Supervisor Zalemski called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the Board.

The Town Clerk then read the minutes of the regular meeting held on the 19th day of March, 1945, and there being no objections or corrections to same, it was moved by Mr. Pawlak seconded by Mr. Henry, that these minutes stand approved as read and be placed on file.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

A petition from property owners on Southern Parkway, requesting that the Town Board install some kind of street lighting on said street, was read. Supervisor Zalemski referred this petition to the Town Board and Town Attorney for study and recommendation.

Petition from residents on Preston Road to have a street light at 111 Preston Road placed back in service was read, Supervisor Zalemski referred this petition to the Special Districts Committee for study and recommendation.

Communication from the Cleveland Hill Home Owners Ass'n. relative to a traffic light to be installed at Kensington Ave. and Century Road was read. Supervisor Zalemski stated that this light would be installed very shortly, as all arrangements have been made for this work, and the traffic light had been purchased by the Town.

Communication from the Board of Fire Commissioners, U-Crest Fire District No. 4, relative to No-Dumping Signs that were to be posted around their property was read. Supervisor Zalemski referred this request to the Chief of Police for the necessary action.

Copy of communication sent to the U. S. Army Engineers Corp. by Mr. H. Kushfus of 38 East Grand Blvd., Cheektowaga, N.Y., relative to flood conditions at Scajaquada Creek was read, and referred to the Town Board and Town Attorney for study by Supervisor Zalemski.

Petition from property owners at Cleveland Drive and Gehman Blvd. to have this parcel of land re-zoned from residence uses to business uses was read. Supervisor Zalemski referred this petition to the Town Board, Town Attorney and Zoning Board of Appeals for the necessary action.

The Lutheran Church, Ext. Society of Buffalo, located at Unionvale and Union Road, in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York petitioned the Town Board to exempt their property from taxes due to the fact that this property is now being used for religious purposes, only.

Supervisor Zaleski referred this petition to the Board of Assessors for the necessary action.

On motion of Mr. Pawlak seconded by Mr. Henry, the Town Attorney was directed to notify the International Railway Company to repair their road-bed and car tracks at the various locations where they enter into the Town of Cheektowaga, at once.

Supervisor Zaleski referred the Communication from John J. Zablotny, Supt. of Highways, stating that the item of snow removal in the Highway Budget was overdrawn in the amount of \$9000.00 for the year 1945, to the Town Attorney for his opinion and recommendation.

The claim of Babcock, Hallister, Newbury and Russ, Attorneys for damages in the amount of \$167.35, caused by an accident by one of the Town of Cheektowaga trucks on February 20th, 1945, was referred to the Town Attorney by Supervisor Zaleski.

Mr. Pawlak offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, there was undertaken on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, improvements to Scajaquada Creek in or about the year 1937-38, and

WHEREAS, in connection with this improvement sub-lots Nos. 69, 70, 71, 72, 73 and 74, under Cover No. 727, were acquired by the Town of Cheektowaga subsequent to July 1, 1937, and

WHEREAS, the said sub-lots were not exempt from taxation on July 1, 1937, so that taxes for the year 1938 now unpaid in the face amount of \$196.95 are liens against the said sub-lots,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be, and he hereby is, directed to make application to the Board of Supervisors to cancel the back taxes above-referred to, and set forth on the attached tax bill for the year 1938 and prior years, now liens on the above-described lots, and to charge back to the Town of Cheektowaga such cancelled taxes.

Mr. Pawlak offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, a certain water course in the Town of Cheektowaga, known as Scajaquada Creek, beginning at Harlem Road and flowing therefrom in a westerly direction to Pine Ridge Road, which water course is hereinafter called "the water course", and

WHEREAS, the said water course needs to be improved because of the accumulation of earth, sand, mud, stone, trees, bushes and other obstructions in the bed of said water course, and by erosion of the banks of said water course, which accumulations impede the passage of water and need to be removed for the purpose of improved drainage and to protect property within the Town from floods, freshets and high waters, and from unsanitary odors resulting from stagnant water.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that this Town Board, for the purpose of drainage and to protect the property within the Town from floods, freshets and high waters and from unsanitary odors, does hereby determine to deepen, straighten and otherwise improve said water course within the Town of Cheektowaga in order to prevent the same from overflowing and from stagnating, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the cost of the said improvement is hereby estimated to be the sum of \$3000.00, which sum is hereby appropriated to pay the cost of said improvement, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that within ten (10) days after the adoption of this resolution, the Town Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published in the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News, a newspaper published in this Town, and to post copies of such notice, or cause the same to be posted in five (5) conspicuous places in said Town, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such notice shall be in substantially the following form, to wit:

WHEREAS, the Town Attorney has reported to this Board concerning his conference with the Director of the Valuation Bureau of the Interstate Commerce Commission, with reference to the valuations of properties of the several railroads operating within the Town of Cheektowaga, to the effect that a segregation of the data of the Interstate Commerce Commission can be made so as to obtain valuation figures of the properties of the railroads within the Town limits, and he has likewise reported that James B. Latta, formerly a valuation engineer employed by the Interstate Commerce Commission and now engaged in private practice, has offered to make an examination of the records of each of the four (4) railroads and obtain an up-to-date valuation of each of them, as shown by the records of the Interstate Commerce Commission, for the sum of \$875.00, and that the estimated time for doing such work of said James B. Latta and an assistant will be 25 days, and

WHEREAS, this Town Board is of the opinion that an examination of the records pertaining to the properties of the Lehigh Valley Railway Company will be of value in the defense of the certiorari proceedings now pending, as well as to give an indication of the valuations of the other railroads and will indicate whether an examination of the records of the Interstate Commerce Commission, as regards the other railroads, should be made,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney be, and he hereby is, authorized to employ James B. Latta to make an examination of the records of the Interstate Commerce Commission with reference to properties of the Lehigh Valley Railway Company, for the purpose of preparing for the trial of the certiorari proceedings brought by this railroad against the Assessors of the Town of Cheektowaga, and to determine an up-to-date value as set by the Interstate Commerce Commission of the properties of this railroad within the Town of Cheektowaga.

A petition was presented and read from residents living on Wing Court, Burdette Drive, Edge Park, Federal Court, S. Huth Road and Beach Road, protesting against the change of Bus schedule by the Buffalo Transit Company, Supervisor Zalemski referred this petition to the Town Board, Town Attorney and Board of Assessors for investigation.

Supervisor Zalemski referred the complaint about a junk yard on Boardway and operated by a Mr. Warrington to the Health Committee, Health Officer; Dr. Nadolny, Chief of Police; and Town Attorney for investigation.

On motion of Mr. Napieralski seconded by Mr. Ladwinker, the Town Clerk was authorized to petition the County Supt. of Highways to erect a Blvd. Stop Sign at the intersection of Borden Road and Como Park Blvd. in the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, N.Y.

Mr. Ladwinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Evangelical Lutheran St. John's Church of Buffalo has contracted to purchase from the County of Erie certain lands in the Town of Cheektowaga lying adjacent to and at the east end of the property of the Spencer Lens Co., and

WHEREAS, a storm sewer of drainage District No. 2 and a sanitary sewer of Sewer District No. 5 lie at the westerly end of the land now owned by the County of Erie and about to be conveyed to the Evangelical Lutheran St. John's Church of Buffalo, so that easements are required to be obtained on behalf of each of such special improvement district, for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining a storm and a sanitary sewer through these premises, and

WHEREAS, the County of Erie and the Evangelical Lutheran St. John's Church of Buffalo have consented to the granting of such easements to the Town of Cheektowaga for the benefit of said special improvement districts.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be, and he hereby is authorized to execute on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga an agreement with the County of Erie, providing for the conveyance to the Town of Cheektowaga of an easement to construct, operate and maintain a storm and a sanitary sewer upon the premises now owned by the County of Erie, such easements being described as follows:

BEING two (2) strips of land, each ten (10) feet in width, lying five (5) feet on each side of lines drawn through the centers of the manholes in the sewers designated on the map hereto annexed and marked Exhibit "A", as "Present 30 inch Storm Sewer" and "Present 8 inch Sanitary Sewer", said strips of land being bound on the south by a line drawn through a point in the westerly line of Preston Road 105.01 feet northerly from the northerly line of Rowan Road and at an angle of 88°08' to said westerly line of Preston Road and on the north by the line designated on said map as the south line of the Spencer Lens Co. property.

"WHEREAS the New York Central Railroad Company and United States Railroad Administration have presented to the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga, a petition dated January 28th, 1920, on behalf of Buffalo Steel Car Company, Inc., for permission to lay, maintain and operate a switch track at grade, in the Town of Cheektowaga, to be located as shown on the plans submitted with said application across the highway known as the School House Road, at a point between the northerly line of the right of way of the New York Central Railroad Company and a point thirty (30) feet northerly therefrom, for use as an industrial switch in connection with a plant to be constructed and operated on the so-called Imogen Ray Farm by said Buffalo Steel Car Company, Inc., and its assignees and licensees, together with consents, duly executed, of the abutting owners on said School House Road, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the permission asked for be, and the same is hereby, granted to the New York Central Railroad Company and United States Railroad Administration and to Buffalo Steel Car Company, Inc., upon the following terms and conditions:

- (1) The grade of said track shall, at all times, conform to the grade of said School House Road as now established and as the same may be

altered in the future by the Town Board and Board of Highway Superintendents of the Town of Cheektowaga or its successors, and said track shall be laid under the supervision of the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Cheektowaga.

