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AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made as of the *15th* day of *October*, 1973 by and between THE PROTESTANT EPISCOPAL DIOCESE OF WESTERN NEW YORK, a religious corporation of the State of New York, with offices at 1114 Delaware Avenue, Buffalo, New York, party of the first part, hereinafter referred to as the "Episcopal Diocese"

and

TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, ERIE COUNTY, NEW YORK, a domestic municipal corporation having its principal place of business at Broadway and Union Road (no street number) Cheektowaga, New York, party of the second part, hereinafter referred to as "Town".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Episcopal Diocese is the owner of certain real property located in the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York and more particularly identified hereafter, and

WHEREAS, the Town is desirous of using said real property for playground and neighborhood recreation center uses and such uses by the Town are in the best interests of the Episcopal Diocese,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO, pursuant to the provisions of Section 241 of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, as follows:

1. That the Episcopal Diocese hereby grants to the Town the right to use for playground and neighborhood recreation center purposes, free of charge, from *October 15*, 1973 until

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OCTOBER 15, 1978 unless otherwise sooner terminated, the following described real property:

DESCRIPTION

ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND, situate in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York, being part of Lot No. 12, Township 11, Range 7 of the Holland Land Company's Survey, bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at the southeast corner of said Lot No. 12; running thence westerly along the south line of said Lot No. 12 a distance of 311 feet more or less to the easterly line of lands shown under Map Cover 2069 filed in the Erie County Clerk's Office; thence northerly on a line parallel with the east line of said Lot No. 12, and along the easterly line of said Map Cover a distance of 481.44 feet to a point which is 180 feet south of the south line of George Urban Boulevard; thence easterly on a line parallel with the south line of George Urban Boulevard and 180 feet southerly therefrom a distance of 311 feet more or less to the east line of said Lot No. 12; and thence southerly along the east line of said Lot a distance of 482.96 feet more or less to the south line of Lot 12 at the point or place of beginning.

EXCEPTING AND RESERVING therefrom a 100 foot strip from the south end of the above-described property which was conveyed to one Bernard L. Kieffer by deed dated March 22, 1967, and recorded in the Erie County Clerk's Office in Liber of Deeds at Page .

2. That this grant of use is made by the Episcopal Diocese upon the following conditions which the Town agrees to

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comply with and perform:

A. That the said real property described in paragraph 1 above, including any improvements constructed thereon by the Town, shall be maintained by the Town in good repair and free and clear of debris, high weeds and grass, rubbish, junk or deleterious materials and the condition of the property shall at all times be such as not to constitute a nuisance or otherwise deteriorate the neighborhood and shall only be used for playground and recreation center purposes.

B. That at all times that this agreement is in effect, the Town shall maintain in effect a comprehensive general liability insurance policy written by an insurance company authorized to conduct such business in New York State in which insurance policy the Episcopal Diocese shall be named insureds and the policy shall have bodily injury limits of not less than \$ 100 - 300 M per person and \$ 300 M for any occurrence; and a copy of said insurance policy shall be furnished to the Episcopal Diocese.

C. That the Town shall hold the Episcopal Diocese indemnified and free and harmless from any and all claims for personal injury and/or property damage which may at any time occur by reason of the use of the Town of said real property.

D. That the rights herein granted shall not be transferred, conveyed, deeded, assigned or otherwise disposed of by the Town.

3. In case of partial or complete condemnation of the real property described in paragraph 1 above, the rights of the Town will immediately terminate and the Episcopal Diocese shall be completely and fully released from any and all obligations under this agreement.

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4. That all improvements constructed by the Town on the said real property shall belong to the Town until this agreement shall expire on *OCTOBER 15*, 1978 or shall be sooner terminated as otherwise provided in this agreement, except the Town shall have sixty days after such date of expiration or date of termination to remove all such improvements which it desires to remove and shall restore the ground to its present condition, including the sodding thereof, and any improvements not removed by the Town by the end of said sixty day period shall thereupon become the sole and absolute property of the Episcopal Diocese.

5. That any violation of the terms and conditions of this agreement by the Town or the discontinuance of the use of the said real property by the Town shall thereupon terminate the rights herein granted to the Town and all rights herein of the Town shall cease to exist and the Episcopal Diocese shall be fully and completely released from any and all obligations under this agreement, and the Town shall immediately surrender possession to the Episcopal Diocese.

6. That the rights of the Town herein granted are subject to all rights of use, easements and restrictions of record, if any.

7. That the Episcopal Diocese will, at its own expense, cause a six foot fence to be erected around said real property with at least two access areas.

8. That this agreement is binding upon the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.

9. That this represents the entire agreement between the parties hereto and there are no other agreements, representations or warranties.

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A G R E E M E N T

THIS AGREEMENT, made at Buffalo, New York, this 15th day of October, 1973, by and between HOLIDAY TWIN RINKS, INC., a Corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, with principal place of business at 3465 Broadway, Cheektowaga, New York, hereinafter referred to as "Holiday", and Town of Cheektowaga, hereinafter referred to as "Permittee".

W I T N E S S E T H :

I. PREMISES

A. Holiday hereby grants a permit to Permittee to use one of the two ice skating rinks housed in the building located at 3465 Broadway, Cheektowaga, New York and one of the dressing rooms in said building, on an exclusive basis, which rink and dressing room shall be designated by Holiday. In addition, this permit shall cover the non-exclusive use of the lobby, vestibules, hallways and other public facilities, including parking areas, as any or all of the foregoing are appropriate to the particular use of the facilities herein permitted.

B. The Permittee shall have complete control of the rink and dressing room where the Permittee is given exclusive use, subject to any municipal, police, fire and health regulations and the reasonable requirements of Holiday.

II. TERM

The term of this permit shall be for the period of time from November 1, 1973 to April 1, 1974, for the following designated hours:

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III. RENT

Permittee shall pay to Holiday at Holiday's office a total rental of \$20,480.00, which rental shall be payable as follows:

25% of said rental shall be paid on or before
October 1, 1973. \$5,120.00

18.75% of said rental shall be paid on or before
November 10, 1973. \$3,840.00

18.75% of said rental shall be paid on or before
January 10, 1974. \$3,840.00

18.75% of said rental shall be paid on or before
February 10, 1974. \$3,840.00

18.75% of said rental shall be paid on or before
March 10, 1974. \$3,840.00

IV. USE OF PREMISES

A. Permittee shall use the building for the conduct of an ice skating and hockey rink subject approval by Holiday Twin Rinks.

B. Permittee shall keep the building in good and clean repair and shall not permit the accumulation of rubbish or debris on the premises of said building and Permittee shall make all necessary repairs to the structure and interior of the building which become necessary or are caused through the actions of Permittee, its assigns, agents, employees, invitees, licensees or any other personnel thereof. Any such repairs shall be completed with due diligence by the Permittee.

C. Permittee shall not injure or mar, nor in any manner deface the premises granted herein, and shall not cause nor permit anything to be done whereby the said premises shall be in any manner be injured, marred, or defaced, nor shall such premises be altered in any way whatsoever.

V. UTILITIES AND ICE CLEANING SERVICES

Holiday shall pay for all water, heat, gas and electrical

current used or consumed in the building during the term of this permit. In addition, Holiday shall provide for the cleaning of the ice facilities and the rink. However, Holiday shall not be liable for any interruption or delay in any of the above services and Permittee shall not pay for time not used due to such interruption.

VI. INSURANCE

A. Permittee shall procure and pay for public liability insurance in the amounts of \$100,000.00 per person and \$300,000.00 per accident of personal injury and \$50,000.00 for property damage. Holiday shall be listed as an additional insured under such policies and shall be granted fifteen (15) days written notice of any cancellation of said policies.

B. Permittee shall, in addition to the insurance called for under Section A hereunder, secure blanket contractual liability coverage under this Agreement.

