DESCRIPTION OF TERRITORY PROPOSED TO BE
ANNEXED TO U-CREST FIRE DISTRICT NO. 4

ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND situate in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York, being more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at the point of intersection of the easterly line of the existing fire district with the center line of Genesee Street.

Running thence easterly along the center line of Genesee Street to the westerly line of lands now or formerly owned by W. Poston and wife.

Thence northerly along the westerly line of lands now or formerly owned by W. Poston and wife, 353 feet more or less to the southerly line of lands conveyed under Liber 2043 of Deeds, Page 190.

Thence easterly along the southerly line of lands so conveyed, 374 feet more or less to the northeasterly line of lands conveyed under Liber 1871 of Deeds, Page 188.

Thence southerly along the easterly line of lands so conveyed, 354 feet more or less to the center line of Genesee Street.

Thence easterly along the center line of Genesee Street to the easterly line of the lands of Cornell Aeronautical Laboratory, Inc.

Section 3. 



Such capital notes shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Supervisor shall determine.

Section 6. The faith and credit of the Town of Cheektowaga are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such capital notes as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such capital note becoming due and payable in such year. There shall be annually apportioned and assessed upon the several lots and parcels of land especially benefited by the aforesaid improvements in proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvements shall confer upon the same, and in the manner provided in Section 202-a of the Town Law, an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such capital notes as the same become due and payable.

Section 9. It is hereby determined that the proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will be not later than October 1, 1959.

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
