Mr. Pawlak offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

WHEREAS, by the notice to contractors published in the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News on the 21st day of December, 1944, as a result of the adoption of a resolution therefor by this Town Board on December 18, 1944, and which resolution and notice to contractors provided for the receipt of bids at a meeting of the Town Board to be held on January 2, 1945, at 3 o'clock P.M. in the Town Hall in the Town of Cheektowaga, which meeting was duly adjourned to January 3, 1945 at the same time and place, which adjourned meeting was duly adjourned generally, both of said meetings being adjourned for the reason that there was no quorum present, resulting from the storm conditions which prevailed and which made it impossible for the members of the Town Board to assemble, it is now in order to receive the sealed proposals for the construction of the following described improvement to this Town, to wit:

Improvement Project No. 1 -

Construction of an 18 inch auxiliary sanitary sewer to run from the second-last manhole on the southerly end of Olcott Street, 594 feet to an existing manhole on Alpine Street, west of the Alpine Pumping Station. Also, construction of a new manhole to replace the existing manhole on Olcott St., north of Herbert Avenue, together with six (6) standard manholes: three at the corner of Olcott Street and Herbert Avenue; the fourth at the corner of Herbert Avenue and Avery Street; the fifth at a point east of Alpine Street; and the sixth on Alpine Street, 52 feet south of the existing manhole, which will be the termination of the auxiliary sanitary sewer. This last existing manhole is to be opened on the southerly side to receive the new sewer. The aforementioned construction is set forth on plans drawn by Nussbaumer and Clarke, Civil Engineers, under date of December 2, 1944, and being drawing No. C4221.

Improvement Project No. 2 -

Construction of an 18 inch auxiliary sanitary sewer to run from the second-last manhole on the southerly end of Olcott Street, northerly to the third existing manhole on said Olcott Street, a distance of 326 feet, to be laid in place of the existing sewer, and construction of a new drop manhole in place of the said third existing manhole. The aforementioned construction is set forth on plans drawn by Nussbaumer and Clarke, Civil Engineers, under date of December 2, 1944 And being Drawing No. C4221.

WHEREAS, the said Central States Equipment Corporation in said certiorari proceedings contends that the correct and proper assessment for the year 1939 should have been the sum of \$68,510.75; for the year 1940, the sum of \$68,510.75; and for the year 1943, the sum of \$48,400.00, and

WHEREAS, said Central States Equipment Corporation has offered to settle and discontinue on the merits and without costs to either party all of said certiorari proceedings, providing that the assessments for the years 1939 and 1940 be reduced by the sum of \$18,000.00 for each of such assessment years, and that refunds thereon be paid without interest, and

WHEREAS, this Town Board, in consideration of the judgement of the Supreme Court of the County of Erie in a certiorari proceeding brought by the said Central States Equipment Corporation attacking the assessment for the year 1938, decided that the correct assessment for that year of the corporations property involved in these proceedings, excepting the Shultz residence and the Adams Gas Stations, was the sum of \$68,510.75, and in consideration further of the opinion of the Town Attorney and of the Board of Assessors.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the offer of the said Central States Equipment Corporation to discontinue on the merits and without costs to either party the certiorari proceedings attacking the assessment of said corporation properties in the Town of Cheektowaga for the assessment years 1939, 1940 and 1943, as above set forth, in consideration of a reduction of \$18,000.00 in the assessments for the assessment years 1939 and 1940, be, and the same hereby is accepted, and the Town Attorney and Supervisor are hereby authorized to take all necessary steps required to implement this resolution, and to execute all necessary documents therefor required.

Since the low bid is \$6,865.00 for Section No. 1 alone, we feel that the Town's best interests would be served by making an award on Section No. 1 only. It would then be possible to try out this work to see whether the flooding conditions have been relieved by the construction. If, after a thorough test, it is found that some further work is required, then at some later time the other part could be built if it is deemed necessary.

Under the circumstances, we recommend the award of the contract for Section No. 1 to C. E. Knowles Co., the low bidder, in the amount of \$6,865.00.
