WHEREAS, the Town Superintendent of Highways has no jurisdiction over either Delevan Ave. or Pine Ridge Road, said roads being under the control of the County Superintendent of Highways, be it resolved, that C. Chase Zalemski, Supervisor be authorized to request of the County Superintendents of Highways that a signal or some appropriate form of mechanical devise be installed at the intersection which will clearly indicate where the intersection is and that the Supervisor be authorized if it becomes necessary to present the matter to the Board of Supervisors for its consideration and action.

RESOLVED, That the Supervisor and Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, or either of them be, and they hereby are authorized, empowered and directed to enter into a contract with the AUTOMATIC VOTING MACHINE CORPORATION, for the purchase of Five (5) U. S. Standard Voting Machines, at the net price of Nine Hundred Forty Dollars (\$940.00) each less \$75.00 each for once used machines plus transportation charges of \$21.35 F.O.B. cars, Jamestown, N.Y. and be it further,

RESOLVED, that in payment for said voting machines, the Supervisor and Town Clerk be, and they hereby are, authorized empowered and directed, upon the receipt of said machines, to pay in cash \$869.27 and to issue, execute and deliver to the AUTOMATIC VOTING MACHINE CORPORATION, four (4) valid, negotiable Town Certificates of Indebtedness, amounting in the aggregate to Three Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-seven Dollars and Eight Cents (\$3,477.08) with interest from the first day of April, 1934 at the rate of Six per cent (6%) per annum, payable annually on the 1st, day of April in each year, principal and interest payable with New York Exchange, at par, at the Manufactures and Traders Trust Co., Buffalo, N.Y. Broadway & Mills Sts. as follows:

This meeting was called for the purpose of receiving the committees report relative to taxing the land owned by the City of Buffalo and known as the Airport property and such other business as may properly come before the Board.

On motion of Councilman Burst, seconded by Councilman Rzyrkowski the following resolution was adopted;

WHEREAS, on April 23rd, 1934 a special meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga was held for the purpose of considering the claim of the City of Buffalo relative to the taxes already assessed against the land owned by the City of Buffalo known as the Buffalo Airport, and also relative to the Town entering into an agreement exempting the airport from taxes in the future.

The Town Clerk is hereby empowered to provide the necessary application blanks for such licenses, which application blanks shall contain the name, address, occupation of the applicant, the location of the premises to be licensed, the name of the owner of such premises, and the name of the person, firm or corporation who is to carry on the soft drink business, and a general description of the business now carried on in said premises.

Such application shall further state whether the applicant has been convicted of any crime, and if so, a complete statement of the offense of which he was convicted, and penalty imposed. Such application shall be filed with the Town Clerk and the same may be acted upon at any regular or special meeting of the Town Board. The fee for such license shall be the sum of \$3.00 per year or fraction thereof, all licenses to end on May 1st, of each year.

Any person who sells, offers for sale or gives away soft drinks without first obtaining a license, shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00

The foregoing provisions shall not apply to any person, firm or corporation to whom has been issued a license by the State of New York to engage in the retail liquor business to be consumed upon the premises, nor shall the foregoing provisions apply to persons engaged in the wholesale distribution of soft drinks.

WHEREAS, the construction of water boxes, water meters, turn off boxes, electric turn off boxes, gas turn off boxes, and other forms of appliances and devices in the highway, side-walk, or space between the side-walk and the curb, creates a dangerous condition, if the same protrude above the level of the ground, and for the purpose of making the highway and side-walk reasonably safe for travel, and to prevent persons using such highways from sustaining injury by tripping over such obstructions.

BE IT RESOLVED, that no turn off boxes, water meters, gas meters or turn off boxes, electric meters or turn off boxes, or appliances and devices of a similar nature, be constructed in the travelled portion of the highway, sidewalk or space between the side-walk and the travelled part of the highway, including the space between the side-walk and the curb.

That any permit hereinafter granted to any person, firm or corporation, shall be conditioned upon the compliance with the terms and conditions of this resolution.

In the event of a violation of the provisions of this resolution, the Town may remove the obstruction and charge the expense thereof to the person obtaining such permit, as well as the owner of the property in front or side of whose premises such obstruction exists, and in addition thereto, any person violating the provisions of this resolution shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00.




4th. That an ordinance be adopted relative to outside plumbing and outside toilets, same to be properly connected to sewers.

