Chairman Pawlak called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the board.

On motion of Councilman Ladwinker, seconded by Councilman Sliwinski the following building petitions were granted and the Town Clerk was authorized to issue permits for same.

Councilman Ladwinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Napieralski;

WHEREAS this Board has been informed by the Curtiss-Wright Corporation that it is imperative, in order to carry out the plans for national defense, that the Cheektowaga plant of the Defense Plant Corporation be completed at a very early date and that it is essential for the completion and use thereof to have the proper storm drainage provided for said site, and

WHEREAS the time prescribed by law for forming a drainage district in this particular instance may delay the early operation of the plant and in consequence thereof delay the efforts to hasten national defense and will undoubtedly result in damage to the property and buildings during the course of construction, and

WHEREAS it has been suggested by the Curtiss-Wright Corporation that it proceed to construct the necessary storm drainage system for the proposed district embracing the whole or a portion of the plant property of the Defense Plant Corporation and that until said district can be formed that the construction of the storm drainage system be financed by the said Curtiss-Wright Corporation and that the contracts be let by them with the object in view of hastening the formation and construction of the system and with the further object of turning over to the Town of Cheektowaga or to the district so formed the storm sewerage system so constructed at the actual cost price of constructing the same and acquiring the necessary rights and easements for the installation and operation therefor,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED that this Board acquiesce in the suggestion set forth by the Curtiss-Wright Corporation that it proceed to construct a storm drainage system for the whole or a portion of the plant property of the Defense Plant Corporation located in the Town and that it finance the same and let contracts for the construction thereof acquire by easements the necessary lands for the same and do all things and acts necessary therefor, and if at some future time as is contemplated the Defense Plant Corporation or the Curtiss-Wright Corporation should petition for the creation of the drainage district embracing the whole or any part of the aforesaid lands that if the system has been constructed in accordance with the aforesaid suggestions and under the direction and planning of Newell L. Nussbaumer, an engineer heretofore engaged by this Board to prepare necessary plans for same and the said system has met the necessary requirements of the State of New York, it is the understanding of this Board, with the Curtiss-Wright Corporation, that this Board, acting as a Town Board or as Commissioners of the drainage district so created, that the cost of creating the district, the construction of it and the purchase of the easements or the lands necessary for the district and all expense connected therewith will be paid to the Curtiss-Wright Corporation upon delivery of the same to the Town of Cheektowaga or the drainage district created in the Town for that purpose at such time as the funds have been made available by the issuance and sale of bonds for the purchase thereof by the district, or the Town, and

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD that upon presentation of the petition for the creating of the district aforesaid that the Town Board will use all possible haste to hurry the creation thereof and the financing of the district.