- (2) The roadway of said highway between the rails of said switch track and for the distance of two (2) feet on each side thereof shall be paved with concrete by the New York Central Railroad Company, or by Buffalo Steel Car Company, Inc., and shall be maintained in a good and passable condition by said Buffalo Steel Car Company, Inc., as long as said track shall occupy said highway.
- (3) If, at any time, the said track shall be removed from said highway, the said Buffalo Steel Car Company, Inc. shall pave and restore the portion of said highway theretofore occupied by its said track, so that the same shall at least be equal in quality to the pavement of the roadway of said highway in the said vicinity.
- (4) Public travel in, over and along said highway shall not be delayed or obstructed at any time by the use of said switch track for more than five (5) minutes continuously at any one time.
- (5) No car shall be shunted over said highway, unless a locomotive shall be attached thereto, nor shall any locomotive, or any other railway vehicle, be moved on said track over said highway, or any portion thereof, unless a flagman shall be on duty at said crossing to warn and protect the public in the use of said highway.
- (6) Said track shall not be used for through traffic or general railroad uses or purposes, unless and until the grade of said track and of

Walden Avenue at the point where it crosses said highway shall have been separated without expense to the Town of Cheektowaga or its successor or successors.

- (7) If the construction of the said proposed plant of Buffalo Steel Car Company, Inc. shall not be commenced on or before the 1st day of September 1920, the permission hereby granted shall become and be null, void and of no force or effect.
- (8) The permission hereby granted shall be of no force or effect nor shall the same become operative, in any event, until written acceptance thereof and of the terms and conditions upon which the same was granted shall have been filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga.

And be it further

RESOLVED that the attorney for the Town of Cheektowaga be, and he is hereby, directed, without further notice, to appear before any court, board, commission, or other body, and, for and on behalf of this board, consent to and ask for the confirmation or approval of the above grant upon the foregoing terms and conditions."



Zablotny as Town Superintendent of Highways is hereby authorized and directed to prepare or to have prepared, upon the form prescribed by the Superintendent of Public Works of the State of New York, a statement to be signed and verified by him claiming such payment, which statement shall include only expenditures for snow control on public ways within the boundaries of Town of Cheektowaga during the periods mentioned in subdivisions (1) and (2) of Section 2 of such chapter for the following items exclusively: (1) labor costs exclusive of the salaries or wages of persons regularly employed for municipal purposes, but payments for overtime work on snow control by such regularly employed persons may be included; (2) rental of hired equipment other than new equipment rented from manufacturers or dealers; (3) motor fuel and lubricating oils and greases; (4) cost of erecting and dismantling snow fences; and (5) sand and chloride.

Mr. Pawlak offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Federal Public Housing Administration has contracted for the construction of tile drains in the cellars of many of the buildings of the Ti-O-Run-Da Housing Project for the purpose of alleviating the condition of wet cellars resulting from the infiltration of waters from rains and melting snows, which construction work, when completed, will cause such waters to be drained into the sanitary sewers which are connected to the trunk sewers of Sewer District No. 5 of the Town of Cheektowaga, and

WHEREAS, this Board has today investigated the matter and has personally inspected several of the buildings in which the construction work has been begun, and has reviewed the plans for the work, and

WHEREAS, as a result of this investigation, inspection and study the Town Board has found (1) that the construction of the buildings of the Ti-O-Run-Da Housing Project was begun prior to the effective date of the Cheektowaga Building Code, Plumbing and Drainage Ordinance and Zoning Ordinance, (2) that the crown of the storm sewers in the project is above the level of the tile drains required to be installed in the cellars of the buildings, (3) that the surface waters, which will be drained into the sanitary sewers, are now being drained into them through the floor drains of the cellars.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that this Town Board is of the opinion that the construction work, as laid out in the plans prepared for the Federal Public Housing Administration for the draining of waters infiltrating into the cellars of the buildings of the Ti-O-Run-Da Housing Project, be executed without change, except that this Board recommends that no holes be bored into the outer walls of the cellars, but that such borings be made in the interior wall of the cellar separating the unfinished portion of the cellars from the finished portion.
