A regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga Erie County, New York, held at the Town Hall in said Town of Cheektowaga on the 1st day of October, 1945, at 3 O'clock P.M. Eastern Standard Time. There were Present:

A quorum being present, the Chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the Board.

The Town Clerk then proceeded to read the minutes of the meetings held September 17th and September 24th, 1945, and there being no alterations or corrections to same, it was moved by Mr. Pawlak seconded by Mr. Henry that these minutes stand approved as read and ordered placed on file.

A petition from residents in and along Eastland Pkwy., Central Blvd., and Southern Pkwy., stating that they were protesting against the erection of an incinerator Plant on the Disposal Plant site, No. 5, was read. Supervisor Zaleski referred this petition to the Town Board for study.

Petition from Waclaw Domeracki to have a 3.66 acre plot on Cayuga Road, rezoned from residential district to Business district was read and referred to the Town Board, Town Attorney and Board of Assessors for consideration by the Supervisor.

Communication from the Erie County Petroleum Committee, relative to Zoning Ordinance in the Town of Cheektowaga, effecting the storage of gasoline was read, and referred to the Town Board and Zoning Board of Appeals for study.

Supervisor Zaleski referred the claim from for damages to the Town Attorney for the necessary action.

Supervisor Zaleski referred the writ of certiorari filed by the New York Central Railroad Company against the Board of Assessors relative to assessments in the Town of Cheektowaga, To the Town Attorney.

On motion of Mr. Pawlak seconded by Mr. Henry, Vincent Hajza Janitor, was granted an extension to his leave of absence for a period of 30 days without pay, and effective as of October 1st, 1945.

On motion of Mr. Ladwinker seconded by Mr. Pawlak, Supervisor Zaleski was authorized to add to the contract with the N.Y. State Associated Gas and Electric Corp., one additional street light on Brown Street and 2 street lights on Orchard Place, in the Town of Cheektowaga.

On motion of Mr. Ladwinker seconded by Mr. Napieralski, William Swinski was appointed Telephone Operator and effective as of October 1st, 1945.





It is hereby determined and declared that all property included in the boundaries of said district, heretofore described, is benefitted by the creation of said district, and such district is hereby declared to be legally established and shall hereafter be known as consolidated lighting district of the Town of Cheektowaga.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Mr. Ladwinker moved the following resolution and it was seconded by Mr. Henry.

AN ACT to authorize the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, to purchase and install street lighting equipment in Consolidated Lighting District of the Town of Cheektowaga, and to provide for the issuance of bonds therefor and matters in connection therewith.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Whenever a petition requesting the installation of street lighting equipment along a street or highway or portion thereof in Consolidated Lighting District of the Town of Cheektowaga, signed by the owners of real estate fronting or abutting upon either side of said street, highway, or portion thereof to the extent of at least one-half of the entire frontage or bounds on both sides thereof, and acknowledged or proved in the same manner as a deed to be recorded, is filed with the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, the Town Board shall adopt an order reciting in general terms the filing of such petition and its consents and specifying the time and place when and where said Board will meet to consider said petition and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof.

The Board shall cause a copy of such order, certified by the Town Clerk, to be published at least once in the official paper, first publication thereof to be not less than ten (10) nor more than twenty (20) days before the day set therein for the hearing, as aforesaid, and shall also cause copies thereof to be posted conspicuously in five (5) public places on each of said streets or highways or portion thereof.

SECTION 2. After a hearing held upon notice, as hereinbefore provided, and upon the evidence given therein, the Town Board shall determine by resolution (a) whether the petition is signed and acknowledged or proved as required by law and is otherwise sufficient, and (b) whether it is in the public interest to grant in whole, or in part, the relief sought. If the Town Board shall determine that the petition is not signed and acknowledged or proved as required by law, or that it is otherwise insufficient, or if it be determined that it is not in the public interest to grant in whole or in part the relief sought, the Town Board shall deny the petition. If the Town Board shall determine in the affirmative the sufficiency of the petition and that it is in the public interest to grant in whole or in part the relief sought, the board may adopt a resolution approving the petition and authorizing the installation of street lighting equipment along the streets, highways, or portions thereof described in the petition.

SECTION 3. If the Town Board shall determine to grant the relief sought by the petitioners, the Town Board is hereby authorized to purchase and to have installed the street lighting standards and wiring, as specified in the aforesaid resolution. Contracts for the purchase and installation of such equipment shall be approved by the Town Attorney as to form and sufficiency.

SECTION 4. The expense of any public improvement, made under authority of this Act, shall include the amount of all contracts, the costs of all lands and interest therein necessarily acquired, printing, publishing, interest on loans, legal and engineering services, and all other expenses incurred or occasioned by reason of the project.

SECTION 5. After the improvement is constructed and completed, it shall be maintained by the Town Board and the cost for such maintenance shall be a charge upon the consolidated lighting district whose area includes all of the territory of the Town of Cheektowage outside of the Villages of Sloan and Depew.

SECTION 6. The Town Board may finance said improvement, upon completion thereof or at any time prior thereto, by the issuance of obligations of the Town, pursuant to the Local Finance Law. The Town Board shall annually apportion and assess upon the several lots and parcels of land within the district in proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvement shall confer upon the same, and in the manner provided in Section two hundred and two -a of the Town Law for the assessment of the cost of maintenance in a sewer district, an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said obligations as the same shall become due and payable. In the event that the annual collection of such assessment shall be less than the amount required to pay the principal and interest of such obligations as they shall become due, the Town Board shall direct that surplus moneys not otherwise appropriated be applied, or that the supervisor be authorized to negotiate a loan or loans in anticipation of the next succeeding tax levy not exceeding the amount of the deficiency; In case the surplus moneys available are less than the deficiency, such surplus moneys may be used as far as available, and the balance procured, by loan or loans in anticipation of the next succeeding tax levy.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect immediately.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Mr. Pawlek offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, request has been received from John J. Zablony, Superintendent of Highways, for authority to hire additional snow removal equipment because of the unusual amount of snow which has fallen during the past several days, creating an emergency condition such that the town-owned equipment is not sufficient to adequately remove snow from highways under his jurisdiction,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to the provisions of law in such cases provided, John J. Zablony, the Superintendent of Highways, be and he hereby is authorized to hire snow removal equipment from public and private owners thereof during the present emergency created by the unusual fall of snow.

Seconded by Mr. Henry and duly put to a vote which resulted as follows:

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Mr. Ladwinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, there has been installed in the Alpine Pumping Station an automatic gas boiler by Paul Muenzenmaier, for which said Paul Muenzenmaier has presented a voucher in the sum of Four hundred forty-five dollars (\$445.00), and

WHEREAS, this automatic gas boiler was installed under circumstances of necessity.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay out of the funds therefor provided to Paul Muenzenmaier the sum of Four Hundred Forty-five dollars (\$445.00) for installing automatic gas boiler in the Alpine Pumping Station, and the agreement made for such installation is hereby ratified and approved.

Seconded by Mr. Henry and duly put to a vote which resulted as follows:

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Mr. Pawlek offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

WHEREAS, Mussenbaumer and Clarke, Consulting Engineers of the Town of Cheektowaga, have this day filed a report showing the need for immediate repairs to the sludge digester of the sewage treatment plant of Sewer District No. 3, and have estimated that the cost of the required repairs will not exceed the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars, (\$2500.00)

Now, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to expend out of the funds of Sewer District No. 3 of the Town of Cheektowaga the sum not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2500.00) for the purpose of having the sludge digester of the sewage treatment plant of Sewer District No. 3 repaired, and is hereby authorized to contract with C. E. Knowles Co. Inc. to make the necessary repairs.

Seconded by Mr. Henry and duly put to a vote which resulted as follows:
