

Supervisor Zalemski stated that this meeting had been called for the purpose of meeting with the Town Board of the Town of Amherst to consider sewage disposal conditions in that portion of the Town of Amherst between Wehrle Drive and the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga where sewage facilities are being provided by the Town of Cheektowaga under a certain agreement with the Town of Amherst made the 19th day of April, 1937 together with such other business as may properly come before the board.

Mr. Herman, Supervisor of the Town of Amherst, and the other members of the Town Board of the Town of Amherst, together with Mr. Fields Town Engineer of the Town of Amherst, were present. Mr. Mesner, Superintendent of Disposal Plants and Pumping Stations of the Town of Cheektowaga, and Mr. Hussbaumer of the firm of Hussbaumer and Clarke, Consulting Engineers of the Town of Cheektowaga, were likewise present.

Mr. Herman stated that the Amherst Town Board had received several complaints from the residents in the Town of Amherst who lived in properties wherein sewage facilities were being provided by the sewer system of Sewer District No. 5 of the Town of Cheektowaga. These complaints were to the effect that when heavy rains occurred, sewage would back up into the cellars of these properties, resulting in very unsanitary conditions. He stated that based on the opinion of the Town Engineer of the Town of Amherst, Mr. Fields, the cause of the condition was the overloading of the sewers because of storm waters getting into them from the eaves of houses in the Town of Cheektowaga being connected into the sanitary sewers.

Mr. Fields, stated that this was his opinion as to the cause of the conditions and believed that if the eaves of houses in the Town of Cheektowaga, located for a distance of about 500 feet south of the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga, were disconnected from the sanitary sewer system, no further difficulty would be experienced.

After some discussion between the Town Board Members of both Town, the following resolution was adopted:

TO THE OWNER:

Pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, at a meeting held November 29, 1943, I am hereby notifying you to disconnect all eaves from the sanitary sewer and to provide for such drainage in such fashion that no rain water or melting snow shall be allowed to enter the sanitary sewer.

The necessary changes in the drainage of the roof eaves of your property must be made within sixty (60) days from the date on which this notice is served upon you and if such correction has not been made by that time, then I will be required to take other legal steps to compel you to do so.

You may consult with me at my office in the Town Hall concerning any question you have in regard to this matter.

For let us not forget that that future is in our hands and in the hands of tens of thousands like us who make Cheektowaga their home. These friends and neighbors have delegated us to conduct their civic affairs for them. By their votes they have chosen us. It is our simple duty to prove to them that they exercised good judgment in their selection.

So much, then, for the solemnities of the occasion. It's New Year's day! It's a day for rejoicing, for friendship and celebration. Let's enjoy it with good cheer and high hopes for the bright hours that so surely lie ahead!

God bless us all, and bring to us in 1944, Victory and Peace!

Voting upon all motions, resolutions or other matters before this Board for consideration shall be oral and by ayes and noes and the Clerk of the Board shall, for the purpose of all such voting, call the roll of all members of this Board according to the Alphabetical location of the first letter of the last name of each of the members of the Board, in alphabetical order, A's first and Z's last.
3. No member of this Board present at any given meeting thereof shall be excused from voting on any matter before the Board for vote, except upon the unanimous consent of the Board voting at such time to grant such excuse.
4. No report shall be made by any committee on any subject referred to them in the absence of a majority of said committee unless a majority of the Board so direct.
5. All questions relative to priority of business shall be decided by the Chairman without debate and his decision shall be final, unless reversed by a majority of the members then in attendance.
6. The following standing committee to consist of three members each shall be appointed by the permanent Chairman within twenty-five days after the annual organization meeting and the list of Committees shall be filed with the Town Clerk.
