The following ordinance shall be known and described as "Parking Violations Bureau Ordinance of the Town of Cheektowaga."

Section 1 - Power to Create

Pursuant to Article 14B - Section 370, 371, 372 and 373 of the General Municipal Law, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga hereby authorizes the Justice Court of the Town of Cheektowaga to establish a Traffic Violations Bureau to aid said Court in the disposition of traffic offences when such offences shall not constitute the traffic infraction known as speeding or a misdemeanor or felony and standing violations.

Section 2 - Officers and Hours of Bureau

Said bureau shall be in charge of such person or persons and shall be open at such hours as the Justice Court of the Town of Cheektowaga may designate.

Section 3 - Authority Conferred

Said Traffic Violations Bureau so established is authorized to dispose of traffic violations of traffic laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of the State or Local Laws, when such offences shall not constitute the traffic infraction known as speeding or a misdemeanor or felony, by permitting a person charged with an offence within the limitations herein stated, to answer, within a specified time, at the Traffic Violations Bureau, either in person or by written power of attorney as herein prescribed, by paying a prescribed fine and, in writing, waiving a hearing in court, pleading guilty to the charge and authorizing the person or persons in charge of the Bureau to make such a plea and pay such a fine in Court.

Section 4 - Procedure

Whenever any motor vehicle owner, operator, chauffeur or driver shall be found by a Police Officer in violation of any traffic laws, ordinances, rules and regulations when such offences shall not constitute the traffic infraction known as speeding or a misdemeanor or felony, said police officer may affix a tag to said vehicle or serve a summons on said owner, operator, chauffeur or driver, which tag or summons shall contain a notice of the particular violation, directed to the said owner, operator, chauffeur or driver and require such person within twenty-four (24) hours to take said tag or summons to the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga and give the name and address of the owner, operator, chauffeur or driver, who had charge of said vehicle at the time of the violation as stated in said notice and pay a prescribed sum to the person or persons in charge of the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga; or on a form hereinafter prescribed, give the name and address of the owner, operator, chauffeur or driver who had charge of said vehicle at the time of the violation as stated in the said notice with a remittance payable to the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga, for the prescribed sum which may be mailed to the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga, Town Hall, Broadway and Union Road, Cheektowaga, New York.

If such person does not appear, send or mail the tag or summons and pay the prescribed sum within twenty-four (24) hours, a summons shall be issued for his appearance in the Justice Court of the Town of Cheektowaga to answer the charge.

Acceptance of the prescribed sum by the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga, shall be deemed complete satisfaction for the offence, and the violator shall be given a receipt which so states.

Section 5 - Right to Counsel

Said Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga, shall not be authorized to deprive a person of his right to counsel or to prevent him from exercising his right to appear in Court to answer, explain or defend any charge of a violation of any traffic law, ordinance, rule or regulation.

Section 6 - Designation of Fines

The Justice Court shall designate the fines to be paid for offences which may be satisfied by the bureau as hereinbefore stated, provided such fines are within the limits established as penalties for such offences.

Section 7 - Records

The Traffic Violations Bureau as herein authorized shall maintain a record of all fines collected and the disposition thereof. It shall also perform such other or additional duties and keep such other or additional records as shall be prescribed by the Court and/or the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Section 8 - Prescribed Form

All persons who shall appear by written power of attorney must execute the following form and forward to the Traffic Violations Bureau said form together with their operators license, and the sum prescribed by the Justice Court of the Town of Cheektowaga;



Section 2 - Officers and Hours of Bureau

Section 5 - Right to Counsel
Said Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga, shall not be authorized to deprive a person of his right to counsel or to prevent him from exercising his right to appear in Court to answer, explain or defend any charge of a violation of any traffic law, ordinance, rule or regulation.

Section 6 - Designation of Fines
The Justice Court shall designate the fines to be paid for offences which may be satisfied by the Bureau as hereinbefore stated, provided such fines are within the limits established as penalties for such offences.

Section 7 - Records
The Traffic Violations Bureau as herein authorized shall maintain a record of all fines collected and the disposition thereof. It shall also perform such other or additional duties and keep such other or additional records as shall be prescribed by the Court and/or the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Section 8 - Prescribed Form

AN ACT

To provide research and technical assistance for air pollution control

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That in testimony of the dangers to the public health and welfare, injury to crops and livestock, damage to and deterioration of property, and hazards to air and ground transportation from air pollution, it is hereby declared to be the policy of Congress to preserve and protect the primary responsibilities and rights of the States and local governments in controlling air pollution, to support Federal technical research to devise and develop methods of abating such pollution, and to provide Federal technical services and financial aid to State and local government air pollution control agencies and other public or private agencies and institutions in the formulation and execution of their air pollution abatement research programs. For this purpose, the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare, and the Surgeon General of the Public Health Service, under the supervision and direction of the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare, shall have the authority relating to air pollution control vested in them respectively by this Act.

BY-NUMBER 124
ENVIRONMENTAL SANITATION

Sec. 2. (a) The Surgeon General is authorized, after careful investigation and in cooperation with other Federal agencies, with State and local government air pollution control agencies, with other public and private agencies and institutions, and with the industries involved, to prepare or recommend research programs for devising and developing methods for eliminating or reducing air pollution. For the purpose of this subsection the Surgeon General is authorized to make joint investigations with any such agencies or institutions.

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(b) The Surgeon General may: (1) encourage cooperative activities by State and local government; for the prevention and abatement of air pollution; (2) collect and disseminate information relating to air pollution and the prevention and abatement thereof; (3) create in the Public Health Service, and support and maintain, by State and local government air pollution control agencies and other public and private agencies and institutions of technical research to devise and develop methods of preventing and abating air pollution; and (4) make available to State and local government air pollution control agencies, other public and private agencies and institutions, and industries, the results of surveys, studies, investigations, research, and experiments relating to air pollution and the prevention and abatement thereof.

Sec. 3. The Surgeon General may, upon request of any State or local government air pollution control agency, conduct investigations and research and make surveys concerning any specific problem of air pollution confronting such State or local government air pollution control agency, in a view to recommending a solution of such problem.

Sec. 4. The Surgeon General shall prepare and submit, from time to time, reports of such surveys, studies, investigations, research, and experiments to be made under the authority of this Act to the Secretary and to such other appropriate governmental officials concerned with the control of air pollution.

Sec. 5. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated to the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare for each fiscal year beginning with the fiscal year ending July 1, 1955, and continuing thereafter, the sum of \$1,000,000 to enable the Secretary to carry out the purposes of this Act and in furtherance of the policy declared in this Act.

Sums appropriated for such grants-in-aid and contracts shall remain available until expended, and shall be allotted by the Surgeon General in accordance with regulations prescribed by the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare.

Sec. 6. When used in this Act-

(a) The term "State air pollution control agency" means the State health authority, except that in the case of any State in which there is a single State agency other than the State health authority charged with responsibility for enforcing State laws relating to the abatement of air pollution, it means such other State agency;

(b) The term "local government air pollution control agency" means a city, county, or other local government health authority, except that in the case of any city, county, or other local government in which there is a single agency other than the health authority charged with responsibility for enforcing ordinances or laws relating to the abatement of air pollution, it means such other agency; and

(c) The term "State" means a State or the District of Columbia.

Sec. 7. Nothing contained in this Act shall limit the authority of any department or agency of the United States to conduct or make grants-in-aid or contracts for research and experiments relating to air pollution under the authority of any other law.

WHEREAS, the expense of making the improvements hereinafter described must be borne by local assessment upon the several lots and parcels of land within the district in proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvements shall confer upon the same, and in the summer provided in Section 202-a of the Town Law for the assessment of the cost of maintenance in a sewer district as the same shall be annually determined and apportioned by the Town Board, and the Town Board desires to issue capital notes to finance the cost of said improvements and to annually apportion and assess upon the several lots and parcels of land especially benefited by such improvements in proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvements shall confer upon the same, an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the capital notes issued for such improvements as the same shall become due and payable, all of which shall be done in accordance with the provisions of Subdivision 6 of Section 198 of the Town Law.

- (j) Isabelle Road from Applewood Road to Applewood Road.
- (k) Applewood Road from Isabelle Road to Cayuga Road.

Section 3. It is hereby stated that:

- (a) The maximum cost of said purpose as estimated by the Town Board is \$11,000.00.
- (b) No money has heretofore been applied to the payment of the cost of said purpose.
- (c) The Town Board plans to finance the cost of said purpose from funds raised by the issuance of said capital notes.
- (d) All of such cost is to be paid by assessments upon benefited real property in an area less than the area of said Town.

Section 4. For the purpose of paying the cost of such purpose, there are hereby authorized to be issued, pursuant to the Local Finance Law of New York,

- Such notes shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding two and three-quarters per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on January 1 and July 1. Such capital notes to be in bearer form with the privilege of conversion to capital notes registered as to principal and interest.

Section 5. All other matters, except as provided here in, relating to such capital notes shall be determined by the Supervisor. There shall be annually apportioned and assessed upon the several lots and parcels of land beneficially benefited by the improvements in proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvements shall confer thereon the same, and in the manner provided in Section 202-a of the Town Law, an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such capital notes as the same become due and payable.

Such capital notes shall be sold at private sale by the Supervisor at a price of not less than par value of and accrued interest, if any, and the proceeds of such sale shall be applied solely for the purpose aforesaid, but the receipt of the Supervisor shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser of such capital notes who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 8. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in Subdivision 35 of paragraph (a) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is five (5) years.

Section 9. It is hereby determined that the proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will be not later than July 1, 1959.

Section 10. The validity of said capital notes may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within 20 days after the date of such publication; or if said obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

Section 11. Section 1 - Power to Create
Pursuant to Article 14B - Section 370, 371, 372 and 373 of the General Municipal Law, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga hereby authorizes the Justice Court of the Town of Cheektowaga to establish a Traffic Violations Bureau to aid said Court in the disposition of traffic offenses when such offenses shall not constitute a traffic infraction known as speeding or a misdemeanor or felony and standing violations.

Section 2 - Officers and Hours
Said bureau shall be in charge of such person or persons and shall be open at such hours as the Justice Court of the Town of Cheektowaga may designate.

Section 3 - Authority Conferred
Said Traffic Violations Bureau so established is authorized to dispose of traffic violations of traffic laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of the State or Local Laws, when such offenses shall not constitute the traffic infraction known as speeding or a misdemeanor or felony, by permitting a person charged with an offense within the limitations herein stated, to answer, within a specified time, at the Traffic Violations Bureau, either in person or by written power of attorney as herein prescribed, by paying a prescribed fine and, in writing, waiving a hearing in Court, pleading guilty to the charge and authorizing the person or persons in charge of the Bureau to make such a plea and pay such a fine in Court.

Section 4 - Procedure
Whenever any motor vehicle owner, operator, chauffeur or driver shall be found by a Police Officer in violation of any traffic laws, ordinances, rules and regulations when such offenses shall not constitute the traffic infraction known as speeding or a misdemeanor or felony, said police officer may affix a tag to said vehicle or serve

a summons on said owner, operator, chauffeur or driver, which tag or summons shall contain a notice of the particular violation, directed to the said owner, operator, chauffeur or driver and require such person within twenty-four (24) hours to take said tag and summons to the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga and give the name and address of the owner, operator, chauffeur or driver, who had charge of said vehicle at the time of the violation as stated in said notice and pay a prescribed sum to the person or persons in charge of the Traffic Violations Bureau on a form hereinafter prescribed, give the name and address of the owner, operator, chauffeur or driver who had charge of said vehicle at the time of the violation as stated in the said notice with a remittance payable to the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga, for the prescribed sum which may be mailed to the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga, Town Hall, Broadway and Union Road, Cheektowaga, New York.

If such person does not appear, send or mail the tag or summons and pay the prescribed sum within twenty-four (24) hours, a summons shall be issued for his appearance in the Justice Court of the Town of Cheektowaga to answer the charge.

