A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the board.

The Town Clerk then proceeded to read the minutes of the regular meeting held Monday, June 17th, 1940 and on motion of Councilman Pawlak, seconded by Councilman Napieralski these minutes were approved as read by the Town Clerk.

Supervisor Zalemski announced that this was the time and place to receive bids on a truck for the Department of Public Works as advertised in the Depew-Herald and Cheektowaga News and asked if there was any one present who desired to submit bids on said truck.

RESOLVED, that the map known as Cleveland Circle #2 Sub-Division and being part of Lot 36, Township 11, Range 7, Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York be and it hereby is approved and ordered placed on file.

No objections, Supervisor Zalemski ordered the report from the Public Service Commission and being case No. 4666 received and filed.

No objections, the Supervisor ordered the communication from the Polish American Citizens and Taxpayers Association of the Walden District relative to sewer rental received and filed.

On motion of Councilman Napieralski, seconded by Councilman Sliwinski the Cheektowaga Police Club was granted permission to hold an Ox-Roast at Liberty Park on the 7th day of August, 1940.

YOU WILL PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, That pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Buffalo Sewer Authority on June 24, 1940, a copy of which is hereto attached, the Buffalo Sewer Authority determines to cancel and terminate as of November 1, 1940, the agreement between The City of Buffalo and the Town of Cheektowaga, dated September 25, 1907, relating to the discharge of sewage by the Town of Cheektowaga into the sewer system within the City of Buffalo.

YOU WILL FURTHER TAKE NOTICE, That you will be required after said date to refrain from discharging storm water or sanitary sewage at the connections at Walden Avenue and Clinton Street into any of the facilities comprising the sewage and storm water relief system under the jurisdiction of the Buffalo Sewer Authority.

YOU WILL FURTHER TAKE NOTICE, That the Buffalo Sewer Authority will terminate and sever the connections with the facilities of the Authority at Walden Avenue and Clinton Street on the 1st day of November, 1940.

By the service of this notice, the Buffalo Sewer Authority does not waive any claim or demand against the Town of Cheektowaga for rentals or service charges accruing under the terms of the agreement aforesaid from the 1st day of July, 1938, to and until the date of the termination of the agreement as herein set forth.

RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE BUFFALO
SEWER AUTHORITY, JUNE 24,
1940

RESOLVED that the Buffalo Sewer Authority hereby determines that the license granted to the Town of Cheektowaga by agreement entered into on the 25th day of September, 1907 between the Town and the City of Buffalo for the use of the facilities at the connections at Walden and Clinton Streets be cancelled and terminated as of November 1st, 1940 and that the General Manager be and he hereby is authorized and directed to cause to be served upon the Town of Cheektowaga notice of election of the Buffalo Sewer Authority to cancel and terminate said agreement and to sever the connection authorized by said agreement.

On motion of Councilman Ladwinker, seconded by Councilman Napieralski this notice was referred to the Supervisor, Town Attorney, and Superintendent of Public Works with full power to act.

Mr. George Mai and wife entered a complaint about the flooded water conditions at their property on Awood Place and petitioned the Board for the necessary relief, no objections, Supervisor Zalemski referred this petition to the Public Improvement Committee, Superintendent of Highways and Superintendent of Public Works for study and action.

On motion of Councilman Pawlak, seconded by Councilman Sliwinski the Chief of Police was authorized to attend the Chief of Police Convention at New York City the week of July 22nd, 1940.

Councilman Ladwinker stated that he had received a complaint about stagnant water conditions on lot 217 East Side of George Urban Boulevard and owned by the County of Erie. No objections, Supervisor Zalemski stated that he would investigate this matter and take it up with the proper officials of the County to relieve this unsanitary condition.

On motion of Councilman Ladwinker, seconded by Councilman Napieralski the Superintendent of Public Works was authorized to have the interior of the Janitors Cottage in the rear of the Town Hall re-decorated.

Roy H. Schoemaker, to erect a dwelling on Westland Parkway.

L. Rudzinski, to erect a one car garage on Meadowbrook Parkway.

No objections, Supervisor Zalemski referred the petition from Alex Kiliszewski to erect a wooden sign at the southwest corner of William and Union Roads for advertising purposes, to the Public Improvement Committee, Superintendent of Highways and Superintendent of Public Works for investigation.

Fred Prantke, petitioned the Town Board for extension of leave of absence for a period of six months, namely from August 1, 1940 to Jan. 1st, 1941 and on motion of Councilman Ladwinker, seconded by Councilman Napieralski this petition was granted with the understanding that it was final and no more extensions of leave of absence would be allowed.

Petition from the Square Deal Club for permission to hold a carnival during the week of August 5th at William and Harlem Roads in the Town of Cheektowaga, was presented and read. No objections, Supervisor Zaleski referred this petition to the Town Board as a whole for further study.

No objections, the Supervisor ordered this invitation from the committee on Zaleski Day, to the members of the Town Board received, filed and accepted.

No objections, Supervisor Zaleski ordered the reports from the Public Service Commission and being cases nos. 4236 and 10125, received and filed.

No objections, Supervisor Zaleski ordered the communication from the Board of Fire Commissioners, U-Crest Fire District No. 4 relative to the premises occupied by Anthony Emanuele at 102 Evergreen Street as constituting a fire hazard, referred to the Chief of Police, Town Attorney, Fire Warden and Board of Fire Commissioners for study and action.

No objections, the Supervisor referred the communication from Joseph Bianchi relative to street curbing on Genesee Street from the City Line to Pine Ridge Road to the Superintendent of Public Works and Superintendent of Highways for study.

The William Street Citizens and Taxpayers Protective Association petitioned the Town Board to construct street curbing along Harlem Road, between Parker Street and the viaduct north of William Street. No objections, Supervisor Zaleski referred this request to the Town Board as a whole for study and recommendation.

No objections, the Supervisor referred the complaint from Victor McGiveren about a ditch on Hyland Avenue being plowed over and retarding the natural flow of water and causing his property to be flooded during the heavy rain storms, to the Superintendent of Highway, Public Improvement Committee, Health Officer and Town Attorney for investigation.

No objections, Supervisor Zaleski ordered the communication from Mr. L. J. Brennan, Post Office Inspector relative to the proposed establishment of a rural station in the Cheektowaga Town Hall, received and filed for further consideration.

Councilman Ladwinker offered the following resolution and it was seconded by Councilman Napieralski:

RESOLVED, that Charmwood Drive and Charmwood Court Map cover #1608 Cleveland Drive and Kensington Avenue and Century Road, Cleveland Circle Sub-Division #2 for a distance of 450 feet north of Robinhood Road,

BE AND IT HEREBY IS, accepted as a Town Highway of the Town of Cheektowaga subject to filing of the deeds as per recommendation and acceptance of the Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Cheektowaga, and be it further

RESOLVED, that when the deeds for said highways, are presented it will hereby be accepted and ordered placed on file.

No objections, Supervisor Zaleski ordered the monthly reports from the Justice of the Peace and Town Clerk for the month of June, 1940 received and filed.

On motion of Councilman Pawlak, seconded by Councilman Napieralski the claim from Archie Arlington, guardian of Donald Arlington for personal injuries received on the play grounds at School District No. 2 was referred to the Town Attorney and for him to defend the Town in this action.

On motion of Councilman Ladwinker, seconded by Councilman Napieralski the following resolution was adopted;

WHEREAS, a request has been made of this board by the duly authorized representative of St. Aloisius Gonzaga's Parish for permission to close to traffic and use the center and the highway portion located on the westerly and southern side of the Circle at the intersection of Century Road and Cleveland Drive during the time of their Lawn Fete and to divert traffic and use for traffic the remainder of the Circle, and

WHEREAS, that this board is informed that the request has been granted by the County Superintendent of Highways.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chief of Police is directed to maintain through his officers safe traffic conditions and control during the time of the Fete.

One, 1000 feet west on the south side of Kensington Avenue.

One, 1000 feet from the corner of Cleveland Drive and Kensington running south and west on the north side of Cleveland Drive.

One, on Robinhood Road, west of Century Road.

One, at Century Road and Robinhood Road.

One, 1000 feet on Treehaven Road from Century and Robinhood.

Daylight Saving Time at which time all parties interested shall be given an opportunity to be heard relative to the advisability of adopting the following proposed ordinances.

PROPOSED ORDINANCES REGULATING SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA:

SECTION 1. Every person operating a motor vehicle on any street shall drive the same in a careful and prudent manner and at a rate of speed so as not to endanger the property of another, or the life or limb of any person; provided that a rate of speed in any of the following streets within the limits prescribed to wit:

- William Street from Harlem Road to Kennedy Road
- Walden Avenue from City Line to Harlem Road
- Delavan Avenue from City Line to Pine Ridge Road
- Eggert Road from Delavan Avenue to Sugar Road
- Harlem Road from Cleveland Drive to Huth Road
- Rowley Road from Como Park Boulevard to Indian Road
- Indian Road from Como Park Boulevard to First Street

in excess of twenty-five miles per hour for a distance of one-eighth of a mile shall be presumptive evidence of driving such motor vehicle at a rate of speed which is not careful and prudent.

SECTION 2. Every person violating the provision of section 1 of this ordinance may upon conviction be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment for a period of time not to exceed thirty days or both, and all fines, penalties and forfeitures collected under this ordinance shall be paid to the Town and credited to the general fund.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect on the 20th day of August, 1940.



PROPOSED ORDINANCES REGULATING SPEED
OF MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA

SECTION 1. Every person operating a motor vehicle on any street shall drive the same in a careful and prudent manner and at a rate of speed so as not to endanger the property of another, or the life or limb of any person; provided, that a rate of speed in any of the following streets within the limits prescribed to wit:

William Street from Harlem Road to Andrew Street
Kensington Avenue from the City Line of Buffalo to the Town Line of the Town of Amherst
Harlem Road from Cleveland Drive to Maryvale Road
Pine Ridge Road from Walden Avenue to Delavan Avenue
Walden Avenue from City Line to Harlem Road
Delavan Avenue from City Line to Pine Ridge Road
Eggert Road from Delavan Avenue to Sugar Road
Rowley Road from Como Park Boulevard to Indian Road
Indian Road from Como Park Boulevard to First Street
Harlem Road from Cayuga Creek Road to Center Street

in excess of twenty-five miles per hour for a distance of one-eighth of a mile shall be presumptive evidence of driving such motor vehicle at a rate of speed which is not careful and prudent.

SECTION 2. Every person violating the provision of Section 1 of this ordinance may upon conviction be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or by imprisonment for a period of time not to exceed thirty days or both, and all fines penalties and forfeitures collected under this ordinance shall be paid to the Town and credited to the general fund.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect on the 7th day of November, 1940.
