits for same, Louise F. Communication from Kensington Post No. 708 to Charles Wohlford, Jr., Chief of Police, thanking him for the cooperation his department gave them at their recent air circus at the Becker Field was presented and read and on motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl this communication was ordered received and filed. Carried.

Communication from Allied Societies of St. John Gualberts Parish to Police Chief, Charles Wohlford, extending to him and his department their sincere gratitude for his efforts and influence to help make their celebration in the Walden Avenue District on Sunday, September 25, a success and also for the splendid police protection during their parade was read, and on motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl this communication was ordered received and filed. An invitation from the Central Council of Citizens and Taxpayers Assn. inviting the Town Board to attend their next regular meeting to be held October 12th, at 8 O'clock P.M. was on motion of Pawlak, seconded by Eberl ordered received and filed and accepted.

On motion of Sturm and seconded by Eberl the following resolution was duly adopted.

RESOLVED, that the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga urge upon the Public Service Commission in the interest of Public Safety and welfare that no order be issued requiring the introduction of steeper grades than those now specified as four-tenths of one-percent, within the confines of Transit Road and its intersection with the New York Central Railroad Company, Lehigh Valley Railroad Company, and the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company, Erie Railroad Company, and further that it is respectfully urged upon the Public Service Commission that no so called humps be allowed to remain in the space between the Erie Railroad and the other railroad tracks, for the reason that we believe that a hump will create a hazardous or most as dangerous a condition as now exists, and that the elimination with such a specification would not be for the best interest of all concerned.

On motion of Sturm, seconded by Eberl the communications from Carlton A. Fisher, Town Attorney to Supervisor Zalemski, relative to Public Service Commission order case No. 6131, Harlem Avenue crossing of the West Shore were ordered received and filed.

On motion of Sturm, seconded by Faber the communication from the Public Service Commission relative to grade crossing elimination at William and South Ogden being case No. 4786 was ordered received and filed.

On motion of Pawlak, seconded by Faber the following resolution was duly adopted,

RESOLVED, that the Town Board advertise for sealed bids for the collection and disposal of garbage and refuse in garbage and refuse districts number "One" "Two" "Three" and "Four" of the Town of Cheektowaga, Said bids to be submitted to the Town Clerk at the Town Hall at or before 8 P.M., October 7, 1932 and to be opened by the Town Board at or after that hour.

The Town Board reserves the right to accept or refuse any and all bids.

The bids must conform to the following specifications;

1. The contractor, by weekly collection, to collect and dispose of all garbage and refuse placed at the curb in proper containers, garbage, papers, ashes, tin cans and other refuse.

2. The contractor to employ only residents of Cheektowaga in the collection thereof.

(b) To pay said employees the prevailing wage for such labor.

(c) To discharge upon then (10) days notice in writing from the Town Board any employee who is not satisfactory to them.

(d) To either incinerate or remove all garbage from the Town, unless the dumping place in the Town is approved by the Town Board.

(e) If said garbage is to be removed, to be hauled in proper conveyances, not detrimental to the public health, and to be covered when going through certain portions of the Town, if ordered by the Town Board.

(f) To furnish a surety bond of a duly authorized Surety Company, approved by the Town Board in the amount of \$5,000.00, saving the Town of Cheektowaga and the aforesaid garbage districts harmless from any and all damages arising out of the collection and disposition of the garbage and refuse, unless otherwise ordered by the Town Board.

(g) Contract to run for one (1) year from January 1, 1933.

3. Payments on contract to be made monthly in equal installments.

4. Certified Check of \$250.00 payable to the Town of Cheektowaga must accompany bid and to be held and become the property of the Town in the event of the failure of the bidder to execute and deliver to the Town a contract for the amount of his bid within 5 days, in the event the said bid is accepted by the Town.





The following resolutions were adopted to wit;

On motion of Judge Milne and seconded by Judge Piatek the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga enter into a contract with the New York State Electric & Gas Corporation to operated and maintain for five (5) years, commencing October 1, 1932, the following street lamps:

- 44- 4000 lumen, suspension type lamps, at \$60.00 per lamp per year.
- 12- 4000 lumen, highway type lamps at \$55.00 per lamp per year.
- 11-4000 lumen, eternalite type lamps, at \$55.00 per lamp per year.
- 87-4000 lumen, highway type lamps at \$50.00 per lamp per year.
- 16-2500 lumen, ornamental lamps at \$60.00 per lamp per year.
- 27-2500 lumen, suspension type lamps at \$45.00 per lamp per year.
- 137-2500 lumen semi-ornamental lamps, at \$45.00 per lamp per year.
- 23-1000 lumen, bracket type lamps, at \$33.50 per lamp per year.
- 569-1000 lumen, bracket type lamps, at \$30.00 per lamp per year.

Except that for the period from October 1, 1932 to October 1, 1933, such of said lamps as are set out on Schedule "A" attached to the contract hereinafter named are not to be lighted by the party of the first part, and no charge therefor is to be made, but from Oct. 1, 1933 to the end of this contract the lamps set out in said Schedule "A" are to be lighted and the Town is to pay therefor at the prices above specified.

Upon written order of the Town, said corporation is to furnish and install additional lamps as follows:

- 1000 lumen lamps, spaced on an average starting from an existing lamp 375 feet, at \$30.00 per lamp per year.
- 1000 lumen lamps, spaced on an average starting from an existing lamp 750 feet, at \$33.50 per lamp per year.
- 2500 lumen lamps, spaced on an average starting from an existing lamp 500 feet at \$45.00 per lamp per year.
- 2500 lumen semi-ornamental lamps, spaced on an average starting from an existing lamp 150 feet, at \$45.00 per lamp per year.
- 4000 lumen lamps, spaced on an average starting from an existing lamp 750 feet, at \$60.00 per lamp per year.
- 4000 lumen highway type lamps, spaced on an average starting from an existing lamp 250 feet at \$50.00 per lamp per year.

The contract hereby ordered has already been prepared, is now before the Board, embodies the above provisions and others usual in such contracts, and the Supervisor is hereby ordered and directed to execute the same, and the Town Clerk to attest the same.

The Supervisor called the meeting to order and stated that the purpose of the meeting was to have a public hearing on the 1933 budget previously filed by the Supervisor. The Town Clerk then read the proof of posting and publishing of the notices of the hearing and followed that by reading of the proposed budget estimates as hereto filed in his office. After the reading of the aforesaid, the Supervisor asked if there were any objections as to the estimates as read.

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William J. O'Connor, Esq., Attorney at Law, appeared and stated that he represented the following taxpayers; General American Tank Car Co., Daigler Sand and Gravel Corp., Dr. Victor Reinstein, Bishop Land Co., Bellevue Land Co., and that he was unofficially voicing the opinion of several public utilities which he did not name. Mr. O'Connor objected to the estimates as follows:

He stated that the item of \$1500 for the printing of records of briefs and other expenses of the Town Attorney was, in his estimation, too high.

Carlton A. Fisher, Town Attorney, replied that for many years this expense has exceeded the sum of \$2000 and that there were a great many appeals and actions pending at this time and that the cost of printing same, he estimated to be at \$1500.

Mr. O'Connor further objected to the figure of \$6000 for the contingent fund for special services included and consulting engineers, legislative, grade crossing, reporting services, approving opinions, etc.

The Supervisor, answering this objection, stated that in previous years items included under this fund had been double this amount and that in his opinion the sum of \$6000 was exceedingly low.

Mr. O'Connor further objected to the item of \$1500 listed under Town House for telephone.

The Supervisor answering that objection, explained that the telephone service at the Town House had exceeded that amount for the past several years, and in taxes was more or less a fixed charge.

Mr. O'Connor then called attention to the fact that there was an item for telephone under the heading of protection of persons and property in the amount of \$1854.

Supervisor Zalemski stated that that item was erroneously listed under private telephone service and stated that there was no private telephone service being paid for by the Town and that the item of \$1854 was for the payment of the contract price to the telephone company for call boxes and signal systems previously contracted for.

Mr. O'Connor further objected to the item of \$4000 for Emergency Relief.

Supervisor Zalemski answered that and stated that in order for the Town to receive the benefits of the vast amounts of moneys which the State of New York is appropriating to the Towns and it is necessary for the Town, in order to receive the benefits of this money

from the State, to appropriate a sum of money, and that he considered \$4000 would be necessary for this purpose.

Mr. O'Connor further objected to the item of \$3900 for salaries of special assessment clerks.

Supervisor Zalemski explained that the item was listed under possibly a misleading caption and that it should be changed to read, Clerks for Engineering Services and Preparations of Tax Rolls. That the Clerks worked practically the entire year for the Town doing engineering and tax roll services and that this item was practically one half of what it had been previous years.

Mr. O'Connor further objected to the item of \$1000 for the expense in connection with paying bonds and coupons.

Supervisor Zalemski explained that when the bonds were originally sold several years ago, the Irving Trust Company of New York City and the M & T Trust Company of Buffalo, New York, were designated as paying agents and that an agreement was entered into at that time, to pay a fee for this service commensurate with the work and that this Town Board could do nothing about reducing that sum.

Mr. O'Connor further objected to the item of \$1000 for compensation of extra clerks to the Receiver of Taxes.

Supervisor Zalemski explained that during the period of March, April, and May and also during the period of October and November, when the County and also the School taxes are being collected, that it is hardly possible for the Receiver of Taxes to do justice to the taxpayers without the assistance of extra clerks during those rush periods.

