"The Supervisor, when present, shall preside at the meetings of the Town Board. In the absence of the Supervisor, the other members shall designate one of their members to act as temporary chairman. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a lesser number may adjourn. The vote upon every question shall be taken by ayes and noes, and the name of the members present and their votes shall be entered in the minutes. Every act, motion or resolution shall require for its adoption the affirmative vote of a majority of all the members of the Town Board. The Board may determine the rules of its procedure, and the Supervisor may, from time to time, appoint one or more committees, consisting of members of the Board, to aid and assist the Board in the performance of its duties."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that

1. No act, motion or resolution shall be deemed to be adopted by this Board without the affirmative vote of at least three of its members.
2. Voting upon all motions, resolutions or other matters before this Board for consideration shall be oral and by ayes and noes and the Clerk of the Board shall, for the purpose of all such voting, call the roll of all members of this Board according to the Alphabetical location of the first letter of the last name of each of the members of the Board, in alphabetical order, A's first and Z's last.
3. No member of this Board present at any given meeting thereof shall be excused from voting on any matter before the Board for vote, except upon the unanimous consent of the Board voting at such time to grant such excuse.
4. No report shall be made by any committee on any subject referred to them in the absence of a majority of said committee, unless a majority of the Board so direct.
5. All questions relative to priority of business shall be decided by the Chairman without debate and his decision shall be final, unless reversed by a majority of the members then in attendance.
6. The following standing committees to consist of three members each shall be appointed by the permanent Chairman within twenty-five days after the annual organization meeting and the list of Committees shall be filed with the Town Clerk.

RESOLVED, that the following ordinance be and it hereby is adopted and approved by this Board;

#### ORDINANCE FOR NUMBERING HOUSES

##### Section 1: Numbering of Houses:

It shall be the duty of every owner or occupant of a building in the Town of Cheektowaga to cause to be displayed thereon the street number of said building and at all times to maintain such number in compliance with the provisions of the ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga. The figure or figures comprising said number shall be at least four (4) inches in height and shall be placed on said building in such a manner as to be plainly legible from the center of the said street at all times between sunrise and sunset.

The color of said figures shall be in sharp contrast to the color of their background. Such numbers shall be placed on the top riser of the steps leading to the front entrance of said building, or other permanent place on the front of the building. Any person, firm or corporation who violates any provision of the section shall be liable to a fine or penalty of not to exceed twenty-five dollars.

Section 11:

It shall be the duty of the Board of Assessors to prepare a map or roster and to assign and show on said map or roster the number or numbers embracing the limits of the various lots or lands in said Town and to furnish upon application thereto any party applying therefor the number or numbers belonging to or embraced within the limits of said lot or parcels of land as provided in Section 1.

Section 111:

This ordinance shall take effect on the 1st day of February, 1938.

Communication from the president of the Council of the City of Buffalo relative to parking signs on Genesee Street at the Deco Restaurant was referred to the Public Improvement Committee, Town Attorney and Supt. of Highways.

No objections Supervisor Zalemski referred the communication from the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News to the Town Board and Town Attorney.

No objections the Supervisor referred the request from the Helbigs Dry Cleaning Company to the Public Improvement Committee and Town Attorney.

Mr. O'Conner, Attorney for the Daigler Sand & Gravel Co. addressed the Board stating that the Daigler Sand and Gravel Co. desired to have their property assessed as three (3) parcels and also a respread of the sewer tax in District No. 5. After some discussion by the Board members it was ordered to refer this matter to the Town Board and Town Attorney for further study.

On motion of Councilman Pawlak, seconded by Councilman Ladwinker the Supervisor was authorized to submit as a W.P.A. project the storm sewer of Parker Avenue and Dick Road from the N. Y. Central R. R. to the Scajaquada Creek.

WHEREAS, the foregoing projects have been respectively approved and this Town has agreed to pay the cost of furnishing the necessary labor, materials, supplies and equipment and incidental expenses therefor, and

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WHEREAS, this Town Board by a resolution duly adopted on the 21st day of June, 1937, estimated the cost of furnishing such labor, materials, supplies, and equipment, and incidental expenses, to be the sum of Eighty-two Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-six Dollars and Sixty-six Cents (\$82,266.66), and appropriated, pursuant to Chapter 782 of the Laws of 1933 as amended, the aggregate amount of \$82,266.66 for such purposes, and determined to issue the bonds of said Town in said amount therefor, and

WHEREAS, this Town Board has heretofore and by said resolution adopted on the 21st day of June, 1937, determined that pending the issuance of such bonds, such indebtedness shall be temporarily financed by the issuance of Certificates of Indebtedness of said Town, pursuant to the aforesaid Chapter 782 of the Laws of 1933 as amended, and

WHEREAS, this Town Board has borrowed the sum of Thirty-six thousand dollars (\$36,000.00) for the purposes aforesaid and as evidence of such indebtedness has issued one Certificate of Indebtedness of this Town in the amount of \$36,000.00 which matures on the 30th day of March, 1938, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and advisable at this time to provide for the renewal of the aforesaid \$36,000.00 Certificate of Indebtedness,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pending the issuance of the bonds hereinbefore referred to, the aforesaid Certificate of Indebtedness in the amount of \$36,000.00, maturing on the 30th day of March, 1938, be renewed by the issuance of one Certificate of Indebtedness of the Town of Cheektowaga in the amount of \$36,000.00 dated March 30th, 1938 and maturing on the 30th day of June, 1938; that such Certificate of Indebtedness of renewal shall be signed by the Supervisor and attested by the Town Clerk under the corporate seal, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding five per centum per annum payable at maturity. Both principal and interest thereof shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America, at the Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company, Buffalo, New York; and said Certificate of Indebtedness of renewal shall be issued in substantially the following form, to wit:
