Mr. Henry offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Niagara Frontier Planning Board, by resolution of that Body, has created a water supply committee to be composed of a member of the Town Boards, Village Boards and City Councils of towns, villages and cities, lying within the proposed county water supply district.

RESOLVED, that this Board shall meet at 3 o'clock P.M. on the 23rd day of October, 1944, for the purpose of holding a public hearing upon such preliminary budget and,

BE IT FURTHER,

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk give notice of such public hearing in the manner provided in Section 113 of the Town Law and that such notice be published in substantially the following form:
