A regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, held in the Council Chamber at the Town Hall Monday, April 6, 1936 at 3 o'clock P. M. with the following members present:-

A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the board.

On motion of Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Pawlak the minutes of the meetings, held March 16th, 23rd, and March 26th, were approved as read by the Town Clerk.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

The monthly reports of the Justice of the Peace and the Town Clerk for the month of March were ordered layed on the table until the next regular meeting.

On motion of Councilman Burst, seconded by Councilman Denk the building petition of Frank J. Swiencicki, to erect a dwelling on lot 152 George Urban Blvd. was granted and the Town Clerk was authorized to issue a permit for same.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

On motion of Councilman Denk, seconded by Councilman Henfling the resignation of Boleslaw Osalkowski as caretaker of Disposal Plant #3 and to take effect May 1, 1936 was ordered received, filed and accepted.

Carried, Ayes -4- Noes -1-
Councilman Burst voted no

Mrs. Josephine Reister, entered a complaint against the booster station owned and operated by the Western New York Water Co. on Union Road next to her property, stating that it caused a constant noise and has effected her nerves to the extent that she is now under the doctor's care and asked that the Town Board request the Western N. Y. Water Co. to remedy this condition.

No objections the Supervisor referred Mrs. Reister's complaint to the Public Improvement Committee and Town Attorney.

Communication from the Polish American Citizens and Taxpayers Ass'n. relative to the extension of the Sycamore car line to Harlem Ave. was read. No objections the Supervisor referred this request to the Public Improvement Committee and Town Attorney.

Communication from Elmer C. Mesner, Supt. of Public Works stating that he had investigated the drainage system of the Buffalo Airport and found that a 12" storm sewer was connected into the sanitary sewer manhole about 500 feet east of Cayuga Rd. and recommended that the Town Board notify the Buffalo Airport officials of this condition. No objections the Supervisor referred this communication to the Public Works, Special Districts and Highway Committee and Town Attorney.

Communication from Howard Keller, Fire Commissioner Cleveland Hill Fire District No. 6 requesting the installation of a stop light in front of their fire house on Harlem Ave. was presented and read. Supervisor Zalemski, referred this communication to the Public Works, Highway Committee and the Supt. of Public Works No. objections.

On motion of Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Pawlak the request from the secretary of the Board of School Directors for permission to hold their meeting in the Council Chamber on Tuesday April 21st, 1936 was granted.

Councilman Denk, offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was duly seconded by Councilman Henfling.

RESOLVED; that the Town Clerk be and he hereby is authorized and directed to write to the Public Service Commission and urge that the Transit Road grade crossing elimination be hurried through at this time in view of the fact that all of the objections of the Railroads have been eliminated and the Railroads are now in a financial position to take care of the cost of same.

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Article 3 Section 20 of the Public Health Law this board does hereby appoint Dr. Chester J. Nadolny, Health Officer for the Town of Cheektowaga for the term of four years at a salary as provided in the budget, effective March 22nd, 1936 and ending March 22nd, 1940.

On motion of Councilman Pawlak, seconded by Councilman Henfling the following resolution was duly adopted.

RESOLVED, that the Cheektowaga Record a newspaper published in the Town of Cheektowaga be and hereby is designated as the official newspaper in and for the Town of Cheektowaga, New York effective as of April 6, 1936.

Witkowski, Valentine Paradowski, William Weber, Andrew Piacente and Edward Janiak, against Town of Cheektowaga etc., et al, Respondents.

On motion of Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Pawlak this was referred to the Town Attorney.

Chief of Police Walter J. Marynowski, submitted his report for the month of March on the number of arrests, fines collected, property reported missing, property recovered, accidents, complaints, etc. No objections, Supervisor Zalemski ordered this report received and filed.

On motion of Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Pawlak the board opened up under the Head of the Board of Health of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Health Officer, Dr. Chester J. Nadolny presented a complaint from Mrs. Carl Budd of 74 David St., Cheektowaga, relative to the accumulation of surface water on the low land on both sides of her property at 74 David Street.

Dr. Nadolny said that at the present time there was no health menace at this property but that he would keep a close check on same and if a health menace should arise later he would take the proper action at once.

There being no objections the Supervisor referred this complaint to the Board of Assessors, Public Works Committee and the Health Officer.

There being no more complaints the board proceeded to go into regular session.

A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the board.

On motion of Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Pawlak the minutes of the regular meeting held, Monday, April 6th, 1936 were approved as read by the Town Clerk.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

On motion of Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Pawlak the monthly reports of the Justice of the Peace and the Town Clerk for the month were ordered received, filed and accepted.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

The building petitions of Theodore Cipressi, Louis Fronckowiak and Walter J. Marynowski, were referred to the Public Improvement Committee by Supervisor Zalemski, No objections.

Communication from Carlton A. Fisher, Town Attorney, relative to Pumping station on Union Road, stating that he had taken the matter up with the Western New York Water Company and they had informed him that they would purchase a motor from the Buffalo General Electric Company that would eliminate all trouble in the future. No objections, Supervisor Zalemski ordered this communication received, filed, and directed the Public Improvement Committee to continue to act on same to help eliminate the trouble.

Communication from the William Street Citizens Protective Ass'n. relative to the condition of streets that sewers were installed in last year, namely, Iroquois, Wabash, Peoria, etc., asking that these streets be put in a passable condition. No objections the Supervisor referred this complaint to the Highway Superintendent.

Communication from the William Street Citizens Protective Ass'n. relative to the condition of the drain ditch and sidewalk along Harlem Avenue, between Hurd and Parker Streets, stating that this condition was very dangerous and should be taken care of at once. Supervisor referred this communication to the Public Works Committee and the Superintendent of Public Works for study and to report back to this board as soon as possible their recommendations. No objections.

Town Attorney Fisher, reported that the International Railway Company had obtained a judgment against the Town of Cheektowaga, and the American Surety Company in the sum of \$15,644.87 and wanted to know what the Town Board desires were in connection with this matter.

On motion of Councilman Henfling, seconded by Councilman Denk the Town Attorney was directed to appeal this action in defense of the Town of Cheektowaga.

WHEREAS the Supreme Court of Erie County has ordered the restoration to office of some of these litigants and because of the fact that this Board desires to protect the taxpayers, the Veterans and the Exempt Volunteer Firemen with equality and obtain an interpretation of the law that will finally determine this question,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved, that the Town Attorney be and he hereby is authorized and directed by this Board to seek an interpretation as to the constitutionality of the legislative act giving preference to Veterans and Exempt Volunteer Firemen by appealing to the Court of Appeals the decision in the various cases of former employees whose cases are now in litigation.

Mr. Furst, offered the following resolution and moved its adoption;

WHEREAS, C. CHASE ZALEMSKI, as Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, has reported to this Town Board that insufficient funds were available for the payment of the principal and interest of certain Town bonds heretofore issued by the Town of Cheektowaga and which become due and payable on the first day of July, 1936, in the principal sum of Two hundred fifteen thousand one hundred and twenty Dollars and Fifty-eight cents (\$215, 120.58), together with interest charges in the further sum of Twenty-nine thousand nine hundred twenty-nine dollars and eighty-three cents (\$29,929.83) and,

WHEREAS, on the 17th day of October, 1935, the Town Board of this Town, pursuant to the provisions of Article VIII of the Town Law, duly adopted its annual estimates and tax budget for the year of 1936, and included therein an appropriation for the payment of the principal and interest of the bonds hereinbefore referred to sufficient for the payment thereof, and

WHEREAS, the total appropriation in such annual estimates and tax budget for the various Town purposes, after the deduction of anticipated revenue, amounts to \$647,931.47, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie, on the 19th day of November, 1935, duly levied, assessed and provided for the raising by tax upon the real and personal property liable to taxation in the Town of Cheektowaga, the said amount hereinbefore referred to, and

WHEREAS, the warrant heretofore delivered to the Receiver of the Taxes and Assessments of this Town by the County of Erie directed said Receiver of Taxes and Assessments to collect for the year 1936 the total sum of Nine hundred fifty-two thousand and nine hundred sixty-eight dollars and eighty-nine cents (\$952,968.89) for all purposes and

WHEREAS, said Receiver of Taxes and Assessments collected of such total sum the amount of Four hundred seventy-three thousand eight hundred two dollars and forty-seven cents (\$473,802.47) and,

WHEREAS, the total appropriation in the annual estimate and tax budget of the year 1936 for various town purposes after the deduction of anticipated revenue, amounts to Six hundred forty-seven thousand nine hundred thirty-one dollars and forty-seven cents (\$647,931.47), of which amount the Supervisor of this Town has received from the Receiver of Taxes and Assessments of this Town the total sum of Four hundred seventy-three thousand eight hundred two dollars and forty-seven cents (\$473,802.47), and

WHEREAS, there is owing to the Town of Cheektowaga and payable by the County of Erie, pursuant to law, the further sum of One hundred seventy-four thousand one hundred twenty-nine dollars (\$174,129.00),

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Cheektowaga borrow from the Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company of Buffalo, New York, for the purposes aforesaid the sum of One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) in anticipation of the receipt of taxes and revenues for the fiscal year beginning January 1st, 1936 and ending December 31st, 1936, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that one Certificate of Indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga in the County of Erie and State of New York, in the principal sum of One hundred thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), dated the 30th day of June, 1936, bearing interest at the rate of four per centum (4%) per annum and payable ninety (90) days from date, be issued in anticipation of the receipt of taxes and revenues for the fiscal year beginning January 1st, 1936 and ending December 31st, 1936 and that such Certificate of Indebtedness be issued in substantially the following form:

This Certificate of Indebtedness is issued by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie, and State of New York, pursuant to Section 117 of the Town Law against revenues and taxes levied for the fiscal year beginning on the 1st day of January, 1936 and ending on the 31st day of December 1936 and pursuant to a resolution duly adopted by the Town Board of the said Town on the 19th day of June, 1936.

It is hereby certified that the total amount of taxes levied for all town purposes for the Town of Cheektowaga for the fiscal year beginning January 1st, 1936, and ending December 31st 1936 is Six hundred forty-seven thousand nine hundred thirty-one Dollars and forty-seven cents (\$647,931.47), and it is hereby further certified that there is now outstanding, due and payable to said Town of Cheektowaga by reason thereof as of the date of this Certificate of Indebtedness the sum of \$158,669.13.

It is hereby certified, recited and declared that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, to happen and to be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this Certificate of Indebtedness, exist, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law, and that this Certificate of Indebtedness together with all other indebtedness of said Town, is within every debt and other limit prescribed by the Constitution and laws of the State of New York. The full faith and credit of said Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal and interest hereof.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the said Town of Cheektowaga has caused this Certificate of Indebtedness to be signed by its Supervisor and sealed with the corporate seal of said Town, attested by its Town Clerk and this Certificate of Indebtedness to be dated as of the 30th day of June, 1936.