Acceptance of the prescribed sum by the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga shall be the offense, and the violator shall be given a receipt which so stated.

Section 5 - Right to Counsel
Said Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga, shall not be authorized to deprive a person of his right to counsel or to prevent him from exercising his right to appear in Court to answer, explain or defend any charge of a violation of any traffic law, ordinance, rule or regulation.

Section 6 - Designation of Fines
The Justice Court shall designate the fines to be paid for offenses which may be satisfied by the bureau as hereinbefore stated, provided such fines are within the limits

established as penalties for such offenses.

Section 7 - Records
The Traffic Violations Bureau as herein authorized shall maintain a record of all fines collected and the disposition thereof. It shall also perform such other or additional records as shall be prescribed by the Court and/or the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga.

Section 4 - Procedure

Whenever any motor vehicle owner, operator, chauffeur or driver shall be found by a Police Officer in violation of any traffic laws, ordinances, rules and regulations when such offenses shall not constitute the traffic infraction known as speeding or a misdemeanor or felony, said police officer may affix a tag to said vehicle, or serve a summons on said owner, operator, chauffeur or driver, which tag or summons shall contain a notice of the particular violation, directed to the said owner, operator, chauffeur or driver and require such person within twenty-four (24) hours to take said tag or summons to the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga and give the name and address of the owner, operator, chauffeur or driver, who had charge of said vehicle at the time of the violation as stated in said notice and pay a prescribed sum to the person or persons in charge of the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga; or on a form hereinafter prescribed, give the name and address of the owner, operator, chauffeur or driver who had charge of said vehicle at the time of the violation as stated in the said notice with a remittance payable to the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga, for the prescribed sum which may be mailed to the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Town of Cheektowaga, Town Hall, Broadway and Union Road, Cheektowaga, New York.

Assuming the qualifications of Fago Brothers are acceptable, there should be no doubt about awarding sections A & C to them. The question arises as to whether the CMI Construction Company have adequate experience, equipment and resources to expeditiously construct section B, which is the biggest section with pipes in diameter of 24 inches to 30 inches, and depths of excavation to 22 feet.

We have talked with both contracting firms and the two contractors have also called on the supervisor to explain their qualifications for doing the work.

We have asked each contractor to submit to us evidence of professional experience, finances, equipment and experience records to qualify them for constructing the sections of the project upon which they are the apparently qualified low bidders.

Attached to this letter is a letter dated September 11, 1957 from the Aetna Casualty and Surety Company, who write bonds for the CMI Construction Company, outlining the qualifications of the firm. Mr. Eggleston stated in a note that had been attached to his letter to the effect that the contractor has ordered a 1 3/4 cubic yard tractor which will probably be delivered in three weeks. He further said that they propose to have the tunneling under neath the Thruway done by Gentry who are contractors specializing in this class of work. We have not, as yet, however, been able to secure any information regarding their activities on the installation of work the size of that in this particular job.

The insurance and bonding company stated that the various people associated with the company will all be on the bond and that their combined assets would back the job. A combination of statements from each person, dated as of August 1, 1957 and from December 31, 1956 are enclosed. They have cash assets as of the date of the statements in the neighborhood of \$66,000. The equipment and real estate items amounts to about \$300,000.

There is a copy of a letter from the M & T Bank signed by Mr. James J. Oddy stating that they would finance the earned estimated of the contract.

We asked CMI Construction Company to submit a detailed list of work which they had done, which they did by letter dated September 17, 1957. The letter is attached. We have talked with several of the supervising engineers and town officials with regard to this work and have received answers generally stating that the dollar volume of the work has not been large. The diameter of the sewers have been in the range of eight to twelve inches, and the depth of excavation has been shallow.

Justice of the Peace Ralph J. Radwan was granted the floor and demanded to know how the town expected to hold its contractors to their bids if they were opened before the Board approved the project.

Town Attorney Delahunt said the contracts would not be awarded until after the resolution was passed.

The Chairman ordered the bids referred to the Town Engineer for analysis and tabulation.