C. In the event of cancellation of any of the policies referred to in Sections A or B hereunder, Holiday shall have the option of cancelling this Agreement upon notification of the cancellation of such coverage be secured with due diligence.

VII. DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION

In the event of total or partial destruction of the building by fire or other peril, during the term of this permit or subsequent to the signing of this permit, Holiday shall have the option of terminating this permit by giving to the Permittee written notice to that effect or repairing the building with due diligence and continuing this Agreement in effect. Should Holiday decide to repair the damage with due diligence, the rent for the period required for such repairs shall be equitably

reduced in proportion to the reduction, if any, in usable space of the demised premises.

VIII. NONLIABILITY OF HOLIDAY

This Agreement is made upon the express condition that Holiday shall be free from all liabilities in claims for damages and/or suits for or by reason of any injury or injuries to any person or persons or property of any kind whatsoever, whether the person or property of Permittee, its agents, assigns, employees, invitees, licensees or any other personnel, or any third persons, from any cause or causes whatsoever while in or upon said premises or any part thereof during the term of this Agreement or occasioned by any occupancy or use of said premises or any activity carried on by Permittee in connection therewith, and Permittee hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify and save harmless Holiday from all liabilities, charges, claims, expenses (including counsel fees) and costs on account of or by reason of such injuries, liabilities, claims, suits or losses however occurring or damages growing out of same.

IX. RESPONSIBILITY FOR REMOVAL OF PROPERTY

In the event that any personal property or equipment is brought on to the demised premises by the Permittee, its agents, assigns, employees, invitees, licensees or any other personnel, or any third persons, the same shall be removed from the demised premises by the Permittee. If the Permittee fails to remove such property or equipment, Holiday may arrange for such removal and, if there be any cost for removal, charge the Permittee.

X. ASSIGNMENT

Holiday shall be permitted to assign this permit upon



In his letter of November 9, 1973 to this office, Mr. Vito Causo of Nussbaumer and Clarke Inc. advised that three (3) items of work are required in order that Sanitary Sewer District No. 3 be included in the Erie County Sewer District No. 4 grant application. One of the items, "Smoke Testing" is now underway. Another item, Environmental Assessment Statement" will be presented for Town Board approval at the next meeting.

At present, approval is needed to authorize the firm of Nussbaumer and Clarke Inc. to prepare plans and specifications under the existing contract with this consulting firm, dated February 2, 1972. The plans and specifications are for the Town Sewer District No. 3 connection to the proposed Erie County Sewer District No. 4 line and also for Excess Flow Handling Facilities to be constructed at the site of Plant No. 3. The Wastewater Facilities Report recommends these excess flow facilities by using most of the existing structures. In Erie County Sewer District No. 4, we were informed that such excess flow facilities are planned for all communities involved.

Mr. Robert Martens, Project Coordinator, County of Erie informed us that in the County Sewer District No. 4 re-application for aid they will include the cost for the Town connection and excess flow facilities. On November 28, 1973 Mr. Martens advised us that as he understands from his conversation with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and Federal Environmental Protection Agency personnel, the excess flow facilities are eligible and fundable under existing legislation. We have no assurance of this. Plans and specifications must be submitted with the County District No. 4 re-application before March 31, 1974.

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


In accordance with Subchapter D, Part 55, Chapter 2 of Administrative Rules and Regulations of the New York State Department of Health - Division of Laboratories and Research which implement Sections 504 and 505 of the Public Health Law, this institution requests your cooperation in making available dogs and cats which after the legal holding period would otherwise be destroyed.

These animals are vitally needed to carry out the programs of biomedical research and teaching of the State University of New York and its affiliated hospitals in the Buffalo area. The above-cited regulations provide the basis for requisition of such animals by approved laboratories.

The Animal Facilities of the State University of New York have been approved by the New York State Department of Health and the U.S. Department of Agriculture which enforces the Federal Animal Welfare Act. You may rest assured that animals made available to this institution will receive the best of professional diagnosis and treatment of pre-existing disease and will be utilized for approved scientific purposes which are under continual scrutiny to assure humane consideration and care of the animals. This activity is necessary to achieve the kind of progress in medical science that benefits all of the people of this area.

To Village and Town Officials in New York State:

New York State offices are mounting an active and widespread legislative program to strip Villages and Towns of many of their vital powers and functions relating to land use and community development. These offices include the N. Y. State Office for Local Government, the N. Y. State Office for Planning Services and the N. Y. State Department of Environmental Conservation. The top staff people in these State offices are actively leading this program.

To that end, at the Federal level, legislative bills are being pushed in Congress to establish a Federal land use policy which would induce and require N. Y. State to restructure the local governments of Villages and Towns as mentioned above.

We are furnishing to you, a Position Paper on these N. Y. State legislative proposals, and a Memorandum on the pending Federal legislative bills.

It is imperative that you study these papers and promptly make your views known to your State Legislators and your U. S. Legislators. It is suggested that you furnish to them, copies of these enclosures as reflecting your views.

- (1) To Protect Local Governments' (Villages and Towns) Basic Powers and Functions
- and
- (2) To Reject Regional Government Theories proposed in
 - (i) Report of Temporary N.Y. State Commission (Wagner) on Powers of Local Government,
 - (ii) (N.Y. State) Office of Local Government Annual Report and other publications of State Offices including Office of Planning Services, and
 - (iii) (N.Y. State) Environmental Plan of Department of Environmental Conservation.

This Position Paper is a reply by Local Governments (principally Villages and Towns) to the Regional Government Proposals of the Wagner Commission and the Office for Local Government.

All 64 Villages of Nassau County, with a population of 450,000 people, reject fully and vigorously this Regional Government proposal. Such rejection of Regional Government theories is a position held by Villages and Towns throughout the State. This position has been repeatedly, over the years, presented to the State, most recently to its Office for Local Government and Office for Planning. Our latest publication stating our position was a printed statement issued this April, entitled "The Office Against Local Government", as a reply to a printed article issued by the Office for Local Government, entitled "Constitutional Restrictions on Local Governments".

What is Regional Government Theory? It is that regional governments (as distinguished from local governments such as Villages and Towns) should be established and should take over various vital powers and functions of local governments such as planning and zoning and various other services including local police and local street maintenance.

Who supports this Regional Government Theory? It originated 40-odd years ago as a theoretical concept in academic circles and has been perpetuated as textbook gospel by government and professional planning theoreticians. These Regional Theory

exponents are the supporters of this theory. Many of them are State employees in several State agencies, mentioned above.

What is the Public response to this Regional Government Theory? The people of the State overwhelmingly reject this theory. They support their local governments. Those local governments are close and responsive to the people they serve. Their communities have been planned and developed for years by these local governments through the exercise of their powers and functions along policy lines acceptable to the people served.

In 1967, at the New York State Constitutional Convention, the regional government theory was reflected in certain proposals and rejected.

In 1972, a proposed State Constitutional amendment which embodied the theory of State Agencies carrying out Community Development programs was rejected by the people.

In 1970, the N.Y. State Conference of Mayors, with a membership which includes more than 400 Villages throughout the State, reaffirmed its support of the Home Rule Powers of Local Government and its rejection of any transfer of any of their powers and functions to State or regional government agencies or units.

Specifically, what are some of these Regional Government proposals of the Governor and who are their spokesmen?

(i) The Wagner Report was prepared by a staff of employees, with an array of consultants. Not one of these is a Mayor or Supervisor or other official of any Village or Town in the State. Virtually all of them are regional government exponents. Many of them are spokesmen for Regional Governments, such as top administrators in the State Offices for Local Government, Planning Services and Environmental Conservation. These are the three State Offices whose report favoring Regional Government we are opposing. And the consultants include various college professors and planning professionals as experts.

(ii) The Wagner Report specifically concludes that "Expert opinion" holds that certain functions of local governments "should be transferred to regional or State agencies". The platitudinous, cliché language used as arguments to support Regional Government Theory are the same, familiar stuff which you will find in textbooks on Regional Government. These opinions and rationales are used indiscriminately throughout the country, without any real regard for the facts in a particular local situation. The material is wholly unsupported. You find such self-service characterizations as local government "fragmentations" and "irrationally fragmented" power, "proliferation" of governmental units, and the impossible "status quo".

(iii) The Wagner Report completely ignores all of the competent evidence (including a statement on behalf of the 64

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Villages of Nassau County) from local government officials, establishing the fact that local governments, such as these villages, render efficient and effective services to their communities, at cost levels which compare very favorably with State and regional cost levels, and, most important, to the satisfaction and support of the people of the local communities. The report ignores a paramount fact of common knowledge to local government officials, that people do not respond to or favor regional governments for those functions and services rendered by local governments, such as Villages and Towns. In this vital respect, certain local governments which are, in effect, regional governments, such as New York City and certain of its nearby Counties, have failed to establish any spirit of identity and support by their people.

(iv) The Wagner Report favors the establishment of legal mechanisms whereby local government power and functions could be taken away and transferred to regional governments without a majority vote of the people in the affected village or local government area. The argument they advance to support this undemocratic transfer is that they consider the particular function as "regional".

(v) The Wagner Report would, as applied to Nassau County and its more than 1,500,000 people, in effect create a city of Nassau, thereby rendering to vestigial insignificance its 64 Villages and 3 Towns. For certain local governments they would create another layer on top of a regional government. These would be the seeds of destruction of the local governments with which the people actively identify in their daily lives.

(vi) The Wagner Report would subject and subordinate the land use planning and legislation of Villages and Towns to the overriding regulations and dictation by County planning agencies. And, hence, County employees, using County standards and public policy considerations, would replace publicly-elected local legislative bodies and their appointed planning and zoning bodies. The people in the Villages and Towns in Nassau County and throughout the State want no part of this regional government take-over.

(vii) Similarly, the Environment Plan of the State Department of Environmental Conservation, on the pretext that it is an environmental matter and therefore per se beyond the competence of effective regulation by local governments, proposes taking away those functions from local governments and transfer them to the "broader community" level of government -- apparently State and regional levels. The report argues "it is unreasonable to expect a town or village working alone" to bring about the changes required for environmental development.

The Report ignores the fact that local governments, in planning for their orderly growth and development, give due

consideration to environmental matters and do not work alone. They consult with other public planning agencies, local or county. They engage professional planners who competently concern themselves with all relevant factors, including regional and State matters.

(viii) Both the Wagner Report and the Environmental Report seek to take away from local governments their fundamental planning and zoning powers in the critical area of housing development. The excuse given is that "housing development clearly have impacts beyond a single jurisdiction's boundaries". This is simple semantics for saying "housing is a regional problem and therefore should be regulated by a regional authority". Local governments reject this position. Publicly elected local governments are fully competent to take into account all impacts, local and regional, in legislating for the continued orderly growth and development of their communities.

State and County planning employees can continue their function to furnish information and advice, planning studies and services, but the public policy decisions must continue to be made by the publicly elected legislative representatives of the people.

(ix) The recent Annual Report of the State Office of Local Government, another of the Governor's offices plugging for the Regional Government theory, has taken an "advocacy" aggressive position for such regional legislative proposals. The report broadly attacks "many of our smaller units^{of} government" as "not viable". They would exclude from local governments such services as police, local road maintenance and lighting. They recommend the creation of regional units of local government for comprehensive planning. They want to saddle local governments with full time administrators, even where the need does not exist.

This Office seeks to develop and push for legislative programs, even though they are harmful to local governments and their powers and functions. This is the spectacle of State employees using State facilities and money to initiate and lobby for legislative proposals which local governments and their elected officials oppose.

This Office attacks Local Government Home Rule as isolating a "community from the realities of the world outside". It is such self-serving, totally unsupported editorial effrontery which has earned for that Office the title of the Office Against Local Government.

SUMMARY

TWO NEW YORK STATE OFFICES HAVE LAUNCHED UPON A PROGRAM TO ESTABLISH REGIONAL GOVERNMENTS AND TO TAKE AWAY FROM LOCAL GOVERNMENTS THEIR VITAL POWERS AND FUNCTIONS TO LEGISLATE FOR THE CONTINUED ORDERLY GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OF THEIR LOCAL COMMUNITIES AND, IN SO DOING, TO GIVE FULL REGARD TO ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS. THE PUBLICLY ELECTED OFFICIALS AND THE PEOPLE OF THESE LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, INCLUDING VILLAGES AND TOWNS THROUGHOUT THE STATE, STAND FIRMLY OPPOSED TO THIS REGIONAL GOVERNMENT THEORY.

Memorandum on Federal Legislation (i.e. H. R. 2942, and H. R. 6460), to induce the States to adopt a land use policy, etc., involving regulations at State and regional levels and not by local governments.

According to recent information from the Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs, to which the above bills were referred, H. R. 2942 is identical to the bill (S.268) passed June 21, 1973 by the Senate, and H.R. 6460 is a refinement of H.R. 2492. Federal legislative drafting and revising of such Federal-State induced land use policy is now actively in progress. It is imperative that the Federal legislators now become fully informed of established State (and particularly New York State) policy in the entire field of land use development and regulation by local governments such as villages, towns and cities.

The purpose of this brief memo is to summarize such long-established N. Y. State land use policy and jurisdiction in the matter of regulation and control by local governments in the exercise of the police power to provide for the continued orderly growth and development throughout the State of local communities. Such exercise through legislation and regulation by publicly elected municipal legislators of their local home rule powers derived from the State constitution and implementing State statutes. And then this memo seeks to relate such State law, policy and practice to these Federal legislative proposals. And further, this memo seeks to clarify and differentiate certain areas of environmental policy which have been used by legislative tacticians, both Federal and State, to confuse the total picture in the hope of effecting a radical change in Local Government Home Rule powers and jurisdiction over zoning and development of local communities by establishing State and Regional Agencies which, staffed by regional government and planning employee appointees, would take over from the local governments these powers and functions.

First, land use control and environmental planning are two separate and distinct matters. In New York State, local governments have, through their publicly elected legislative bodies, exercised their home rule powers and have, through such legislation provided for the orderly growth and development of their communities. Thus, land use policies have been adopted, updated and revised by local governments to serve the needs of their particular communities. In recent years, these governments have engaged professional planning consultants, have utilized the information and advisory services of other available agencies, public and private, State and regional such as State and County offices of planning services. In this way the local governments have fully utilized the data and opinions of the hired planning experts and have, through their local legislation and regulations, provided for any changes desired by the affected local communities in the guiding policies relating to land use policy.

In the last several years in N.Y. State, the so-called planning experts have repeatedly but unsuccessfully tried to induce the State legislature to establish State and Regional regulatory agencies which would establish land use policy and regulation. Some of these State legislative bills were comprehensive programs, covering the total range of regulation of zoning and community development. When these bills failed to gain any support in the legislature, the sponsors tried to achieve the same result through piece-meal legislation, dividing the defeated comprehensive bill into three or more separate bills dealing with various parts of the comprehensive regulatory scheme. These piece-meal proposals were not acceptable to the State legislators.

The State offices which were the main sponsors of such regional government restructuring of local government have been the State Office for Local Government and the State Office for Planning Services. Also, the State Environmental staff, as reflected in its recent report labelled as a State Environmental Plan, supports this regional government theory of land use regulation under the guise of environmental planning. The regional government theory advocates, as staff employees or consultants to the Wagner Commission (Temporary Commission on the Powers of Local Government), have adopted that theory in their recent report.

Opposition to such regional government theory and regional government land use regulation comes from all the Villages and Towns and probably all the other local governments in the State, where local home rule powers and functions would be taken away and transferred to the State and regional agencies. The N.Y. State Conference of Mayors, whose membership includes well over 400 villages, and the N.Y. State Association of Towns, are strongly and unalterably opposed to such regional government take-over.

