A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the board.

No objections, Supervisor Zalemski ordered the monthly reports of the Justice of the Peace and Town Clerk for the month of September tabled until the next regular meeting.

No objections, the Chairman ordered the petition, order and writ of Certiorari from the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company, to the Board of Assessors, referred to the Town Attorney.

No objections, Supervisor Zalemski ordered the communication from William Weber, requesting a re-hearing before the Town Board on his case, referred to the Town Board and Town Attorney for study.

No objections the Supervisor directed the Superintendent of Highways and Superintendent of Public Works to make a survey of Pine Ridge Terrace to see if any new plan can be worked out for an extension of said street, and report back to this board on their findings.

Councilman Pawlak, offered the following resolution and moved its adoption;

WHEREAS, plans have been prepared and submitted to this Board for the construction of an incinerator plant, and

WHEREAS, the said plans, together with an application have been submitted to the Public Works Administration of Federal Government for a grant of public money to pay 45% of the cost of the construction of the incinerator, and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the cost of construction of same will be \$102,558.58 and the cost to the town will be 55% of said amount,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that should the application of the Town for a grant of public money for the construction of an incinerator at a cost not to exceed the sum of \$102,558.58 be approved and granted by the Public Works Administration of Federal Government that subject to a permissive referendum, there shall be raised the sum of not exceeding \$56,407.21 for the purposes aforesaid by the levy of a tax upon all taxable property within the Town, such Tax to be levied and collected in annual installments as provided by law; and in anticipation of the collection of t

the tax herein bonds be issued in the principal sum of \$56,407. 21 or so much thereof as may be necessary and a tax be levied to pay the interest on said bonds as the same became due.

Seconded by Mr. Ladwinker and duly put to a vote which resulted as follows:

Resolution declared carried.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, that the above resolution was duly adopted by the Town Board at a Special meeting of the Town Board held September 26th, and at a regular meeting thereof held in the Town Hall in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, on the 3rd day of October, 1938.

The resolution provides for the construction of an incinerator plant for the Town of Cheektowaga at a cost of \$102,558.58.

If the application for a grant of Federal money is granted the cost to the Town will not exceed \$56,407.21. Should the grant be refused by the Public Works Administration of Federal Government, the Town is not obligated to construct the incinerator.

A communication from the Parent-Teacher's Association, school District No. 3, Cheektowaga was presented and read, stating that they desired police protection at the intersection of Cleveland Drive and Harlem Avenue during school hours, also more protection for homes in their respective district, no objections, Supervisor Zalemski, referred this communication to the Chief of Police, Town Attorney and Town Board as a whole for study and action.

No objections, Supervisor Zalemski referred the complaint from Jacob Gangnagel, relative to garbage being allowed to accumulate at 4009 Union Road, to the Health Officer, and Superintendent of Public Works for investigation.

No objections the Supervisor directed the Town Clerk to invite the Cheektowaga Zoning Board to attend a meeting with the Town Board, to discuss ways and means for the future of Cheektowaga, said meeting to be called at the Town Hall, Monday, October 24th at 8 o'clock P. M.

No objections, Supervisor Zalemski referred the Petition Writ and Order for Writ of Certiorari, from the Erie Railroad, Lehigh Valley Railroad, and New York Central Railroad Company, to the Town Attorney to defend the Town in these actions.

Councilman Pawlak offered the following resolution;

NAVY DAY PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, for the past fifteen years it has been an annual custom to set aside October 27th as NAVY DAY in recognition of the gallantry and devotion to duty by our Navy in defending the Nation, and in up-holding the traditions and ideals of our people, and

WHEREAS, such date is also the Anniversary of the birth of that eminent American and former President of the United States, Theodore Roosevelt, it is fitting and proper that such Anniversary should be observed in remembrance of former President Theodore Roosevelt, and also in recognition of the part which our Navy has had in the history of our people, and

WHEREAS, in these troubled times of increasing international tension and ominous threats to free institutions throughout the World, it is incumbent upon our Government to insure our national security and to safeguard our American heritage, and

WHEREAS, it is vitally important that our Navy and Merchant Marine as our first line of defense, be sufficiently equipped to meet successfully the emergencies that potentially exist at all times, and

WHEREAS, to insure a NAVY adequate for national welfare and security, and a Merchant Marine commensurate with national interest, it is necessary that the American people, upon whom support of the Navy and Merchant Marine depends, be made aware of the need and importance to the nation of such adequate means of defense in the interest of peace.

NOW, THEREFORE, I C. CHASE ZALEMSKI, Supervisor of the Town of CHEEKTOWAGA, State of New York, do hereby proclaim Thursday, 27 October, 1938, as

NAVY DAY

and do direct that the American Flag be displayed from all public buildings of the Town of CHEEKTOWAGA; and do recommend that all patriotic, veteran and civic organizations cooperate with the Navy Day Committee I have appointed and hold special exercises on that day to the end that proper observance of the occasion be made; and I request all citizens to display the American Flag on that day.

Done at the Town Hall, in the Town of CHEEKTOWAGA, State of New York, this 17th day of OCTOBER 1938.