2nd. The existence upon any lands in the Town of Cheektowaga, of any quarry, pit or excavation of such size, depth or character as to be dangerous to the public or persons, while upon said premises or in the vicinity thereof, is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

No owner or occupany of any land shall maintain or permit to exist thereon, any such quarry, pit or excavation, without enclosing the same with a fence of a size and character sufficient to prevent the access of children thereto and without the posting of conspicuous signs on each side thereof forbidding all persons, other than agents and employees of the owner or occupant, to enter upon said premises. The fencing and posting of existing quarries, pits and excavations shall be fully completed within thirty days after this ordinance becomes operative. Any person, firm or corporation who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine or penalty of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each offense.

In addition to the fine or penalty above provided for the Chief of Police of the Town of Cheektowaga is hereby authorized to serve a notice upon the owner or occupant of any land on which a quarry, pit or excavation exists in violation of this section, requiring such owner or occupant to fill the same or to fence and post it as herein required, within ten days after the service of such notice. Such notice may be served personally or by mail addressed to the last known address of the owner or occupant. If such owner or occupant fails to comply with the requirements of said notice, the Chief of Police shall report such failure to the Town Board, and said Town Board may direct that such nuisance be abated, and the expense thereof shall be recovered by action or by local assessment on the premises made, levied and collected as other local assessments are made, levied and collected, prusuant to law.



A quorum being present, Supervisor Zalemski, called the meeting to order and asked if there were any objections to this ordinance as published in the official newspaper of the Town, also the proof of posting and publishing.

The Town Clerk then presented proof of publishing of said notice and hearing in the Cheektowaga Record, the official newspaper along with the Certificate of posting of such hearing.

A representative of the Western New York Water Co. protested against this proposed ordinance claiming that if this ordinance was passed it would prevent them from having excess to the meter or turn off box, as they would be on private property and the company would have to get the consent of the owner to reach these boxes or meters in case of trouble and although the shut off boxes were the property of the owner of the premises it has always been a practice to install them within the street line.

A representative of the Iroquois Gas Corp. stated that they owned all shut off boxes and that it always had been a custom to install same at the beginning of the service line and that if any of said boxes protruded above the ground at present, they would be glad to lower same to grade.

Town Attorney Doyle, stated that the Town of Cheektowaga had been sued several times through the obstructions caused by these boxes protruding above the ground and that this ordinance had been drafted to protect the Town against claims in the future.

After some discussion by the members of the Town Board and on the advise of the Town Attorney it was moved by Councilman Denk, seconded by Councilman Rzyrkowski that this hearing be adjourned until Monday, June 11th, 1934 at 1 oclock P. M.

The issuance of such licenses shall be in the discretion of the Town Board, and shall only be issued to persons of good moral character. The Town Clerk is hereby empowered to provide the necessary application blanks for such licenses, which application blanks shall contain the name, address, occupation of the applicant, the location of the premises to be licensed, the name of the owner of such premises, and the name of the person, firm or corporation who is to carry on the soft drink business, and a general description of the business now carried on in said premises.

Such application shall further state whether the applicant had been convicted of any crime, and if so, a complete statement of the offense of which he was convicted, and penalty imposed. Such application shall be filed with the Town Clerk and the same may be acted upon at any regular or special meeting of the Town Board. The fee for such license shall be the sum of \$3.00 per year or fraction thereof, all license to end on May 1st, of each year.

Any person who sells, offers for sale or gives away, soft drinks without first obtaining a license, shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00.

A quorum being present the Supervisor called the meeting to order to transact any and all business that may come before the board.

Supervisor Zalemski, announced that first in order would be the Public Hearing on the proposed ordinance relative to unnecessary emission of smoke, gases, dusts, trade-wastes, etc. as published in the official newspaper.

The Town Clerk then presented proof of publishing and posting of said notice in the official newspaper of the Town of Cheektowaga.

The Supervisor inquired if there were any objections to this ordinance as read by the Town Clerk.

There being no objections it was moved by Councilman Denk, seconded by Councilman Rzyrkowski, that the following ordinance be adopted:

The unnecessary emission of smoke, noxious gases, deposits, dust, trade-wastes and other pollutions from buildings, engines, locomotives and other sources, is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

No person, firm or corporation shall cause the unnecessary emission of smoke, noxious gases, deposits, dust, trade-wastes and other pollutions from his or its buildings, engines, locomotives and other sources.

A violation of this ordinance shall constitute disorderly conduct and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person and shall be subject to a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100) Dollars for each offense.

Adopted this 18th, day of June, 1934. By order of the Town Board.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Supervisor Zalemski, stated next in order was the hearing on the proposed ordinance, regulating the existance of any quarry, pit or excavation and directed the Clerk to read same, along with proof of publishing and posting.

The Clerk then presented proof of publishing and posting same in the official paper of the Town.

The Supervisor then asked if there were any objections to the ordinance.

There being none, it was moved by Councilman Burst, seconded by Councilman Kaufman that the following ordinance be adopted.

The existance upon any lands in the Town of Cheektowaga, of any quarry, pit or excavation of such size, depth or character as to be dangerous to the public or persons, while upon said premises or in the vicinity thereof, is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

No owner or occupany of any land shall maintain or permit to exist thereon, any such quarry, pit or excavation, without enclosing the same with a fence of a size and character sufficient to prevent the access of children thereto and without the posting of conspicuous signs on each side thereof forbidding all persons, other than agents and employees of the owner or occupant, to enter upon said premises. The fencing and posting of existing quarries, pits and excavations shall be fully completed within thirty days after this ordinance becomes operative. Any person, firm or corporation who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine or penalty of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) for each offense.

In addition to the fine or penalty above provided for, the Chief of Police of the Town of Cheektowaga, is hereby authorized to serve a notice upon the owner or occupant of any land on which a quarry, pit or excavation exists in violation of this section, requiring such owner or occupant to fill the same or to fence and post it as herein required, within ten days after the service of such notice. Such notice may be served personally or by mail addressed to the last known address of the owner or occupant. If such owner or occupant fails to comply with the requires of said notice, the Chief of Police shall report such failure to the Town Board, and said Town Board may direct that such nuisance be abated, and the expense thereof shall be recovered by action or by local assessment on the premises made, levied and collected as other local assessments are made levied and collected, pursuant to law.

PUBLIC NOTICE

A public hearing will be held before the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, at the Town Hall, in said Township on the 16th, day of July, 1934 at two (2) o'clock in the afternoon Daylight Saving time, for the purpose of determining the advisability of passing an ordinance regulating the collection and storage of rags, iron, old bottles, cinders, building material, used automobiles and vehicles parts, and material of a like nature.

At such meeting the following proposed ordinance relating to said subject matter will be considered and if thought advisable, an ordinance relating to the subject matter above and hereinafter mentioned, may be enacted.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE:

No person, firm or corporation shall collect, store or keep in piles on any land or in any yard or open space in the Town of Cheektowaga, N.Y. within a distance of one hundred feet of the highway, any rags, paper, old bottles, rubbish, cinders, wood, used automobiles or parts thereof, or building material, old iron, brass or metal of any kind, for sale or otherwise, without a permit being issued therefor by the Town Board.

No such permit shall be issued by said Town Board unless there shall be presented to it a petition signed by the person, firm or corporation who owns or leases the land setting forth a complete description of the premises intended to be occupied, the distance from the highway said material is to be stored, the purpose for which said permit is requested, and whether said person, firm or corporation seeks to make a business of the collection and storage of such materials and the extent to which he intends to so use the premises owned or leased.

That the consent of a majority of the property owners within a radius of three hundred feet of the premises described in said petition, measuring from the center point where said materials shall be collected or stored, must be obtained before the Town Board shall issue such permit.

Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of being a disorderly person and shall be liable to a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

Persons now storing or collecting any of the materials above referred to within one hundred feet of the highway shall be required to obtain a permit to continue to do so, and failure to obtain such permit within ten days after this ordinance shall become operative and in effect, shall constitute a violation of this ordinance.

WHEREAS, the total appropriations in such annual estimate and tax budget for various town purposes, after the deduction of anticipated revenues, amount to \$651,231.38, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that one certificate of Indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, in the principal sum of Two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00), dated the 30th day of June, 1934, bearing interest at the rate of six per centum (6%) per annum and maturing on the 1st day of October, 1934, be issued to said Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company of Buffalo, New Yor, in anticipation of the receipt of taxes and revenues for the fiscal year beginning January 1st, 1934, and ending December 31st, 1934, and that such Certificate of Indebtedness be issued in substantially the following form:
