Annual organization meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, held at the Town Hall, Wednesday, January 1st, 1936 at 2 oclock P. M. with the following members present:-

A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact any and all business that may come before the board. After a welcome address by Supervisor Zalemski and remarks by Councilman Burst and Councilman Denk the board proceeded to go into regular session.

Communication from the Cheektowaga Police Club extending to the Supervisor and Councilmen their sincere wishes for a successful administration and pledging their cooperation was presented and read and ordered received and filed.

The resignation of Stanley B. Malanowicz, Chief of Police was presented and read and ordered received and filed and accepted by Supervisor Zalemski.

Communication from Edward H. Pfohl, Receiver of Taxes and Assessments stating that he had appointed Margaret Graney, as his clerk and requested that the Board fix her compensation at the same yearly salary as provided in the Budget was presented and read.

This communication was ordered received and filed by Supervisor Zalemski.

Application from the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News for designation as the official newspaper for the Town of Cheektowaga was read and ordered received and filed for further consideration.

The Town Clerk then proceeded to read notices that were presented by employees of the Town of Cheektowaga claiming all the rights and privileges under section 200 of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York and also under section 22 of the Civil Service Law along with their oath of office to their respective positions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Board shall also meet on the third Monday of each month at seven-thirty P.M. for the purpose of transacting such business as may come before the Board, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that should any of such meetings fall on a legal holiday then such meeting will be held on the following day at the same time as appointed for the regular meeting day.

RESOLVED, that Carlton A. Fisher be and hereby is appointed Town Attorney for the Town of Cheektowaga to fill the vacancy existing in such office, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that his salary shall be Four thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) per year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Frank Lauer be and he hereby is appointed Assessor to fill one of the aforesaid vacancies in said office.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Matthew Stachowiak be and he hereby is appointed Assessor to fill one of the aforesaid vacancies in said office.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the compensation to be received by the aforesaid Assessors shall be as follows:

\$2,000.00 per annum for the Chairman of the Board of Assessors and \$1800.00 each per annum for the other Assessors appointed to the Board.

Moved by Councilman Pawlak and seconded by Councilman Burst that Lucy Andrzejewski be and she hereby is appointed Secretary to the Supervisor at an annual salary as provided in the budget.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Gladys Sturm be and she hereby is appointed Deputy Town Clerk at an annual salary of \$1200.00 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Irene Napieralski be and she hereby is appointed Clerk in the Town Clerk's Office at an annual salary of \$1080.00 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Lillian Mauer be and she hereby is appointed Clerk in the office of the Receiver of Taxes at an annual salary of \$1080.00 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Regina Czechowski be and she hereby is appointed Clerk in the office of the Board of Assessors at an annual salary of \$1080.00

Councilman Burst offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Pawlak.

RESOLVED, that the offices of Janitor and Assistant Janitor, Clerk of the Engineering Department, Special Assessment Clerk and Police Mechanic be and the same hereby are abolished, and be it further,

RESOLVED, Whereas, the Town Board is responsible for the various buildings and various disposal plants and the collection of garbage in the respective garbage districts, the Town Hall Garage, Janitor's house and other buildings and equipment of the town and of special districts other than fire districts, and

WHEREAS, in the past there has been no officer of the town directly responsible for the care and maintenance of public buildings and equipment and property of the town and special districts thereof and as a result proper supervision could not be given to same, and through any existing department head.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Department of Public Works be and the same hereby is created and the head of said department shall be known as the Superintendent of Public Works which office is hereby created, together with the office

of Deputy Superintendent of Public Works and that the Superintendent of Public Works shall have under his charge and care all of the buildings, sewer disposal plants and equipment of the town, together with the management and supervision of the garbage districts and the collection of garbage and shall be responsible for the proper conduct of the employees necessary to care for and maintain and operate said public works and that the Deputy Superintendent of the public works shall assist the Superintendent and act for him and have all of the same powers as the Superintendent in the absence of the Superintendent, and in addition thereto the Superintendent of Public Works shall have charge of the Engineering Department of said Town and be responsible therefor.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Elmer Mesner be and he hereby is appointed Superintendent of Public Works at an annual salary of \$1,900.00, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Francis Piatek be appointed Deputy Superintendent of Public Works at an annual salary of \$1,700.00 and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that three Sewer Inspectors be appointed in the Department of Public Works, said sewer inspectors to receive for services fees only as heretofore prescribed, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Robert Brunner, be and he hereby is appointed to serve as Sewer Inspector to serve on a fee basis, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Ernest Schlienz be and he hereby is appointed to serve as Sewer Inspector to serve on a fee basis, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that William Tadio be and he hereby is appointed to serve as Sewer Inspector to serve on a fee basis, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the Garbage Division of the Department of Public Works that two truck drivers and four laborers be appointed, the truck drivers to receive a per diem rate of \$5.00 and the laborers to be paid at a per diem rate of \$4.50, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that George Frederick be and hereby is appointed a truck driver at a per diem rate of \$5.00 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that John Szymkowiak be and hereby is appointed a truck driver at a per diem rate of \$5.00 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Irving Foster be and hereby is appointed a laborer at a per diem rate of \$4.50 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Leo Janowski be and hereby is appointed laborer at a per diem rate of \$4.50, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Adam Deryngowski be and hereby is appointed a laborer at a per diem rate of \$4.50, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Joseph Santo be and hereby is appointed a laborer at a per diem rate of \$4.50, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Frank Enser be and hereby is appointed as a laborer in the Department of Public Works at an annual salary of \$1200.00 and William Hejza is appointed a laborer in the Department of Public Works at an annual salary of \$920.00 and as such can occupy and live in the dwelling adjacent to the Town Hall during his term of office, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the Disposal Plant Division of the Department of Public Works, in Disposal Plant No. 5 three caretakers (3) shall be appointed at a yearly salary of \$1080.00 each, and that George Muench, Adolf Steul and Frank Ifflander be and hereby appointed as said caretakers, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the Disposal Plant Division of the Department of Public Works in Disposal Plant No. 3 three caretakers shall be appointed at a yearly salary of \$1080.00 each and that Boleslaus Osalkowski, Anthony Jezierski and John Pawlak be and hereby are appointed as said caretakers.

RESOLVED, that pursuant to law this board hereby designates the M & T Trust Company of Buffalo as a depository of Town funds and that the funds of the Town may be deposited therein, and that all checks, notes and other instruments for the payment of money made or drawn by, or upon, or payable to, the Town shall be signed or accepted or endorsed (other than for deposit) by the following named officers of the town in the manner stated:

"C. Chase Zalemski, Supervisor", and that the said bank hereby authorized to pay such notes, checks or other instruments for the payment of money and also to receive the same for deposit to the credit of, or in payment from any holder (including checks drawn to "Cash" or "Bearer" or other individual order of the officer signing same).

When so signed or accepted or endorsed, without inquiry of any kind, whether payable to or tendered for deposit to the credit of, or in payment of the obligations of any officer or officers of the corporation, or otherwise, and be it further,

RESOLVED, that such officer of the Town is authorized to assent to and sign and deliver to said bank a memorandum of terms of deposit.



6. The following standing committees to consist of three members each shall be appointed by the permanent Chairman within twenty-five days after the annual organization meeting and the list of Committees shall be filed with the Town Clerk.