Mr. O'Connor further objected to the payment of the certificate of indebtedness to the Liberty Bank of Buffalo in the sum of \$63,122.85 and to the certificate of indebtedness payable to the M & T Trust Company of Buffalo, \$26,072.95. His objection was based on the fact that the state auditor's report shows that at the meeting prior to the issuance of this certificate which was originally dated and issued on December 17, 1930, the audited claims of the Town audited at that particular meeting only amounted to approximately \$4945 and that possibly the balance of that note was issued for special district improvement.

Supervisor Zalemski explained that the state auditor's report was misleading and that a careful examination of the audited bills, audited prior to that meeting, which show a sum much larger than \$4945 and that there is nothing in the records of the Town which indicate that the moneys received from the bank on that certificate were used for any other purposes than town purposes and that moneys were not appropriated, the records indicate, to any special district use, and as to the \$26,000 note of the M & T Trust Company, that represented audited claims.

Mr. O'Connor objected to the interest item on general town bonds being included in the 1933 budget.

Supervisor Zalemski answering that objection, stated that the interest was an obligation that was due during the year 1933 and that even though a portion of this interest accrues during the year 1932, nevertheless, it falls due on July 1, 1933 and it is necessary to pay it at that time and that due to the fact that the Town is on a cash basis and not an accrual basis that that amount of interest must be included in the 1933 budget.

Mr. O'Connor stated that he had no further objections other than those above mentioned and Supervisor Zalemski then stated that his objections would be given due consideration and would be acted upon by the Board as a whole at the subsequent meeting.

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Joseph Kaszubowski, Esq., appeared as Attorney for the Village of Depew and made the following objections.

He objected to the item of \$24,794.00 for the protection of persons and property being spread over the whole town including the Village of Depew and stated that the taxpayers of the Village of Depew did not think it fair to spread any portion of that item against the property located in the Village.

Carlton A. Fisher, the Town Attorney, explained that in his opinion, the law required the spreading of the taxes against the entire township and that if the Board of Trustees of the Villages saw fit to have additional private protection that they, of course, would have to pay for that themselves, as the law now stood but he further stated that he would be glad to confer with Mr. Kaszubowski, also the Attorney for the Village of Sloan and the matter would be given every consideration.

Supervisor Zalemski then stated that for the past nine years, upon the recommendation of the former Supervisor, John C. Stiglmeier, taxes were levied for the police department over the entire township including both the Villages of Depew and Sloan and that even last year when it was presented to the people that the sum of \$18,500 was to be levied and raised against that portion of the Town exempting the Villages, and that the general town taxpayer was still paying a portion of the police tax for the reason that it cost approximately \$36,000 the previous years to maintain and supply the police department, and that the former Supervisor either had been half right one year or wrong nine years, or, he had been half wrong one year and right nine years, but, Supervisor Zalemski stated that he would be glad to abide by the opinion of the Town Attorney after he had conferred with the Attorneys for the Villages of Depew and Sloan and that the item would not be acted upon until the next meeting.

Michael Stachewicz, a taxpayer, then stated that he worked for the railroad company who maintained their own police and had to pay for their police even though they were one of the largest taxpayers of the Town and he thought it was also proper to have it charged to the entire town and he further asked Mr. O'Connor where his clients had been during the past ten years voicing objections.

Mr. Samuel Gajewski, Village Trustee representing the Village Board of Sloan, appeared and made a similar objection on behalf of the Village of Sloan and Supervisor Zalemski stated that Sloan would be given the same consideration as the Village of Depew was given and suggested that the Town Attorney also get in touch with the Attorney for the Village of Sloan and see what his wishes were in the matter and report at the next Town Board meeting.

Mrs. Tillie Durringer, a taxpayer, then asked the Supervisor if it was true that the services of the town police were available to the residents of the Incorporated Villages.

Supervisor Zalemski stated that it was true that they were available to the entire township.

She then stated that there was no taxation without representation.

Isidore Mazurowski appeared as Secretary of the Central Council of Citizens and Taxpayers Association and also as a representative of the Walden Citizens and Taxpayers Association and made the following objections.

He objected to the item of \$300 set forth as fees to the Health Officer and the \$225 set forth for the Board of Health rental of health station and other expense, claiming that the Village of Sloan was a poor location for the Board of Health.

Supervisor Zalemski replied that the item of \$300 was for fees allowed by the state law to the Health Officer for extra inoculation purposes and for the prevention work of contagious diseases and that the item of \$225 was for the partial maintenance of the clinic and that the Town only contributed one half of that amount and that inasmuch as the Village of Sloan contributed the other half that they would object strenuously to the moving of the clinic from that village and still having to pay one half of the item, and that under the circumstances it was possibly best to let the clinic remain where it was at the present time for the amount expended toward it.