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The extent and depth of the State legislators' support for Local Government Home Rule Powers and Functions as to local planning and regulation of land use development is indicated by the fact that all the State legislators from Nassau County share this support.

Furnished herewith is a Position Paper on this issue, currently issued by the Nassau County Village Officials Association, with a membership of 63 Villages having a population of about 450,000 residents. In August of this year, the NCVOA discussed this matter with the representatives of the Westchester County Village Officials Association, and those representatives indicated that their 22 Villages, with a population of about 300,000 residents, fully support the views expressed in that Position Paper.

How does this clear and established policy and law in N.Y. State relate to the Federal legislative proposals mentioned in the opening paragraph of this memo? That relationship is simple: these proposals reflect and incorporate the regional government theory of land use regulation and control, contra to the established law and practices in N.Y. State and the overwhelming views of the people and the legislators of N.Y. State. In other words, the same regional government advocates and planning experts who comprise the main support of State legislative proposals for regional government take-over are collaborating and supporting the Federal proposals to the same end. The technique of the Federal scheme is simple: First, dress up the proposal as an environmental measure, thereby hoping to camouflage or conceal the plan relating to land use policy and regulation. (In fact, the Federal bills have received little or no publicity except as environmental measures.) And second, make it appear that the inducements to the States, by financial hand-outs and similar inducements, are generally in line with State policy for land use planning and control and that such regional approach is the only sound approach for land use planning and regulation. This theory behind the Federal proposals is both contra to the facts and contra to the established State policy.

Specifically, the Federal Bill, Land Use Policy and Planning Assistance Act (S.268), is an 80-page, comprehensive, regulatory scheme which, under the incentive of financial grants, is designed to compel the States to abandon completely their own statutory plans and programs for land use policies and legislation for local governments, described above, and to adopt a restructuring of local governments as to these matters by establishing new governmental agencies, at both state and regional levels, to take over from the local governments their present powers and functions as to these matters.

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Specifically, the Federal Bill, Land Use Policy and Planning Assistance Act (S.268), is an 80-page, comprehensive, regulatory scheme which, under the incentive of financial grants, is designed to compel the States to abandon completely their own statutory plans and programs for land use policies and legislation for local governments, described above, and to adopt a restructuring of local governments as to these matters by establishing new governmental agencies, at both state and regional levels, to take over from the local governments their present powers and functions as to these matters.

The Federal bill proceeds on the basis of findings which are, as far as New York State is concerned, wholly unsupportable and unacceptable. The entire bill is simply a Federal statutory version for a State-regional land use planning function which N.Y. State, through its legislature and at the polls on proposed State constitutional change, has repeatedly and decisively rejected.

The Federal bill lays down as requirements for an eligible State land use program or process that there be established by the State a single land use planning agency, with primary authority and responsibility for the development and administration of a state land use program. This fundamental change in the N.Y. State law with respect to the powers and functions of local governments as to land use planning and development is not to any extent acceptable to the local governments and their residents. It is therefore of no purpose to point out the numerous other substantive provisions of the bill which are equally objectionable. The bill should be completely re-written so as to encourage the States to carry out their own laws and programs for land use planning and community development, with due consideration for environmental and other relevant considerations.





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

A G R E E M E N T

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into the 28th day of December, 1973, by and between VICTOR REINSTEIN, residing at 11 Danforth Street, Cheektowaga, New York, hereinafter referred to as "REINSTEIN" and the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, a municipal corporation with its principal office at Broadway and Union Road in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, hereinafter called the "TOWN".

WHEREAS, REINSTEIN is the owner of certain unimproved lands on Losson Road in the Town of Cheektowaga; and

WHEREAS, REINSTEIN, because of his deep affection for the Town of Cheektowaga and the future needs of the residents of the TOWN, and because of his deep concern that the TOWN have an adequate library system, is willing to make a charitable gift to the TOWN of a two (2) to three (3) acre site of his said lands on Losson Road, Cheektowaga, New York, together with a charitable gift comprised of cash, or at REINSTEIN'S sole option, other assets which shall qualify for a charitable deduction with the United States Internal Revenue Service to the same extent as if a cash payment, in the sum of TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$200,000.00) DOLLARS to be used exclusively for the construction of a library on said Losson Road site provided certain terms and conditions are agreed upon by the TOWN; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board by a duly adopted resolution has indicated a willingness to accept said gift and authorized negotiations for an agreement with REINSTEIN.

FIRST: REINSTEIN agrees to convey as a charitable gift, by sufficient deed, the marketable title in fee simple to the unimproved lands fronting on Losson Road in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, described in Schedule A annexed hereto, to the Town of Cheektowaga, and the TOWN agrees and covenants to construct and erect a library for the public use on said Losson Road site according to the conditions hereinafter set out.

SECOND: Subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, REINSTEIN further agrees to make a charitable gift to the TOWN in the total sum of TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$200,000.00) payable at the rate of TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$20,000.00) or more per year extending over a period not greater than ten (10) years, commencing in December of 1973. The date of payment of said TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$20,000.00) or more in each subsequent year shall be at the option of REINSTEIN. The parties agree that REINSTEIN shall, at his option, have the right to pay a sum greater than TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$20,000.00) in any payment year, if, in his sole discretion, he deems it expedient. Nothing herein contained however shall be construed to make the total monetary obligation of REINSTEIN to be greater than a total charitable gift referred to in this article of TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$200,000.00).

THIRD: That the gift by REINSTEIN of the aforementioned lands and the payment of TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS

(\$200,000.00) is made upon the following express conditions which are agreed upon by the TOWN:

(A) That the TOWN match and add to said gift a like sum of TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$200,000.00) so that, when added to the REINSTEIN gift, the cost of the improvements to said lands in the form of said library building shall be in the minimum amount of FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$400,000.00) DOLLARS. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the TOWN from erecting a library building the cost of which shall exceed the sum of FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$400,000.00), if the said TOWN deems it necessary.

(B) That the TOWN shall designate that the official name of said library be, "THE JULIA BOYER REINSTEIN LIBRARY", as a tribute to the said wife of Dr. Victor Reinstein, for her numerous efforts and generous works in aiding the TOWN towards the establishment of the town library system; and that JULIA BOYER REINSTEIN'S name shall be designated conspicuously on the exterior of said library as long as said library shall be in existence.

(C) That a minimum of at least seventy-five (75%) per cent of the physical structure shall be allocated and used exclusively for library purposes, and that any future physical expansions to the library shall be used exclusively for library or cultural purposes.

FOURTH: The parties agree that upon the execution of this Agreement, and its ratification by the Town Board, the TOWN shall forthwith and with all deliberate speed take the necessary steps for the erection of said library on the lands described in Schedule A hereto attached upon obtaining title as prescribed herein. It is further agreed and understood between the parties, that in the event that the TOWN defaults or fails to erect or complete said library, or fails in commencing construction expeditiously, as called for in this Agreement, or discontinues the use of the official name of said library, as called for in Article THIRD of this Agreement, then REINSTEIN shall be forever relieved of the obligation of all future payments called for under this Agreement subsequent to the time of said default. Nothing herein contained, however, shall be interpreted to mean that gifts by REINSTEIN made prior to any such default shall be returned by the TOWN to REINSTEIN, it being the intention of this Agreement that all such prior gift payments hereunder are final and irrevocable.

FIFTH: This Agreement is contingent upon the TOWN realizing the necessary funds to pay for the construction of said library, from municipal bonds sold by the TOWN, pursuant to law. The TOWN agrees that immediately subsequent to the execution of this Agreement, in good faith, to take the necessary steps, and to initiate and diligently complete bond resolution proceedings for obtaining funds in sufficient amount to construct the library facilities referred to in this Agreement. In the event that the TOWN is unable to acquire the necessary funds through