Mr. Mazurowski further objected to the item of \$2500 for the retirement system.

Supervisor Zalemski explained that that was an item regulated by state law and that possibly the item would be larger than that but it was merely an estimate on the part of the Town Board and that it was his intention to make an effort to have the Legislature give some relief to the Town in connection with this retirement system and for an act passed that would enable the Town to withdraw from this system as far as any new employees were concerned.

Mr. Mazurowski replied that the Central Council was ready and willing to cooperate on any such movement.

Mr. James Boothroy, a taxpayer of the Town of Cheektowaga, objected to the retirement system and stated that when the Town Board, after the election in November, 1931 immediately elected a resolution to go under the retirement system, that in his opinion, that was taxation without representation and that they should have let it be voted upon by the people.

Mr. Boothroy further objected to the Town assuming any special district debts and that they should not be included in the General Town Fund.

Supervisor Zalemski replied that they were not included and every effort is being made to place the proper charges in each district.

Mr. Joseph Bianchi, a taxpayer of the Town of Cheektowaga, voiced his objection to the retirement system and asked the Supervisor if it was not true that instead of the general fund being burdened by special district obligations that the general fund actually owed the special districts quite a sum of money.

Supervisor Zalemski replied that that was true and that according to the state auditor's report the balance sheet shows the general fund owing the special districts the sum of approximately \$53,000 and in the future it would also owe an item of approximately \$46,000 more which the Comptroller's office overlooked.

Supervisor Zalemski then asked if anyone wished to be heard further and there being no further objections he stated that the objections raised would be given due consideration by the Board as a whole and that he will entertain a motion to adjourn.

NOTICE OF ORDINANCE ADOPTED BY THE
TOWN BOARD OF CHEEKTOWAGA, NEW YORK

DECEMBER 19th, 1932

CHAPTER I.

Peddlers, Hawkers and Venders.

Sec. 1. No person, firm or corporation shall upon the public highways, streets, roads or public grounds of the Town of Cheektowaga offer for sale, hawk or peddle or vend any goods, produce, or articles of merchandise without having first obtained a license therefore. But such prohibition shall not require a license from an honorable discharged soldier, sailor or marine of the Military and Naval Service of the United States, who has obtained a similar license, from the County Clerk to hawk, sell, vend or solicit trade in pursuance of law.

Sec. 2. No vehicle of any kind or description drawn by an animal or animals or propelled by hand or other power shall be used for the purchase and sale of goods, wares and merchandise or produce therefrom upon the streets, roads, highways or public places of the Town unless a license has been obtained for said vehicle from the Town Clerk.

Sec. 3. The Town Clerk shall issue a license to any citizen of the United States applying therefore that he deem a suitable person to pursue such calling or occupation prohibited by the foregoing sections. Such license shall specify on the face thereof the fee paid therefore together with the term of its duration. No license shall be transferable and must be carried upon the person of the licensee when hawking, selling or vending.

All vehicles when licensed and used as aforesaid shall display in a conspicuous place on the vehicle a license plate furnished by the Town Clerk of Cheektowaga, N.Y.

No license to barter, purchase, sell, peddle, hawk or vend shall be included in a vehicle license, but every and each license shall be issued separately and no vehicle license shall include the right to barter, vend, purchase, sell, peddle or hawk.

Any applicant that has been refused such a license by the Town Clerk of Cheektowaga may apply to the Town Board of said Town, and the same may be granted or refused by said Board.

No license for the aforementioned purposes shall be issued for a term beyond the current year in which they are issued and they will all expire on the 31st day of December of the year in which they are issued.

The following annual fees shall be charged for the licenses.

For a vehicle hereinbefore described used for the purposes of hawking, vending, peddling, purchasing, goods, wares, merchandise, produce and other similar uses the annual fee shall be \$50.00.

For any person who hawks, offers for sale, peddles or vends from a licensed vehicle, with basket, or other receptacle, or on foot the annual fee shall be \$25.00.

Sec. 4. Every person hawking or peddling goods or produce or vending the same by calls from house to house in the Town of Cheektowaga, for which a license is required as herein provided for, without having first obtained such license, or who refuses to produce such a license to any peace officer who demands inspection of the same, shall be liable to a penalty not to exceed Twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, recoverable by the Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, in any court having jurisdiction thereof, and applicable to the support of the poor of that Town. The refusal to produce such license when demanded by a peace officer shall be presumptive evidence that such person is hawking, peddling or vending without a license.

Sec. 5. Any person who hawks, offers for sale, peddles or vends without a license in the Town of Cheektowaga, as required by this Chapter, or contrary to the terms of his license, or who refuses to produce his license on the demand of a peace officer, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 6. The ordinances and rules above mentioned shall take effect on the 1st day of January, 1933.
